# Virtual Retiree Appreciation Day delivers vital information

More than 100 retirees attended the March 6 virtual Fort Stewart Retiree Appreciation to get updates on Soldier for Life services.

The event—organized by Fort Stewart’s Directorate of Human Resources-- was at the University of Central Florida in Orlando in past years, but the COVID-19 pandemic redirected it to a virtual setting. The team chose to use Microsoft Teams for the RAD.

“This is the first year we delivered our Retiree Appreciation Day in a virtual environment,” said David Southerland, Military Personnel Division chief. “While we’ve made great strides in combatting COVID,

We’re not there yet and needed to develop a delivery method that kept our presenters, retired Soldiers and Families safe. Several installations have used Facebook for their RADs but we believe we’re the first to use MS Teams which allowed us to bring different speakers from across the coun-

try.”

The agenda included a welcome from tThe 3rd ID senior enlisted advisor, Command Sgt. Maj. Quentin Fenderson, and Garrison Commander Col. Bryan Logan.

“On behalf of all of us from 3rd ID, Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield we want to say thank you for all you’ve done to help us get through this last year,” Aguto said. “We’re here to help you. Our services are here for you and I want to ensure that you all know that.”

The 3rd ID senior enlisted advisor Command Sgt. Maj. Quentin Fenderson, and garrison commander Col. Bryan Logan also attended the event.

“Our military is better because of the service and sacrifices that you and your Family have put in.” Logan said. “Thank you for all you have done to make my time better in the Military and also of those young Soldiers who are coming up within the ranks. You have paved the path for us to follow and we truly appreciate it.”

The program moved on to include an introduction

of the RAD council from South Carolina, Georgia, and Florida; and presentations on COVID-19, Soldier for Life retirement services, TRICARE, hurricane preparedness, and the Military Officers Association of America.

Retired Sgt. Maj. of the Army Dan Dailey spoke on behalf of the Association of the United States Army.

“I want to thank Sgt. Maj. Dan Dailey, Sergeant Major of the Army, for being here today,” Aguto said. “What a great honor to have him here to speak to all of us.”

The planning efforts to provide the virtual event were a testament to practice makes perfect, said Southerland.

“(The RAD) went extremely well,” he said. “From beginning to end, the production was nearly flawless. Our guest speakers provided first-class presentations on issues of key interests to our retired Soldiers and their Families.”

# Women's History Month: Women's service is vital to our success

Women have served in the Army and blazed a trail through history since the Revolutionary War. Their courage and sacrifice, right alongside their male counterparts, has been a testament to the strength and power they have brought to the Army for generations. March is Women's History Month and this year the 3rd Infantry Division celebrates the professionalism and the contributions women continue to make to our Armed Forces.

While women and men can be fundamentally different, when you put both of them into military uniforms there are common threads that knit them together: Leadership, Duty, Respect, Selfless Service, Honesty, Integrity, and Personal Courage. Women have played a vital role in our Army since its inception. Today, women are Soldiers, Army civilians, veterans and family members who are critical members of the Army team.

Despite previous misconceptions that women were not well-matched for combat arms occupations, women now have more opportunities in the Army than ever before. In April 2016, the Army opened up all traditional combat-arms occupations to women across the force. Approximately 18% of the total Army is female with more than 1,400 women trained and performing duties in infantry, armor or field artillery enlisted and officer positions.

However, history has shown this has not always been the case. While men were drafted to fight in major conflicts, women volunteered to put their nation's needs above their own, serving in the Army's Nurse Corps, the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps and the Women's Army Corps. It wasn't until June 12, 1948, that women were allowed to have a permanent presence in the Armed Forces. Women had to prove through hard work and dedication that all contributions to our nation – regardless of gender – were equal. It was the determination of the women of the past that paved the way for today's female Soldiers. It was the achievements of women in the past that showed how the inclusion of female Soldiers makes a stronger and more capable fighting force.

There are still strides to make to be sure. Even today, a single photo tweet of a new Armor officer proudly donning her Stetson

for the first time, embracing the proud tradition she is stepping into and carrying forward, can still bring about a slew of sexist comments and remarks. We still have room to grow, people to teach, and barriers to break, but one thing is certain: Women will always have a place in our military.

