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Hunter responders train on advanced rescue missions

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9/11 Remembrance Run, Walk slated

Soldiers and Marne community members are invited to participate in the Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield Fire and Emergency Services 9/11 Memorial Run/Walk at 6:30 a.m. on Sept. 11 to honor those fallen first responders lost 19 years ago in the four coordinated terrorist attacks carried out by al-Qaeda.

The event is open to anyone who has a valid veteran or military identification and has access to Hunter Army Airfield and Fort Stewart military posts.

The route will begin at Newman Gym on Fort Stewart and on Perimeter Road on Hunter Army Airfield.

Runners and walkers will be advised to stay six-feet apart from one another to mitigate the risk of contracting COVID-19.

Participants in the Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield event will walk or run a 2.7-mile course, signifying the

3.5 miles Firefighter Stephen Siller ran on September 11, Bradshaw said.

“Bring your units; bring your flags; bring pictures of those you are walking or running for,” Bradshaw said.

Soldiers has also invited Soldiers to honor the service dogs that lost their life in the tragic event by rucking with 35lbs of dog or cat food to be donated to the Fort Stewart Stray Animal Facility Fort Stewart Pets after the

event, said BOSS Representative Sgt. Michael McElroy.

BOSS advises those interested to look for BOSS shirts or possibly the BOSS Guidon at the event.

The run, walk is meant to honor Stephen Siller, a firefighter who laid down his life to save others on September 11, 2001, and also honors military and first responders who continue to make sacrifices of life and limb for their country.

Siller, assigned to Brooklyn's Squad 1, was determined to carry out his duty, so he strapped 60 pounds of gear to his back and raced on foot through the tunnel to the Twin Towers, where he gave up his life while saving others.



Women's Equality Day



Garrison CSM advises women on shining in military environment

Command Sgt. Maj. Rebecca Myers, garrison's top noncommissioned officer, spoke about her 30 years of service at a Women's Equality Day Observance held Aug. 26 on Fort Stewart.

Congress passed the 19th amendment to prohibit the U.S. government and states from denying the right to vote based on gender in 1920. Since then, women have continued to gain opportunities to serve in military roles that had not been open to them in the past. Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield garrison's current senior enlisted advisor is the first woman to serve the role.

"What women's equality means to me is not necessarily about opening up opportunities for women, but it is about the day we [women] can no longer say 'she is the first woman to...'" Myers said.

Myers joined the Army on a two-year contract as a military police Soldier so she could attend college afterward. She said she really enjoyed her time and continued re-enlisting for two-year contracts. One day, she had to choose to sign an indefinite contract to continue service.

"I serve to make others better," Myers said. "Whether that's through developing people or understanding what oth-

ers are going through, I think it's really helped me to be successful and garner the trust of those I lead."

Col. Bryan Logan, the Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield garrison commander, has worked alongside Myers for the past year. He said Myers is a leader and a mentor that others try to emulate on a daily basis.

"She's a mentor for all Soldiers," Logan said. "She has enforced the standard and been helping the backbone of the Army for several years. She's trained and molded Soldiers joining the Army when she was a drill sergeant. She got to where she is today because of her hard work, not because of her gender."

Logan added that because Myers is a military police sergeant major, she has the formal education and experience to deal with any mishaps that may come up. She's a tremendous asset to have when leading Soldiers, he said.

Myers plans to retire by the end of 2020, after 30 years of commitment to the Army.

"If I had to give women advice when coming into the Army, it's be yourself," Myers said. "When you are in an environment where you might be the minority, it can be very easy to blend into the group and change your personality to something that might not be comfortable for you. Be consistent, be you, and you will shine," Myers said.

3RD COMBAT AVIATION BRIGADE CONTINUES PORT OPERATIONS

The 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division, continued port operations for the redeployment of equipment at Hunter Army Airfield, Aug. 28, after returning from a nine-month deployment to Europe in support of Operation Atlantic Resolve.

Operation Atlantic Resolve provides units the ability to build readiness, increase interoperability and enhance the bond between allied and partnered militaries through multinational training events.

