Media Day highlights installation's environmental achievements

On the Army's 246th birthday, local news media spent time with members of the Fort Stewart Forestry Branch, to see firsthand why the installation's Directorate of Public Works received two Army-level awards for excellence.

The June 14 event began with opening comments from the Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield garrison commander, Col. Bryan Logan, where he discussed the installation's recent recognition for environmental excellence by the Secretary of the Army with the 2020 Secretary of the Army Environmental Award for Natural Resources Conservation for a Large Installation and the 2020 Secretary of the Army Environmental Award for Cultural Resource Management for the team/individual category.

"We are one of the leading Department of Defense installations, not only for cultural resource management but also for forestry operations," Logan said. "Our partnerships that we

have with the local communities is what brings it all together. Most of the public doesn't know that we have biologists, environmental management and archaeologists on our staff. They don't just assist our Army, they are part of the Army team and that's what makes us successful."

Subject matter experts from the Directorate of Public Works environmental section escorted the group to a training area where they explained the purpose of controlled burns; management of the red-cockaded woodpecker population; and how the installation and surrounding communities benefit from flora and fauna management.

"Between our controlled burn program and our timber thinning and harvesting programs, our Environmental and Forestry divisions are able to support not just our Soldiers but the economy, the threatened and endangered species habitat, and the longleaf pine Wiregrass ecosystem in our area," said Jeff Mangun, the DPW Forestry branch chief.

"During the two-year period of 2019 and 2020

the Fort Stewart Forestry branch burned over 230,000 acres of woods through our prescribed burn program," Mangun said. "In addition, we thinned 5,500 acres worth of timber in the training areas, and approximately 250 acres in the containment area as part of the installation's wildfire protection plan. We also planted about 240 acres worth of longleaf pine in an effort to restore the longleaf pine wiregrass ecosystem."

The event closed with a visit to Taylors Creek Cemetery, one of Fort Stewart's largest cultural resources, where the installation archaeologist, Brian Greer, explained the history and significance of the cemeteries and historical sites on Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield.

"We have an amazing team that puts this together, really managing our environmental assets so that includes wildlife management, cultural resource management and more importantly ensuring that the conditions are set for our Soldiers to train and prepare for worldwide deployment anywhere or anytime they may be called," Logan said.

Marne Air bids farewell to outgoing commander

The 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division bid farewell to Col. Michael McFadden and welcomed Col. Eric Vanek as the new brigade commander during a change of command ceremony, June 10 on Hunter Army Airfield.

McFadden, with 33 years of military service behind him, assumed command in June 2019, leading the brigade through a nine-month rotation to Europe in support of Atlantic Resolve. While deployed, 3rd CAB provided aviation support across 12 countries, while simultaneously conducting COVID-19 relief operations throughout Europe.

Once back in the U.S., the brigade continued to hold its warfighting stance, completing three combat training center rotations, two Warfighter exercises and multiple joint operation exercises with the Air Force, Coast Guard and Marine Corps. The 3rd CAB also currently supports the installation medical evacuation mission for Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield.

The reviewing officer for the change of command was the 3rd Infantry Division Commanding General, Maj. Gen. Antonio Aguto. During his remarks he welcomed Vanek and his family back to Hunter Army Airfield. Vanek was stationed at Hunter Army Airfield from 2003 to 2009 as he served in the 3rd Battalion, 160th Special Operations Aviation Regiment.

Aguto continued and acknowledged the accomplishments of McFadden throughout his time in command.

“Mike, I’d like to thank you for your dedication, and the care you have for your Dogface Soldiers and their Families,” Aguto said. “It has truly been an honor to serve with you, and I want to thank you and your family for all you have given to this brigade, and to our Dogface Soldiers in this community.”

McFadden thanked the Soldiers of the 3rd CAB for their hard work in executing missions spanning across both the country and globe and for consistently striving for excellence.

“This brigade has accomplished so much, and I could go on for days about the never-ending successes, but I wouldn’t have time,” said McFadden. “What I will say is everything, and I mean everything that was ever asked of these Marne Air Soldiers, they did with absolute precision and poise. It has been the greatest honor of my career to call myself Falcon 6.”

Vanek, a Plymouth, New Hampshire native, commissioned as an aviation officer in 1997 from the United States Military Academy at West Point. He has served in a variety of assignments throughout his military career, most recently serving as the Deputy Commanding General of the Security Force Assistance Command at Fort Bragg, North Carolina.

“What a privilege it is to assume command of this incredibly fierce fighting force, the 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade,” said Vanek. “It is great to be back on the tarmac of Hunter Army Airfield, and I couldn’t be more proud to serve beside each and every one of you. This is Falcon 6 on the net. Rock of the Marne, Marne Air.”

Spartans return home, vaccine mission complete

Federal Vaccine Response

The final 24 Soldiers from the 2nd Battalion, 69th Armor Regiment, 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, who served in Task Force Marne in support of the Atlanta Community Vaccination Center, returned Tuesday, June 8 to Fort Stewart. The arrival of the last 2nd ABCT Soldiers marks the end of the nearly two and a half months of the whole-of-government response to COVID-19 in Atlanta's Mercedes-Benz Stadium. The CVC ended on a high note after surpassing 300,000 administered shots to the people of the Atlanta metropolitan area.

