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State Superintendent presents school with award

The State of Georgia Superintendent of Schools, Richard Woods, visited Liberty County's Waldo Pafford Elementary School March 22 to present it the Military Flagship Award.

"This is one of the highlights of my career as the state school superintendent to give out the flagship award," Woods said. "This is not something that is easy to come by. It takes a lot of work. To receive this you really have to work at it. You have to show your supporting our military families as they come into your communities and transition."

The Military Flagship School Award recognizes schools going above and beyond to provide a supportive environment for military students and their families. Military Flagship Schools provide specific outreach to military families and recognize and accommodate their unique needs.

Woods said he is familiar with the life of a military family member. His father served in the U.S. Navy 20 years.

"I grew up as a military brat," he said. "I know what it's like to be one of these kids that comes into your school. It was not unusual that for myself growing up that probably every year

and a half, two years, I was at another post."

Waldo Pafford Elementary School principal Valarie Lawson said serving the families of Liberty County is effortless. Embracing military families and making them feel love is the mission.

"It is our duty and dedication to provide to each and every family member in our community but especially to our military families who have to be so transient," Lawson said.

Liberty County School System Superintendent Dr. Franklin Perry praised the connect between the community and the installation as the force behind the recognition.

"I want to thank Col. Logan and Fort Stewart for the relationship that we have," Perry said. "This could not be possible if we did not have the mil-

itary."

Fort Stewart Garrison Commander Col. Bryan Logan echoed the sentiments expressed by the school system leaders and added it is that sentiment that makes military families feel at home.

"The love and support you show our family members, and our veterans and retirees, that's why they stay here in Liberty County," Logan said.

This was Woods' second time coming to Liberty County to present the Military Flagship Award. Snelson-Golden Middle School was the first in November 2018. He hopes the trend continues.

"It'd be great to say Liberty County is the first Military Flagship district," Woods said.

Family Child Care campus opens on Hunter Army Airfield

The installation celebrated the opening of the first Family Child Care campus on post in over seven years with a ribbon cutting ceremony, March 16.

The Family Child Care program is an extension of the installation Child Development Centers, which allows families to offer quality, certified childcare from their homes.

“The Family Child Care program is an extension of the Child Development Centers. So the services, training, inspections and integrity of the program are the same,” said LaRyta Patterson, Family Child Care director. “We also have constant monitoring and supervision of the providers.”

In order to get your home certified and prepared to run a FCC, there are several steps. Each applicant must go through family interviews, background checks for everyone over 12, extensive training and several certifications for health, safe-

ty and nutrition. Once meeting the requirements, the Parent Central Services office will begin enrolling children.

This capability not only offers military spouses an opportunity to generate an income, but improves the military community’s access to childcare.

“Providing quality, certified, qualified child care is a massively important capability that every Army post offers to their community,” said Lt. Col. Stephan Bolton, Hunter Army Airfield garrison commander.

According to Bolton, the COVID-19 pandemic has affected the capacity of childcare centers. Therefore, the FCC program can help alleviate any waitlists at the CDC. Additionally, these services offer a more convenient option for families within the community.

“What they are doing here is helping to create a sense of community by connecting families by delivering a service right here in the heart of the neighborhood,” Bolton said.

Kyrala Kimmons, opening the new FCC campus

on Hunter Army Airfield, stated she had two main reasons for deciding to become a provider. She missed being in the workforce and wanted to be around for her children. This provided her the opportunity to accomplish both.

“You miss the excitement of doing something for yourself but you also don’t want to leave your kids or feel like you’re missing out on things and I wanted something where I could do both, contribute to my family and be there for my children,” Kimmons said.

After the ribbon cutting, Kimmons gave advice to families thinking about opening a FCC.

“If you do choose to become an FCC provider, I want you to know that it is demanding and you have to love these kids,” Kimmons said. “You are taking someone else’s most prized possessions into your home and you have to care for them as if they were your own children.”

Providers hold historic conversion ceremony

The 3rd Infantry Division Sustainment Brigade reorganized as the 3rd Division Sustainment Brigade, during a conversion ceremony at Marne Gardens, March 18 on Fort Stewart.

The change occurred as part of the Army's Structure Memorandum 2022-2026 which reorganizes the brigade under the modular force concept. As part of that concept, the Army divested divisions of assigned and organic functional battalions. The implementation of the DSB will assign a sustainment brigade to support each division and a division sustainment battalion to each DSB with organic functional companies to meet division requirements for large-scale combat operations.