Army leaders have recognized the need for change and hope to close the gap with Project Inclusion, which aims to provide a workplace where women feel safe and valued. Last year, Project Inclusion launched "Your Voice Matters," a series of listening sessions formatted to allow Soldiers to anonymously discuss issues with Army headquarters representatives. Topics for these sessions included physical fitness biases and gender inequality concerns, as well as equality for job promotion and career development. Army senior leaders take the feedback from these sessions to determine if there needs to be new policies implemented, revised, or reviewed due to Soldiers' concerns.

The most recent efforts by the Project Inclusion team were to update antiquated grooming standards, which incorporated common sense hair and nail changes that were asked for by current female service members, recognizing all Soldiers for their individuality.

The 3rd ID is proud of the service and accomplishments of female service members across the spectrum of occupations and across the Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield joint force. Women not only serve in traditional combat arms positions, but also as pilots, human resources specialists and medical care professionals. Additionally, female "Dogface Soldiers" function successfully in leadership positions at all echelons of units and formations. Former and current female Soldiers of the 3rd ID serve with distinction and act as cornerstones within their units and surrounding communities. Women have made an incredible mark on the storied history of the 3rd ID and their successes enhance the fighting force by incorporating the quality and skills they uniquely bring to Army units.

They earned the tab. They carried the weight and thanks to the strong examples before them, they continue to exemplify that gender is not an indicator of what can make a good Soldier or leader. Women make our military stronger.



**U.S. Army Sgt. Maj. Tiny A. Jones**, a career counselor assigned to the 3rd Infantry Division at Fort Stewart, is a native of Henderson, North Carolina. She entered the Army in 1994 as a petroleum supply specialist. Jones holds a general studies associate's degree from Central Texas College, a bachelor's of science degree in business from Baker College, and a master's of education leader and administration from Trident University International. "I joined the Army because I wanted to establish a living for my 13-month-old son and I. It's challenging being a female in the military, but I haven't allowed the obstacles to stop me. Overcoming adversity keeps my spirits strong. Practicing my faith reminds me that I'm never alone in the fight because I always have God."

Serrina Kilburn**, a chemical, biological, radiological, and nuclear specialist assigned to the 554th Engineer Construction Company, 92nd Engineer Battalion, on Fort Stewart, was raised in Tampa, Florida. "I joined the Army to give myself purpose. It feels really good to show that women are competent in a male-dominated career field."

**U.S. Army 1st Lt. Jennifer Sullivan**, a military police officer assigned to the 293rd Military Police Company, 385th Military Police Battalion, on Fort Stewart, was raised in Seoul, Korea. She has a bachelor's degree in international history. "I joined the Army because with my father serving for 30 years, I got to see up close the benefits and opportunities the military provided. I think females provide a unique and different perspective to problem-solving. There are still obstacles we have to overcome as a society, but we've come a long way. Just because I'm a female doesn't mean I don't like to get my hands dirty and fix things."

# Trailblazing women honored for storied Army careers

WASHINGTON — As a senior in college, Mari K. Eder once filed a Freedom of Information Act request to view her academic files.

Once it was approved, she sat in a conference room as she combed through the files, which showed her grades, her dean's list awards, and then a letter from her high school guidance counselor.

The letter shocked Eder, who would later go on to a successful Army career. She would become the first to lead the Army Reserve's Joint and Special Troops Support Command, and the first full-time deputy chief of the Army Reserve and the first full-time deputy chief of Army Public Affairs.

"It said, 'I do not recommend Mari K. to attend any college. She is not intelligent enough to complete it.' And I sat there stunned, because I realized that my whole life had almost ended before it even began," said Eder, now a retired major general.

Later, her college wrote a letter to the guidance counselor, who Eder was also able to confront.

"But that lesson stayed with me -- 1,000 people can say 'no' to you, but all it takes is one who says 'yes.' And Edinboro University of Pennsylvania said 'yes' to me," she said.

Eder and five other pioneering female Army leaders, in addition to the 4,000 women of the Office of Strategic Services, were inducted into the Army Women's Foundation's hall of fame during a virtual ceremony Monday. Members of the OSS served in World War II as spies, saboteurs, analysts and experts in communications, among other skill sets.

After college, the Army provided Eder with her second break to succeed in life, she said.

"What the Army has given me, I believe, is more than I have given back," she said. "I have had tremendous opportunities to travel, to command and to give that same opportunity to others.