When the operation began on March 24, approximately 220 Soldiers from the 3rd Battalion, 67th Armor Regiment, 2nd ABCT, 3rd ID, were assigned to the Atlanta CVC task force to set up the operation and implement a plan born out of the collaboration between government agencies and private enterprise. The entities included the Federal Emergency Management Agency, the Department of Defense, Georgia Department of Public Health, Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency, Fulton County Board of Health, Atlanta-Fulton County Emergency Management Agency, and Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

"What led to our success here working with our civilian partners was the early coordination conducted with the team," said Lt. Col. Steven Chadwick, the 3rd Bn, 67th AR, and Atlanta CVC military task force commander. "That early coordination really allowed us to understand the mission requirements here and how they

intended to utilize our Title 10 team."

The Soldiers from the 2nd ABCT, 3rd ID, had just returned in December 2020 from an unanticipated extended rotation in Europe due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Although the Atlanta CVC mission was unexpected, the Soldiers rose to the occasion.

"This was an exciting opportunity for me to get to treat Americans in a civilian setting, which is not something I get to do very often," said Sgt. Shannon Pambrun, a medic assigned to the Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 3rd Bn, 67th AR, and one of the many trained vaccinators at the Atlanta CVC.

The initial goal for the Atlanta CVC was 6,000 shots per day. Pambrun explained that his team used the initial vaccination operation plans FEMA provided and augmented them.

"By the end of the time we were there, at the height of our vaccination days, we were doing upwards of 10,000 [shots] per day," said Pambrun.

During the last week of April, the 3rd Bn., 67th AR's sister battalion in the 2nd ABCT, the 2nd Battalion, 69th Armor Regiment, completed a handover of operations. During the week of the transition on April 28, the CVC managed to administer a total of 12,726 shots – the most shots given on a single day for any mega-vaccine center in the country.

The day-to-day success of the vaccination hinged on Soldiers like Spc. Mike Florez, a tank gunner from 2nd Bn., 69th AR. He was a supervisor of the medical equipment and supplies for one of the several Atlanta CVC dispensing points. He noted the difference between this mission from his previous ones overseas. "When we deploy it was always the companies together or my

tank crew together. For us to get to help out the community in Atlanta and then to have my company there, and to have the people tell us thank you, it was special for me," Florez said.

When asked about the outcome of the Atlanta CVC, Lt. Col. George Bolton Jr., commander of the 2nd Bn., 69th AR, and the military task force commander once his unit relieved the 3rd Bn., 67th AR, said "Before we started, a lot of things were boarded up; the businesses, the restaurants, the tourism sites, the aquarium, and the hotels. Afterward, you can look around at your own metrics of success."

The final vaccination count from the Atlanta CVC was 300,452 shots administered. This would not have been possible without the major contribution of 400 plus Soldiers from the 3rd Bn., 67th AR, and the 2nd Bn., 69th AR, in Fort Stewart's 2nd armored brigade who worked every day for almost two and-a-half months. The total Task Force Marne Soldier count also included medical Soldiers from different units across the Division at Fort Stewart as well as from posts as far away as Hawaii and Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Bethesda, Maryland.

"We were extremely humbled to have the opportunity to partner with high-quality professionals from multiple government agencies and private enterprise to serve the people of the Atlanta metro area," said Col. Terry Tillis, 2nd ABCT, 3rd ID commander. "Our brigade's primary mission prepares us to deploy forward and partner with people in foreign lands. However, this opportunity was something special for our 3rd Infantry Division "Dogface" Soldiers, to serve fellow Americans on the home front."

Commissary to offer click-2-go online shopping option

Commissary CLICK2GO, the Defense Commissary Agency's new online ordering and curbside delivery service, is coming to the Fort Stewart Commissary July 20.

"This service really speaks to the needs of our customers who can now plan, order and pay for their purchases on-line and then just drive to the store to get them without having to get out of their vehicle," said store director, Conney Sailes.

Here's a brief rundown of Commissary CLICK2GO's features:

- Easy-to-use navigation and search functions to help customers plan healthy meals and take care of their Family's needs
- Enhanced product information
- Robust recipe features
- Featured sales and promotions
- Upgraded mobile-friendly experience

Information on how the service works is found on commissaries.com with dedicated sections such as "How CLICK2GO Works." First-time customers will need to create an account.

In step with grocery shopping trends, DeCA is working to bring on-line ordering, payment and pick-up options to all commissary-eligible patrons. In early June the agency announced plans to expand Commissary CLICK2GO to all 236 commissaries worldwide, and the rollout status can be found on the agency's web site.

"I encourage all our shoppers to access the CLICK2GO page on commissaries.com to learn more about it," said Sailes.

Customers use a computer or mobile device to make their orders online where they select from commissary products offered based on the store's stock assortment. After products are selected, the shopper selects a pickup time and pays for their order. At their appointed time they park in designated parking spaces where commissary workers bring their groceries. The Fort Stewart CLICK2GO will begin accepting online orders on July 20 for pick-up.

