A memorial and golf scramble was held at the installation golf course to honor a respected Soldier for Life and Department of the Army Civilian who passed away April 9.

Family, friends and teammates, came to honor the memory of retired Master Sgt. Steve Williams, the Hunter Army Airfield garrison operations officer and community leader.

“No matter where he went, no matter the circumstances, he loved to help other people...that was Steve Williams,” said Charles Archer, Hunter Army Airfield religious services coordinator. “He motivated us to go beyond ourselves, in order to reach beyond that break.”

Even those who could not attend sent their well wishes and kind words, such as Lt. Col. Dave Escobar, former Hunter Army Airfield garrison commander. “Steve was typically the first to arrive and last to leave, the two places he loved most were his office in the operations center and this golf course,” Escobar said. “Thank you for sharing your energy, your focus and your intellect.”

A beloved member of the garrison team, Williams was also an avid sports enthusiast who played monthly in the Garrison Commander’s Golf scramble. Therefore, as a fitting way to remember Williams, the traveling trophy

Black Diamonds ready to demolish at Best Sapper Competition

Fifty teams competing, fifty miles to cover, and fifty hours to finish, but only one team can be named Best Sapper.

Three teams from Fort Stewart are slated to compete in the 14th annual Lt. Gen. Robert B. Flowers Best Sapper Competition, May 1-3 on Fort Leonard Wood, Mo. Among them is the 92nd Engineer Battalion, 20th Engineer Brigade team consisting of 1st Lt. Madison Jones, the executive officer of the 554th Engineer Construction Company, and a Mount Pleasant S.C. native and 1st Lt. Andrew Wilhelm, a route clearance platoon leader and native of Annapolis, Md.

This is the first time competing for both Jones, a graduate of Riverside High School in Greer, S.C. and the U.S. Military Academy, West Point and Wilhelm, a graduate of Queen Anne's County High School and St. Mary's College of Maryland.

The Best Sapper Competition not only determines the best sapper team from across the Army but tests the physical prowess and mental fortitude of the Soldiers competing. The competition began in 2005

as a means for Sappers to test their skills. In 2018, the competition was named after Lt. Gen. Robert B. Flowers for his efforts in getting the Sapper Tab approved.

Sappers are Soldiers who perform a variety of military engineering duties, such as breaching fortifications, demolitions, bridge-building, laying or clearing minefields, preparing field defenses, and road and airfield construction and repair. Traditionally combat engineers, they also train to serve alongside infantry personnel in defensive and offensive combat operations. A Sapper's duties are devoted to tasks involving facilitating movement, defense, and survival of allied forces, and impeding those of enemies.

"The events in the competition can be one big secret, so you have to train very broadly in order to execute," said Jones.

Competing Soldiers train months in advance to properly prepare their minds and bodies. The competition can consist of anything that combat engineers are required to learn during Sapper Leaders Course.

Previous competition challenges consisted of ruck marches, swimming, breaching doors, low crawling through barbed wire, welding and repelling from a helicopter. The events change annually and are kept

confidential to preserve rectitude.

"It's a lot of getting used to being under the weight of the ruck," said Wilhelm. "We've been doing ruck marches on the beach to simulate hills, carrying heavy oblong objects, and sharpening our engineering skills during the evenings and weekends."

Physical fitness is key, but a large part of the competition is solving problems engineers may see on the battlefield.

"I'm very excited," Wilhelm said. "In Sapper School, you're just trying to get through it, but now I have an opportunity to go back and show off what I've learned. Madison was the first in 92nd Engineer Battalion to go to Sapper School and qualify for quite a while. She came back and not only did my train-up, but train-ups for two other lieutenants also. So, she's the brains and the brawns and I'm here for the ride."

With Sapper School under their belts and months of strenuous training prior to this event, the 92nd Engineer Battalion team assures that they will represent well for the 3rd Infantry Division and Fort Stewart community at the Best Sapper Competition.

"I'm confident that we will be able to compete," said Jones, "I want to bring home the trophy."

MICC unit supports COVID-19 vaccine sites in Florida, Georgia

Contracting professionals from the 904th Contracting Battalion and Mission and Installation Contracting Command on Fort Stewart continue to support ongoing efforts to vaccinate more than 1 million people against COVID-19 in Florida and Georgia.