“We are receiving all of the containers from the Port of Savannah and Port of Charleston,” said 1st Lt. Michael Hawkins, the executive officer of 603rd Aviation Support Battalion, 3CAB. “We are categorizing them by battalion and company and then delivering them.”

The 3CAB is made up of four separate battalions. Each battalion has their own equipment unique to its function in the brigade.

The aviation brigade has been working alongside the 3rd Infantry Division Sustainment Brigade, 3rd ID, to transport equipment from the Port of Savannah in Georgia and the Port of Charleston in South Carolina to Hunter Army Airfield.

“We are trying to get the containers to their units as quickly as possible so we can continue training,” Hawkins said.

The brigades working together show the division’s ability to quickly reset and be ready for any mission, Hawkins said. The port operations are also helping Soldiers certify their force-projection skills in a real-world setting.

“This operation is helping me develop as a leader, because I have to direct Soldiers,” said Spc. Jarissa Reyes, a Soldier assigned the 603rd ASB.

Reyes directed the forklift drivers during the sorting and loading of container boxes on trucks at Hunter Army Airfield.

It’s the Soldiers participating in port operations that are the key pieces to the success of the mission, Hawkins said.

\$7M Army on-post lodging renovation complete

According to IHG Army Hotels and Lendlease, approximately \$7.3 million has been invested into this facil-

Providers keep 3CAB Aviators flying high

Soldiers from the 135th Quartermaster Company, Special Troops Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division Sustainment Brigade, supported Company E, 4th Battalion, 3rd Aviation Regiment (Assault Helicopter Battalion), 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade as the 3CAB returned from its recent overseas mission in support of U.S. Army Europe.

The mission, which took place at the Port of Savannah, Aug. 17-21, required the 135th to supply more than 4,000 gallons of fuel as the AHB's helicopters were unloaded at the port and prepared to return to Hunter Army Airfield.

The 135th QM Co. provided a M969 5k tanker as a nurse truck which resupplied the 3CAB's M978 Heavy Expanded Mobility Tactical Trucks at the port during the refueling operations. This allowed Soldiers from Co. E to speed up operations fueling aircraft as they left the port.

"The mission was to refuel aircraft coming from overseas" said Sgt. Michael Davis the noncommissioned officer-in-charge of port operations for the 135th QM Co. "The experience

was enlightening, because we are a ground unit and never really did aviation operations."

The 135th QM Co. is a bulk petroleum company that supplies large quantities of fuel to the maneuver forces of the division. It is the only asset within the division capable of accomplishing resupply of bulk petroleum, oil and lubricants.

"We have the one thing that helps keep the Army rolling and flying high," said Warrant Officer Nathan Huston, a petroleum systems technician with 135th QM Co. "We're confident in all of our missions, because we have the personnel and capabilities to complete the mission."

Soldiers from the 135th QM Co. completed training on the M978 HEMTT prior to the mission to get familiarization before heading to the port. The training and classes provided the Soldiers with the knowledge of not only the equipment that they will be using, but also the equipment that they will be issuing to units.

"The mission went very well and some of our Soldiers got to do some hands-on training with the aviation side of fuel," Davis said. "We're the ones that help keep the Army flying high."

NCO evaluation changes create flexibility, boost readiness

WASHINGTON — The Army has begun to shift its rank advancement structure for noncommissioned officers by moving from a two-year promotion projection process to a month-to-month format, as well as allowing top performing Soldiers to be eligible for promotion six months earlier.

The overhaul to evaluating NCOs is intended to boost Army readiness and improve the quality of its NCO corps, said Sgt. Maj. Mark Clark, Army G-1 directorate of military personnel management sergeant major. Soldiers will soon feel the impact of those changes as the Army transitions to a greater focus on merit to promote its enlisted leaders rather than on time in service.

As part of the changes, the Army is widening the scope of its order of merit list to select NCOs for promotion. The list will be used as a guide to select Soldiers for promotion to sergeant first class through sergeant major. Sergeants and staff sergeants will continue to earn promotions based on points and cutoff scores.