"The only thing that I have ever

wanted to do was to leave a legacy of people who are able to go on, who have been given an opportunity to excel, to succeed and to make a difference in the lives of everyone they meet."

Marcia M. Anderson, the Army's first Black female Reserve officer to obtain the rank of major general, also spent her career trying to help others achieve their potential.

"It's not about who you are. It's about what you can do for the people and the institution you serve," said Anderson, who is now retired. "And that's all I ever tried to do in my entire career, was to honor my oath, to take care of my Soldiers, and to make sure that I was mission focused.

"I hope my example and the examples of previous recipients will continue to encourage, motivate and empower our young women to continue to strive to be the best they can be."

Former Maj. Gen. Linda L. Singh thanked the Army recruiter who took the time to speak with her in 1981, even though she was a high school dropout at the time.

His persistence to recruit her helped "a young girl who seemed to be lost, homeless and needing someone to guide her," said Singh, who retired in 2019 after being the Maryland Guard's first African-American and first woman adjutant general.

"He gave me the opportunity to serve 38 years in the Army National Guard and the Army Reserve," she added. "How does that happen when you come in as a private E-1 and you retire as a major general, leading the organization that took you off the streets?"

She said much of her strength to push through adversity came from her grandmother, who raised her for the first nine years of her life.

"She just did an amazing job. And she never ever told me that being a girl you couldn't do anything. She always said to me being a girl you can do anything that you want -- just don't take your shirt off like the boys," Singh said, laughing. "So that gave me a really good start."

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# Stewart-Hunter public affairs staff recognized for excellence

The Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield Public Affairs Office received five awards for expertise in journalism, photography, graphic design and social media prowess in the 2020 U.S. Army Installation Management Command Communications Competition.

The public affairs staff competed against more than 100 entries in print, web, and social media categories from Army installations around the world.

One of the entries also placed first in Army Materiel Command's David G. Harris Public Affairs Competition and will now move on to compete at the Army-level in the Maj. Gen. Keith L. Ware Communications Competition.

Kevin Larson won the Kathy Canham-Ross Award of Distinction in Community Relations at both the IMCOM- and AMC-level competitions for his efforts leading a diverse team in a virtual live stream Independence Day celebration.

"Our senior commander and garrison commander charged the Stewart-Hunter public affairs team with finding ways to include our community outside the gates in an Independence Day celebration that would allow everyone to see the fireworks while quarantined or socially distant from friends, neighbors and families," said Chris Fletcher, the Fort Stewart public affairs director. "Typically we have 30-50,000 people participate in our 4th of July celebrations."

Larson led a collaborative effort

between the Stewart-Hunter public affairs shop and the Directorate of Family, Morale, Welfare and Recreation to host the virtual live stream featuring music, competitions and fireworks at both Hunter Army Airfield and Fort Stewart. The events were highlighted by messages from local elected officials, business leaders and an institution of higher learning. The event had more than 12,000 views and over 200 comments.

Larson also placed first in the broadcast long-form production category for another collaborative effort with Fort Stewart Army Community Service for a virtual live stream of the installation's 2020 Virtual Volunteer of the Year ceremony.

The Frontline newspaper, edited by Molly Cooke, won first place in the printed publication category at the IMCOM competition. Cooke also snagged first place for her design of the 2020 Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield brochure in the graphic arts layout and design category.

Daniel Malta, the Hunter Army Airfield public affairs chief, earned first place at the IMCOM competition in the broadcast short-form production category for a video he shot highlighting COVID-19 screening sites opening at Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield.

"There are 75 garrisons who compete in this competition and for us to receive this recognition validates the hard work we have put in during a challenging year," Fletcher said.

The annual awards program recognizes military and civilian employees for journalistic excellence and furthering the objectives of the Department of the Army public affairs program.







# Training offers 'game changing' results for civilian employees

Department of the Army Civilians rely on training as an important aspect of professional growth. From annual Department of Defense requirements to various schools and courses offered by Installation Management Command, choosing the right training to best suit professional goals is of the utmost importance.

In addition to practical knowledge courses offered to help civil service employees excel, IMCOM offers a series of Game Changer training opportunities set to build upon the crucial interpersonal skills needed to succeed within the workplace.