"As an organization, we grow, we learn and we get better every day," said Col. Steve Erickson, the commander of the 3rd DSB, "As missions and priorities change, we as an Army will continue to adapt."

The conversion will give the Division Special Troops Battalion increased material management functions, finance support, signal support and provide division a field feeling company. It will also modify the 87th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion into the Division Sustainment Support Battalion with an increase in petroleum distribution, additional maintenance assets for the division's armored vehicles and increased heavy transportation capabilities.

"This team is all about providing the Division options, increasing its mobility, ensuring distribution of supplies and fuel on the battlefield and establishing forward maintenance collection points," said Erickson. "With this conversion and growth, the DSB will enable and further the division's capability to close with and destroy our enemy and fight our Nation's wars."

The 3rd DSB has a long history of support for 3rd ID and has adapted its structure many times to meet the division's and the Army's needs since its formation as the Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 3rd ID Trains in 1957.

"This brigade has been part of this division since the first day our colors were uncased," said Erickson. "The Provider Brigade has always been and always will be in direct support of the Marne Division and today it feels a little better when we say we are the heart of the rock."

March 29 is National Vietnam War Veteran Day, and the Fort Stewart Exchange and Commissary is hosting a no contact pinning ceremony to honor Vietnam Veterans' service, valor and sacrifice.

The ceremony will take place from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. on March 29 at the Fort Stewart mall, outside the main Exchange. Veterans who served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces at any time from Nov. 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975, regardless of location, can receive a Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin at the ceremony. This lapel pin, which has become a lasting memento of the Nation's thanks, is provided in partnership with The United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration.

"These heroes made selfless sacrifices for our Nation," said Fort Stewart Exchange General Manager Hollie Morales, "Many Vietnam Veterans never received the gratitude and respect they deserve. It's an honor to host this cere-

mony and share our heartfelt thanks."

Protecting the military community remains the Exchange's No. 1 priority, and the PX is taking all necessary precautions to safely honor Vietnam Veterans in this no contacts pinning ceremony. Following recommended health guidelines, face coverings and safe social distancing will be required. Fort Stewart Exchange associates continue to maintain enhanced cleaning procedures and customer touchpoints are sanitized multiple times daily.

The Exchange has been a Commemorative Partner with the Vietnam War Commemoration since 2013, planning and conducting events and activities recognizing the service, valor and sacrifice of Vietnam Veterans and their families.



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

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CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Gaining wisdom through decision

"But if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all generously and without reproach, and it will be given to him. 6 But he must ask in faith without any doubting, for the one who doubts is like the surf of the sea, driven and tossed by the wind. 7 For that man ought not to expect that he will receive anything from the Lord, 8 being a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways." (James 1:5-8)

When faced with difficult choices, most people start with the question, "Is this right or wrong?" In a narrow sense, this question addresses the moral aspect of decision making. Further down the decision making matrix is the question, "Is this decision legal or illegal?" This is the most basic question someone can ask when determining if a decision is good for themselves and others. But each question lacks what the first question seeks to address. Yes, your decision may be legal and it may be right, but the person who seeks God asks the most important question first, "Is this a wise decision?" Or rather, "Will this decision honor God?"

There are times in our lives when we face hard choices. The Apostle James knew this all too well. He also realized that the struggle to gain wisdom is a universal human struggle which only God can remedy. The audience to which James is writing was struggling with how they should respond to persecution and extreme opposition from a variety of sources. Christ followers faced heavy persecution in and around Israel following Jesus' resurrection, and they were asking a very important question, "If we are being obedient to God,

why are we being persecuted?" James' instructions as to how they should respond were clear, "if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all generously and without reproach, and it will be given to him." Or rather, "if you are unsure of how to respond, ask God and He will instruct you."

His response is important and I want to make note of two aspects of this promise. First, anyone who asks God for wisdom will receive it. This includes anyone and everyone at any time. From the most faithful church-goer, to those who haven't spoken to God in years, God promises that if we ask Him, He will give us the wisdom we need to honor Him and bring the most good to ourselves and those around us. Second, there is no place where James alludes to wisdom making our lives easier or seemingly better. Those who strive to honor God will tell you that sometimes the choices that honor Him end up costing us dearly. The ultimate expression of how this is lived out in daily life is provided to us in the life of Christ, God's Son. Each day Jesus sought to honor God and it ended up getting Him killed. So when we face hard choices we can know that Jesus knows our struggle because He has lived the struggle and shown us what it means to act on God's wisdom.

