Hunter Army Airfield leaders get involved in base housing

The installation hosted a walking town hall for local leaders and their Soldiers, July 30.

During this event, Balfour Beatty Communities, Directorate of Public Works Military Housing and the garrison command staff, provided local Army leaders with information, tours and a community walk through. Additionally, community members had the chance to ask questions and bring up concerns to leadership.

"We got the senior leaders together and walked around base housing. We started at a legacy home in Wilson Acres and then viewed an ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) house in New Gannam," Command Sgt. Maj. Ryan Reichard, Hunter Army Airfield garrison senior enlisted leader said. After that, we continued walking through the neighborhood so they could see how their Soldiers are living and how they're taking care of the properties."

During the home tours, Reichard along with BBC and Military Housing leadership reviewed everything from occupancy percentages to common complaints of residents. According to Reichard, this education of local leadership was necessary for improving overall quality of life for the Soldiers.

"Sometimes people don't feel comfortable enough bringing things to us and then the people who advocate for them don't understand the processes," Sika Smith, Hunter Army Airfield Homes community manager said. "Having a Soldier's senior leader involved in this ultimately helps improve the overall quality of life for their Soldiers."

Additionally, BBC, Military Housing and garrison leaders requested the support of unit leadership in keeping their Soldiers accountable. According to Reichard, there are some problems and recurring complaints that can be avoided through leader intervention.

"We need leader engagement to improve the neighborhoods because there is a level of responsibility that falls on the Soldiers. Things as simple as taking in the trash bin after collection or picking up toys off the lawns so they can be mowed properly," Reichard said.

In more extreme cases, residents who neglect or damage the property increase wait times for incoming families while the home is prepared. Lt. Col. Stephan Bolton, Hunter Army Airfield garrison commander, explained that when these extreme circumstances present themselves, there are usually additional problems within the household that may require command attention. Therefore, understanding how the Soldiers live can help leaders identify those more serious issues.

After providing leadership with the tour around base housing, the group met with residents at the Warrior Way playground in New Gannam.

Main concerns of the residents were service requests, grass maintenance and trash. According to Smith, many

of these issues take time to resolve as they coordinate with the vendors, suppliers and the approval chain. While her team is working hard to resolve issues, her staff depends on the constant communication between residents and Hunter Army Airfield Homes.

"We care. They are all part of my Family and we want to know what issues are out there," Smith said.

According to Reichard, these walking town halls will be quarterly events. Future town halls to be announced on the Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield Facebook pages.

The Battle Axe reforged: Raiders uncase colors

Soldiers assigned to 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, uncased their colors Aug. 3 on Fort Stewart.

The ceremony was held to mark the official redeployment of the brigade—known as the Battle Axe of 3rd ID—after a ninemonth rotation to the Republic of Korea. The Raider Brigade deployed in October 2020 as one of the Army's first units to conduct large-scale training operations during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Col. Trent Upton, commander of the Raider Brigade, led the ceremony.

"From both World Wars, to Korea, to the Global War on Terrorism, we stand on the shoulders of giants," Upton said. "A history and lineage of courage, selflessness, and honor that we have upheld on our most recent mission, and to which we have added yet another chapter."

The deployment itself marked a historic return of 3rd ID Soldiers to the Republic of Korea for only the second time since the end of the Korean War.

During the deployment, Raider Soldiers worked alongside their Korean allies conducting multi-echelon training events, sharing each other's cultures, and strengthening the U.S.-Korean alliance.

"As the first BCT in the Army to complete its train up, deploy, and operate in a COVID-19 environment, Raider outpaced others, setting multiple rotational readiness records," Upton said.

Upton said that the success of the Raider Brigade's was shouldered by the Soldiers within its ranks and lauded the efforts of every individual in the organization. He also recognized that the Soldiers would not have been successful had it not been for the support of their families and friends.

"You all helped prevent regional aggression, maintained exceptional readiness and worked together with our ROK Army partners for the prosperity of the region," Maj. Gen. Charles D. Costanza, commanding general of 3rd ID said.

Costanza went on to thank the Raider Soldiers for their hard work during their deployment and welcomed them home.

As the Raiders continue to reintegrate and get back to life at home, they will continue to stay ready to answer their Nation's call.