Beginning in late Feb., the 904th CBN contracted life support services for more than 700 service members. These joint missions are comprised of Army, Navy and Air Force personnel who are manning five federal vaccination sites in Orlando, Tampa, Miami, Jacksonville and Atlanta for up to 60 days.

Each contract provides lodging, meals, laundry, and transportation services supporting numerous doctors, nurses, administrative and support staff assigned to each of the vaccination sites. Federal Emergency Management Agency and state government officials provide overall oversight of daily operations at each of the five vaccination sites.

The 904th CBN assigned two teams to the support the effort; one each for Florida and Georgia. The Florida team consists of Maj. Jerry Andes II, Maj. Paul Kilgore, Master Sgt. Mark Wirtz, Sgt. 1st Class Jason Shettles and Staff Sgts. Lamar Dunlap and Dwayne Phelps. The Georgia team consists of Maj. Alicia Scott, Sgt. 1st Class Daryl Slate, Sgt. 1st Class Rafael Alameda and Staff Sgt. Christina Helsham.

“Our vigilant ready response teams did an amazing job delivering support in a very fluid and dynamic environment,” said Lt. Col. Torrienne Reche, the 904th CBN commander. “Their efforts will enable medical professionals to vaccinate over 1 million civilian personnel against COVID-19.”

Through the use of full and open competition and emergency acquisition flexibilities, synchronized collaboration with the 4th Expeditionary Sustainment Command, the 904th CBN was able to save more than \$6 million compared to the independent government estimate, which was based on per diem rates for lodging and meals, and the 4th ESC’s market research for bulk laundry and bus transportation.

The Florida and Georgia COVID-19 vaccination missions are part of a larger nationwide military response to assist with the vaccination sites across the country. Military personnel currently support 20 vaccination sites with at least 10 additional sites to be determined.

Headquartered at Joint Base San Antonio-Fort Sam Houston, Texas, the Mission and Installation Contracting Command consists of about 1,500 military and civilian members who are responsible for contracting goods and services in support of Soldiers as well as readying trained contracting units for the operating force and contingency environment when called upon. As part of its mission, MICC contracts are vital in feeding more than 200,000 Soldiers every day, providing many daily base operations support services at installations, facilitate training in the preparation of more than 100,000 conventional force members annually, training more than 500,000 students each year, and maintaining more than 14.4 million acres of land and 170,000 structures.

Raiders travel from South Korea to compete in Best Ranger

During the last four months, 1st Lt. Zachary Hobson and 1st Lt. David Stanley delicately balanced a regimen of long-distance running, roughly 24 miles of ruck marching per week, intense gym workouts and countless hours spent honing their Soldier skills in the hopes of proving that they are the best Rangers the Army has to offer.

These Soldiers will soon put their training to the test during the Army's 37th Annual Best Ranger Competition slated to take place at Fort Benning, April 16-18. No matter the outcome of the competition, the two lieutenants have one silver lining in mind.

"I'm excited to just take more than one day off of running," joked Hobson, a West Point graduate and Tampa, Florida, native who currently serves as a mortar platoon leader.

The thought of finishing the competition and finally taking a needed day off keeps the Rangers putting one foot in front of the other each time they push themselves through a 12, 14, or 20-mile ruck march.

"I'm excited to put the rucksack down for a few months and give my back and knees a break," Hobson continued. "That's the biggest thing we're excited for."

Hobson and Stanley both currently serve with 1st Battalion, 64th Armor Regiment, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, which is presently deployed to South Korea. Both came back to the United States only recently in order to train for, and take part in, the Best Ranger Competition.

Every year, Rangers from across the Army compete in the grueling three-day competition. Completing task after task for 61 continuous hours and operating on little sleep, only one two-man team walks away with the title of Best Ranger. The event started in 1982, and each year the Airborne and Ranger Training Brigade honors Lieutenant General David E. Grange Jr. by hosting the competition.

From helicopter jumps, night-time navigation, marksmanship, over 20

miles of ruck marches and many more assessments, Rangers train for months leading up to the competition each year to hone their skills.