Instead of a centralized promotion selection board, the service will move to a performance-based annual evaluation for Soldiers eligible for promotion to sergeant first class and above. The OML now contains

a “fully qualified” list to identify Soldiers who have earned immediate eligibility for promotion. The OML also determines which Soldiers earn selections to go to training associated with rank advancement.

The changes began in fiscal year 2019 with the command sergeant major and sergeant major board in August 2019 and continued with the fiscal 2020 master sergeant board in May. The fiscal 2020 CSM and SGM board is currently underway.

The Army’s next policy change will be with the fiscal 2021 sergeant first class board, which will convene on Sept. 20. That board will inform decisions that include selection for training to attend the Master Leaders Course, assignment selections and NCOs with substandard performance.

“The most important [change] was to give us flexibility to be able to respond to emerging requirements,” Clark said in an interview Thursday.

The OML then serves as the promotion evaluation board’s summary of the Soldier’s achievements, including performance reports in military schools, physical fitness, military and civilian education, and the variety of duty and leadership roles held.

“[The OML] is based on the Soldier’s performance over the lifecycle of their career,” Clark said. “So it’s a total Soldier evaluation of their potential to perform at the next level.”

Beginning in May, Army will announce the names

of Soldiers selected for promotion to the rank of sergeant through sergeant major by the 15th of the month prior to the promotion month.

Promotion eligibility

Under the new changes, Soldiers will be selected from the OML to take required training in an effort to qualify them for promotion.

The Army made the change to create an environment where NCOs train to qualify ahead of their scheduled promotions, Clark said. Under the former 24-month projections, Soldiers were not considered for training until after they were selected for promotion and often could not get fully trained because of scheduling conflicts, deployments or medical profiles.

“It created a false sense of readiness that we had a population that was ready to be promoted, but we could not promote them unless they were school trained,” he said. “So we needed to put the emphasis on getting school trained earlier to identify our [promotable] population.”

The creation of new units, such as security force assistance brigades in 2016, accelerated the need to bring qualified NCOs to new assignments quickly, he added. Army leaders learned that the 24-month projection of force structure and promotion requirements proved too slow to keep pace with the service’s changing needs.

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Joint rescue exercise held at 117th Air Control Squadron

HUNTER ARMY AIRFIELD, Ga. -- Members of Hunter Army Airfield Fire and Emergency Services and the Georgia Air National Guard 117th Air Control Squadron, based at Hunter, held a joint rescue exercise Aug. 26 on Hunter Army Airfield to test and utilize their equipment in a real world scenario.

This type of rescue is a rare occurrence, said Stephen Long, Hunter Army Airfield Fire Emergency Services firefighter. He explained that FES will periodically receive new equipment as techniques and procedures evolve within the industry.

"This rescue specifically is a low frequency, high risk situation. It is something that doesn't happen very often. It might happen once in a career," Long said. "So we train for it. We are basically getting everyone familiar with the equipment and giving the guys an opportunity to perform a rescue without putting people in danger."

After receiving a mock call from 117th Air Control Squadron, FES moved to their location and began preparing to extract a training doll with a simulated broken ankle from the approximate 100-foot radio tower.

“As part of our maintenance we have to do periodic inspections and we have to go up that tower,” said Master Sgt. Ryan Work, 117th Air Squadron Radio Frequency transmissions craftsman. “If we cannot self-rescue in the event of an injury, we can call FES and know they have a plan in place as a secondary rescue option.”

This advanced rescue required a two-line, skate block system - one as the main line and another as a back-up line in case of failure. Two rescuers went up to evaluate the person’s injury and rig the system from the high point. The remaining fire rescue personnel, rigged the lines at the low point and managed the lines and system to bring the rescued person to the ground.

“The rescue can get complicated with the amount of ropes and equipment being used along with several factors involved such as the tower, guidelines, communication, and the height of rescue,” Long said.