As part of an introductory offer, the service will be free during the first 30 days of operation. After that a \$4.95 service fee will be applied for each order as it is at other Commissary CLICK2GO locations.



How vision and hearing contribute to readiness

“Readiness’ implies that a military service member can fulfill a mission from all aspects, including having trained properly to master the skills to undertake a given mission, as well as being in the right state of physical, psychological, and overall health.

Our senses have an important function in service members’ health and readiness. They are interconnected, meaning they work with each other to allow us to function, move, and communicate.

In the case of hearing and sight, for example, the two dominant senses work together to create the perception of what we experience in the world, according to Dr. Mike Pattison, program manager of readiness and operations optometry at the Defense Department’s Vision Center of Excellence (VCE) in Falls Church, Virginia.

“Studies involving sight have found that the visual cortex uses signals received from both the eyes and the ears when viewing the

world,” he said.

Added Dr. Felix Barker, VCE’s director of rehabilitation and reintegration: “Vision and hearing guide nearly all human behavior - as two of our most important senses, they allow us to remotely sense opportunities and threats at great distances compared to other senses such as smell and touch.

“This ability extends to interaction with the environment at a safe distance,” he said. “A great example of this is driving, where vision and hearing enable us to safely move through our environment using technological solutions that greatly enhance our access to our world.”

Dr. Amy Boudin-George, a clinical audiologist at the DOD’s Hearing Center of Excellence, at Lackland Air Force Base, Texas, said “our hearing allows us to listen to others, while our vision allows us to see their mouths, expressions, and gestures to help us confirm what they are saying.”

And, said Pattison, “where the visual input is unclear such as at dusk or in a dark building, hearing takes on a more prominent role.

Hearing helps us monitor our environment for potential threats or opportunities in directions other than where we are looking, which results in shifts in where we look when necessary.”

In fact, he said, “studies have found that the brain has to work harder to hear when we are not looking at what we are listening to.”

This is especially true with radio communications, which place all the emphasis on hearing, said Boudin-George.

In the military, this is important because hearing and vision are key to accurate situational awareness and mission success, allowing for coordination within a service member’s unit and other units and forces, she said.

“Service members must be able to recognize, identify and locate threats,” she said.

And the more we can use both vision and hearing, the more accurate we can be at those tasks, she said.

It is paramount to maintain optimal vision and hearing as part of service members’ readiness.

“Vision readiness is an integral element of force health protection and operational readiness,” said Pattison. “Assessing vision and optical readiness as part of the Periodic Health Assessment ensures that warfighters are ready to deploy in a moment’s notice.”

Likewise with hearing. “Monitoring hearing addresses the initial ability to hear, but if an individual suffers temporary hearing loss during a mission, it can degrade the capability of that unit,” said Boudin-George.

“Units are only as strong as the weakest link,” said Theresa Schulz, a retired Air Force lieutenant colonel with a doctorate in hearing science who serves as chief of HCE’s prevention and surveillance branch. “For mission success, all members of a unit need their senses.”

Understanding authority through Peter's words

The Apostle Peter wrote to Christians in the first century who needed help understanding their relationship to both spiritual and physical authority.

Like Peter's audience, we don't often like the idea of someone or some organization being in authority over us. We like to make our own decisions and choose our own path. But the problem we face, which is no different than the problem facing Peter's audience, is that we need left and right limits to help us stay on the right path, and treat others with dignity and respect.

There are many ways authority helps us. When you leave your home and travel to work, you are under the authority of the police and local government. They maintain the safe and orderly operation of the roads. When you arrive at your job, you are under the authority of a supervisor or boss. They ensure you complete the tasks given and that you operate within the social boundaries set by the organization you work for.

It is this authority that ensures you and your coworkers treat each other with a certain level of dignity and respect. Even in places like the grocery store or gas station, you are not the authority when you enter the facility. The store manager or station attendant is in charge, and if you misbehave, that someone has the author-

ity to ask you to leave.

There is one area of life that I often see an absence of authority or at least confusion regarding how authority should be applied, and that is in the home.

Over and over again, couples come to me and say, "He treats me terrible!" Or, "She is so disrespectful!" I often ask, "Who governs your behavior in the marriage?" Or, "Who's the authority in your marriage?" Usually, the answer is, "I am." But the dilemma with us being the authority over our behavior is that we are often wrong and hurtful in the way we treat our spouse. Usually, our response when wounded is to fight fire with fire. In doing so, we may inevitably burn the marriage to the ground.

The reality is, God knows we need His authority in the home as much as we need it everywhere else in life. So when our spouse says or does something that is hurtful to us, we respond based on how we know God wants us to treat others when they have hurt us. When we act under His authority in the home, we can remember, "I know he or she is being disrespectful, but I will not treat him/her that way because I know God has something better for both of us if we will together submit to Him."

My encouragement to you is to keep God first in your marriage, as the highest authority, so that both of you love and treat each other with the dignity and respect of being made in the image of the God who loves you.