While only one team can take home the title, all the teams serve as an example for the Soldiers in their units back home.

"Part of being a Ranger means setting an example every single day," said Hobson. "We want to show our Soldiers that even though you are Ranger qualified, you still have to push yourself."

Hobson said his unit's senior enlisted advisor, Command Sgt. Maj. Michael Hall, coordinated a Best Ranger Competition tryout for 1st ABCT's Ranger-qualified Soldiers deployed in South Korea. Two teams were formed from the results of the tryout and were sent to Georgia for further training.

"He's kind of been our guide and our mentor as we've been trying to prepare," said Hobson, speaking of Hall.

With the competition just around the corner, the two Rangers are eager to put their skills to the test against their peers.

"We're there to win," said Stanley, a Syracuse University graduate and Boston native serving as a tank company executive officer. "We wouldn't go and compete if we didn't think we could be competitive to win. We're there to try our absolute hardest."

Stanley said that while training, he and Hobson took advice from Hall and Maj. Jonathan Rembetsy, a battalion executive officer in their brigade. He said both have been guiding figures, with Rembetsy providing his training regime from when he competed for the Best Ranger Competition two years ago, and Hall giving insight from when helped run the competition as a first sergeant in Ranger Training Brigade in years past.

Teamwork has been at the forefront for both Rangers as they pushed themselves for this upcoming competition.

"Every single training we run shoulder-to-shoulder and we ruck right next to each other," said Hobson. "I've spent more time with him than anyone

else over the last four months."

Though Hobson and Stanley, due to their deployment to Korea, missed the opportunity to train at Fort Benning with the other competitors, both are confident in the training plan they used at Fort Stewart.

"We're not gonna make any excuses," said Hobson. "We've worked just as hard as all the other teams. If not, we're trying to work harder."

For each event of the competition, teams

accumulate points based on their performance with the hope that they meet the cut for the next day. Hobson said he and Stanley aim to make each cut every day of the competition.

"I'm proud to know these Rangers and serve alongside them," said Hall. "Each of them are exceptional leaders who strive everyday for excellence. They live to compete and set the ultimate example for their Soldiers."



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Be prepared, hurricane season is around the corner

Beginning with this year's hurricane season outlooks, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Climate Prediction Center will use 1991-2020 as the new 30-year period of record.

The updated averages for the Atlantic hurricane season have increased with 14 named storms and 7 hurricanes. The average for major hurricanes (Category 3, 4 or 5) remains unchanged at 3. The previous Atlantic storm averages, based on the period from 1981 to 2010, were 12 named storms, 6 hurricanes, and 3 major hurricanes.

NOAA is updating the set of statistics used to determine when hurricane seasons are above, near, or below average relative to the climate record. This update process occurs once every decade.

"This update allows our meteorologists to make forecasts for the hurricane season with the most relevant climate statistics taken into consideration," said Michael Farrar, director of NOAA's National Centers for Environmental Prediction. "Our work illustrates the value of NOAA's investments in next-generation technologies to capture the data that underpins our outlooks and other forecast products. These products are essential to providing the public and local emergency managers with advance information to prepare for storms, and achieving NOAA's mission of protecting life and property."

This graphic captures the changes in Atlantic hurricane season averages from the last three-decade period of 1981-2010 to the most current such period, 1991-2020. The updated averages for the Atlantic hurricane season have increased with 14 named storms and 7 hurricanes. The average for major hurricanes remains unchanged at 3. The previous

Atlantic storm averages, based on the period from 1981 to 2010, were 12 named storms, 6 hurricanes, and 3 major hurricanes. To learn more visit bit.ly/NOAAHurricaneSeasonAverages (NOAA)

The increase in the averages may be attributed to the overall improvement in observing platforms, including NOAA's fleet of next-generation environmental satellites and continued hurricane reconnaissance. It may also be due to the warming ocean and atmosphere that are influenced by climate change. The update also reflects a very busy period over the last 30 years, which includes many years of a positive Atlantic Multi-decadal Oscillation, which can increase Atlantic hurricane activity.