The next time you find you face a difficult decision, my encouragement to you is simple, "if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all generously and without reproach, and it will be given to him." His wisdom may not be popular and it may not make your life easier, but you will be able to rest at the end of the day knowing that you honored God and that He is well pleased with your faith and trust in Him.

The winners of the 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade's Best Warrior Competition 2021 were announced March 19 on Hunter Army Airfield.

Sgt. Nikky Otero, a UH-60 Helicopter repairer assigned to 4th Battalion, 3rd Aviation Regiment, and Pfc. Garrett Stokum, a Grey Eagle unmanned aerial vehicle operator assigned to 3rd Squadron, 17th Cavalry Regiment, won the best Noncommissioned Officer and Soldier of the competition. Both Soldiers will represent 3rd CAB at the 3rd Infantry Division's competition later this year.

"This was a good experience," said Otero. "Representing the brigade is a little intimidating but is a good challenge that will require a lot of hard work, and I want to represent the brigade in a good manner."

Otero and Stokum were two of ten Soldiers from the brigade who participated in the four-day competition. The events tested their Army knowledge, warrior tasks and battle drills, and pushed them physically and mentally.

"To get ready physically, I do PT [physical training] in the morning and then I work out when I get home after work," Stokum said. "To prepare knowledge wise, I had to rely on the people in my unit to share their knowledge and help me study."

The first day consisted of the participants performing an Army Combat Physical Fitness Test in the morning and a

M4 rifle qualification later that afternoon.

The Soldiers were put through a physical gauntlet of sprints, high crawls and kettlebell carries to raise their heart rates before firing their weapons. This competition is designed to see who can remain calm and perform in a stressful environment.

On the second day, the competitors completed a 12-mile ruck march around the airfield. After the ruck march, they were tested on their basic Soldiering skills such as weapon familiarization on multiple weapon systems, patrolling and combat medical care.

For the third day of the competition, Soldiers were required to attend a formal board. This board consisted of senior non-commissioned officers who assessed them on their knowledge of Army doctrine and leadership skills.

On the fourth day, 3rd CAB held an award ceremony announcing the winners of the competition. Col. Michael McFadden, 3rd CAB commander, presented Sgt. Nikky Otero and Pfc. Garrett Stokum with a trophy and an Army Commendation Medal for winning 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade's Best Soldier and Noncommissioned Officer of the Year. All other participants received a brigade coin from the brigade commander.

"This helps me improve, and this is something I can pass on to my Soldiers," Otero said. "I hope seeing me compete and win gives them a little more motivation to achieve their own goals."

The 3rd Infantry Division's Food Service Program held a culminating event luncheon for their "Back 2 Basics" class 03-21, March 19 at the Division Culinary Arts Training Facility on Fort Stewart. Eight culinary specialist Soldiers from the class graduated after preparing a special five-course meal for critique.

"We teach them how to make everything from scratch," said Staff Sgt. Andrew Shurden, culinary arts manager and instructor for the 3rd Infantry Division. "When they come here we start from the basics, like how to hold a knife, how to do proper knife cuts, and how to make the mother sauces."

The program originated on Fort Stewart for culinary specialists throughout the 3rd Infantry Division footprint. The initiative reinstates what culinary specialists learned during advanced individual training in addition to building new culinary skills.

"Back 2 Basics' is a two week course," said Sgt. Maj. Lemakius Gardner, the chief culinary management sergeant major for the 3rd Infantry Division. "Once the Soldiers go back to their unit, they can put the skills that they learn out into the dining facility and teach and mentor their people."

Each class ends with a luncheon served by the Soldiers to their chain of command to showcase the skills that they acquired over the two-week course. As the class' chain of command ate their food, they filled out a paper survey to give feedback.

"I do encourage other [culinary specialists] to take this class," said Pvt. Tanya Jackson, a culinary specialist assigned to the 3rd Brigade Support Battalion, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team. "There's a lot that you can learn outside of the [dining facility]."

Gardner said class 03-21 was the first class of the 2021 year due to COVID-19. She said they will select eight to ten culinary specialists for the course every six weeks going forward.

"I want them to go back to their dining facilities and apply the skills that they learned here," said Shurden. "When they go back they can say, 'Let's get together and we'll start making changes.'"