Aligned with a popular system of adult learning principles, each Game Changer workshop creates a learning environment where individual growth is encouraged through practical exercise, peer feedback, self-analysis, reflection and collaboration.

First introduced to Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield in 2018 as a series of IMCOM-lead in person supervisor-leader courses, co-creators and facilitators Larry Doxtater and Darrick Hinson have now transitioned their courses to a virtual setting due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Once developed with senior civilian leadership in mind, the courses have now transitioned into shorter half day virtual trainings that are offered to any Department of the Army civilian employee who would like to attend.

Since the 2017 pilot, nearly 600 students across U.S. Army Garrisons have attended Game Changer training programs either in person or virtually.

"Our classes are focused on interaction with students," Doxtater said. "We want to hear from our students and learn from their knowledge. From our perspective we see it as a way to help with self-awareness which is the true intent of our content."

Currently, the Game Changers have hosted three virtual classes on Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield.

"When we were initially contacted by Game Changers we chose three topics that we felt would be most beneficial to our community," said Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield Workforce Development specialist, Robin Ellert. "Those classes included emotional intelligence, the five levels of leadership and attitude and trust."

"It's much easier for an employee to attend a four-hour virtual session than it is for them to break away for an entire week to go TDY to attend an in-person class," Ellert said. "Our plan is to work with IMCOM to bring the remainder of the virtual Game Changer trainings to the installation within the coming months so more members of our civilian workforce can benefit from the content."

According to Ellert, additional classes will be offered on Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield based on the demand of the civilian community with a plan to execute the remainder of the offered courses virtually within the year.

Upon completion of each program, students receive a certificate of completion and are provided with an action plan workbook to assist with future growth within the area of study.

"We are passionate about what we do," said Hinson. "We love seeing the lightbulb go off during class and to hear from previous students who continue to find success. We love to hear how the content has changed and benefited them. It lets us know that we aren't just checking a box by hosting these trainings. The students are receiving the content, using it and making a difference. That's the main goal that we're trying to meet."

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# Vaccines now available to all TRICARE beneficiaries

Winn Army Community Hospital will hold a drive-through COVID-19 vaccination clinic on Fort Stewart, 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., Friday, March 12, or until the day's vaccine supply lasts. This drive-thru is open to all TRICARE beneficiaries within Winn ACH's catchment area (40 mile radius) who are 18 years-old and above.

Col Julie Freeman, U.S. Army Medical Department Activity-Fort Stewart commander said in a Winn Army Community Hospital Town Hall, March 8, the vaccine helps build immunity for our community and opens opportunities for all of us to socially connect safely. She said the coronavirus vaccines have proven to be effective against the virus and reduces risk for long-term adverse symptoms.

Please enter the drive-through clinic at the corner of East Ninth Street and Niles Avenue. Participants may download and complete the screening sheet, DHA Form 207, from the Winn ACH website, [winn.tricare.mil/Health-Services/COVID-19](http://winn.tricare.mil/Health-Services/COVID-19).

Identification required. No appointment is necessary.

Winn ACH offers the Moderna vaccine, which requires two doses spaced 28-45 days apart for full efficiency. The drive-through will be held for individuals needing the first dose. Do not get the vaccine if you will not be able to get the Moderna vaccine follow-up dose 28-45 days later.

Patients must remain on site for 15 minutes as a precaution to observe any significant reaction. Please remain in your vehicle while on-site.

Following the drive-through event, vaccination services will revert to an appointment-only basis.

Appointments will be available depending on the vaccine supply. Patients can make appointments at TRICARE Online, [tricareonline.com](http://tricareonline.com), as the primary appointing service. Beneficiaries may also call the Winn Army Community Hospital COVID-19 Vaccine Appointment Line at (912) 435-6633, option 3, 7 a.m. - 4 p.m., Monday-Friday.

Hunter Army Air Field will host a drive-through site on 16 March, by appointment only.

## Lent, a season of reflection

In preparation for the Easter celebration, many Christians across the world have entered into a time of fasting, better known as Lent. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, where Christians confess their sins and profess their devotion to God, believers enter into a season of reflection called Lent. Lent is traditionally lasts 40 days in which Christians replicate Jesus Christ's sacrifice and His withdrawal into the desert for 40 days.

Early on in the ministry of Jesus, He is led into the wilderness too fast for 40 days and 40 nights. 