"These updated averages better reflect our collective experience of the past 10 years, which included some very active hurricane seasons," said Matt Rosecrans, seasonal hurricane forecaster at NOAA's Climate Prediction Center. "NOAA scientists have evaluated the impacts of climate change on tropical cyclones and determined that it can influence storm intensity. Further research is needed to better understand and attribute the impacts of anthropogenic forcings and natural variability on tropical storm activity."

For the Eastern Pacific and Central Pacific basins, the averages over the 1991 - 2020 period do not change. The Eastern Pacific basin will remain at 15 named storms, 8 hurricanes, and 4 major hurricanes. The Central Pacific basin will maintain an average of 4 named storms, 3 hurricanes and 2 major hurricanes.

NOAA will issue its initial seasonal outlook for the 2021 hurricane season in late May. The Atlantic hurricane season officially runs from June 1 through November 30.



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Chaplains embrace the past to prepare for a better future

“When you enter new situations you must learn to adapt and be flexible,” said Sgt. Eric Jackson II, 3rd Division Sustainment Brigade religious affairs noncommissioned officer. “Not only in the unit or area that you go into, but also the Soldiers that you work with.”

Looking into the past can aid chaplains and religious affairs on their journeys of taking care of Soldiers’ mental and religious health.

“The Army leaders want to build a healthy culture and community within the Army and the chaplains can help do that by focusing on just the spiritual pillar of a service member’s life,” said Lt. Col. Chris Wallace, the 3rd Infantry Division chaplain.

Having staff rides allows Soldiers to analyze the past and avoid repeating errors in the future, while networking with others in their job field.

“People don’t change and the human condition doesn’t change,” said Huey. “The importance of being able to understand the past and apply it in the present enables you to prepare successfully for the future.”



Motorcycle safety is key during warmer weather

With the weather warming up, motorcycles will become more visible on local trails and roadways.

During their down time, bikes can deteriorate slowly. Tires may drop in pressure or dry rot, chains can become rusty, and believe it or not condensation can develop in our oil and brake fluid.

Before bringing your motorcycle out for the season it's extremely important to take a look at the bike to check for deficiencies.

- Tire pressures should be at the motorcycle manufacturer specs, not the tires. 99% of the time the pressure on the side of the tire is at max load. Look in your owner's manual for the right answer.
- Change your oil, no matter how many miles you have been since the last change. Batteries will drop a charge quickly. It's best to put a trickle charger on the battery for a couple days prior to starting the bike. Fuel octane ratings are a resistance to damaging detonation in our engines. As fuel sits the octane rating reduces and can possibly tarnish carburetors, fuel injectors, and throttle bodies. A fresh tank of the recommended fuel is a must.
- Check the brakes. Does the lever feel spongy, if so, you might need to change and bleed the fluid.

It's also important to keep your gear in mind.

- Department of Transportation helmets are required when riding a motorcycle. Make sure to look at your helmet's manufacturers recommendation for how old a helmet should be before being replaced.
- Eye pro and full finger gloves with a leather palm are recommended.
- Make sure to wear sturdy over the ankle footwear. Athletic shoes such as basketball shoes don't count. Also, footwear is required to be properly laced, buckled, or strapped while riding.
- Long sleeves are the minimum for upper garments but it is always a great practice to have a motorcycle jacket that provides impact and abrasion resistance.
- Long pants are required. PT style pants, jogging pants, and sweats are not permitted.

After the 1st ride, make sure to check everything over once again.

- Things like fork seals might not show up as an issue until the suspension gets going. Then a leak may happen. As fork fluid drips down the forks it can get into the brakes and on the tires causing a dangerous situation.
- The TCLOCS motorcycle inspection attached to the Motorcycle Safety SOP is a perfect tool to check your motorcycle. Not only that, but it is a quarterly requirement for your individual unit to check your motorcycle.

Winn offers COVID vaccine drive-thru Friday

Individuals can prepare for their visit by going to winn.tricare.mil, and downloading the Defense Health Agency Form 207 and completing information. The form will also be available onsite at the screening station.

Winn ACH only provides the Moderna Vaccine. The vaccine is delivered in two doses separated by 28-42 days for full efficacy – around 94.1%.