Long led the rescue from the ground and guided the team throughout. Long has been conducting and training for advanced rescues the majority of his career and has worked with the Savannah Fire technical rescue team, Parris Island urban search and rescue and Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield Fire Emergency Services.

Work, who scaled the tower in tandem with FES, helped initiate the training after a recent site visit.

“These guys came out a month or two ago and I noticed they were using some climbing gear,” Work said. “As the tower rescue person for the unit here, I knew I wanted to get them involved. If you don’t use it, you lose it. To keep you familiarity with all the gear and how to rescue a person, we decided to get together for some training.”

The two groups have already planned their next joint training exercise, which will take place on their radar tower. This will add a layer of complexity as there are two separate levels of the tower that have to be traversed.

GDOT restricts lane closures for Labor Day weekend

ATLANTA, Ga. – To ease traffic congestion statewide during the Labor Day holiday weekend, the Georgia Department of Transportation is suspending interstate highway construction-related lane closures from noon Sept. 4 through 5 a.m. Sept. 8. Lane closures will also be limited on major state routes that directly serve key tourist and recreation centers.


Georgia DOT reminds drivers that crews may still work in proximity to highways to address safety and maintenance concerns that may require some long-term lane closures. In addition, incident or emergency related lane closures could become necessary at any time on any route.

“In an effort to keep the number of traffic crashes, injuries and fatalities as low as possible, I urge drivers to slow down, drive alert and eliminate distractions,” said Georgia DOT State Construction Engineer John Hancock. “Buckle up, put down the cell phone and do not drive impaired. As you gather this weekend with Family and friends, make safety a top priority.”

In the event of a crash or breakdown, Georgia DOT advises motorists to never get out of the car on a freeway, unless your life is in imminent danger. If possible, pull off the road, turn on your hazard lights and stay seat-belted in the vehicle with the doors locked. For HERO assistance in metro Atlanta or CHAMP service on highways in other regions of the state call 511 – a free phone service that provides highway assistance and real-time information about Georgia’s interstates and state routes, including traffic conditions, incidents, lane closures, and delays due to inclement weather. Callers can transfer to operators to request assistance or report incidents 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Information is available at 511ga.org.

As a reminder, the public is urged to use continued caution when visiting public spaces, practice social distancing and follow the public health guidelines set forth by state and local agencies, as well as act courteously to fellow travelers.



Cotton Balers remain lethal amid COVID-19 conditions

Soldiers with Company C, 2nd Battalion, 7th Infantry Regiment, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, held simulated training at the Close Combat Tactical Trainer Aug. 24-28 on Fort Stewart.

Platoon live-fire events have been restricted over the last few months, due to Covid-19 risk factors. Capt. Stephen Schutte, Co. C commander, looked into using the CCTT as an effective way to keep Soldiers trained and qualified.

“While we haven’t been able to complete the qualifying live fire in person, we worked closely with the


CCTT administrators to program an event that accurately simulates what we would do in real life,” Schutte said. “It was really important for the company to get the repetitions in, and I am extremely confident in my Soldiers’ ability to translate their simulated training into a real world event. While we determined the CCTT training cannot officially qualify them, the training was still a huge success and has set us up for when we can access our physical systems safely.”

As the coronavirus continues to impact traditional training events, the modification of the CCTT program to reconstruct a qualifying event for a tank company in a simulated environment shows that adaptability can lead to success on and off the battlefield, said 2nd Lt. Gino Nicosia, a Company C platoon leader. Nicosia

said this training marked a great opportunity to get more experience going through dry fire runs.

“While we understand that there are some aspects of training that are different when working on a virtual system, the inside controls are extremely accurate, so it was a great chance for crews to commit their tasks to muscle memory,” Nicosia said. “I was working with a new platoon so this was a great opportunity to run through the commands that I will be giving, which isn’t something we get a lot of experience at Basic Officers Leaders Course at Fort Benning.”

The Soldiers of Co. C look forward to excelling at follow-on training, and plans to continue to use non-traditional training to continue to ensure readiness across the battalion.