"We are Raiders first for a reason," Upton said. "We are the Battle Axe of 3rd ID."

New bicycle law now in effect

As of July 1, the operator of a motor vehicle approaching a bicycle shall approach the bicycle with due caution and shall proceed as follows. The new 3-Feet-Law is outlined in § 40-6-56.

- Make a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the bicycle if possible in the existing road and traffic conditions
- If a lane change under paragraph (1) of this subsection would be impossible, prohibited by law, or unsafe, reduce the speed of the motor vehicle to a reasonable and proper speed for the existing road and traffic conditions, which speed shall be at least ten miles per hour less than the posted speed limit or 25 miles per hour, whichever is more, and proceed around the bicycle with at least three feet between such vehicle and the bicycle at all times.

Draft finding of no practicable alternative to repair the tide gate on Hunter Army Airfield

The U.S. Army, Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield, proposes to repair an existing tide gate located in the Little Ogeechee Creek in the southwestern portion of Hunter Army Airfield.

Currently the northern abutment of the tide gate has eroded, allowing large amounts of tidal waters to damage the infrastructure of the tide gate. The Army proposes to conduct repairs sufficient to repair the existing infrastructure at this location, preventing water from continuing to cause additional damage. and restoring its functionality.

The National Environmental Policy Act requirements for this action have been met via preparation of a Record of Environmental Consideration, which can be found as an attachment to the Draft Finding of No Practicable Alternative.

"In support of the DoD's decision to freeze PCS last year, Lendlease supported the voluntary offering of room rates significantly lower than per diem by IHG, to assist service members maneuvering through PCS moves," Gretchen Turpen, Lendlease head of lodging said. "To ensure we continue to meet the needs of all service members, we have extended this offering providing service members with an option for temporary lodging at BAH rates until they find permanent accommodation at their new duty station."

She further explained that the decision shows the PAL program's ability to flex with the needs of the DoD, and most importantly allows the mission of providing safe and quality accommodations for service members and Families to continue. COVID-19's impact on availability of housing remains a significant concern for Families across the nation. The shortage of inventory combined with increased housing and rental costs in many of military communities has put more pressure on Families.

"We're proud to be able to offer a home away from home for so many military travelers and their Families and know that COVID-19 continues to interrupt so many lives and plans," Chuck Sourbeer, IHG Army Hotels head of operations said. "Thousands of Families have taken advantage of this special discounted rate over the last year and we know that extending the rate is the right thing to do to support those who serve us every day."

The BAH rate is available upon request, under certain terms and conditions, and not a default rate at check-in at IHG Army Hotels. A Family, or anyone on PCS orders, who is having trouble securing housing should contact their local housing office, or hotel front desk, for a form that provides hotel staff with the information they need to manually adjust the rate, so the going-forward rate equals their particular BAH.

Each year, the Army designates the month of August as Antiterrorism Awareness Month to raise awareness of the Army's ongoing efforts to protect Soldiers, their Families, Department of Army civilians and contractors from potential threats

With a focus on training and awareness, AT awareness month provides an opportunity for the Army to educate families and communities on how to prevent against terrorist threats.

The Army's first line of defense, Soldiers, civilian personnel and their Families play a vital role in deterring enemy threats. While there have been less than 20 terrorist attacks on average per year from 2000-2020 and law enforcement has gotten better at thwarting terrorist attacks, they cannot stop them all. Soldiers and civilians can help to prevent their communities from becoming victims of these heinous acts by recognizing and reporting suspicious activity.

The key message for antiterrorism awareness month is "See Something, Say Something."

Effective antiterrorism measures require a combination of great leadership, an active AT force, and personal involvement. By understanding individual responsibilities, to include, how to detect possible terrorist activities and report suspicious activity, everyone can take an active part in keeping others safe. This increased level of awareness will help to protect critical resources both on and off the installation. The Defense Logistics Agency official site reminds its' readers that it is good to bring these reminders back to the forefront of daily life as vigilance and awareness are essential parts of protecting the force.

Fort Stewart and the 3rd Infantry Division celebrated the Army Chaplain Corps' 246th birthday with a day-long event at the Main Post Chapel, July 30.

Chaplains are the military's religious leaders and are responsible for tending to the spiritual and moral wellbeing of Service members and their Families. They have provided religious support to Soldiers, Families, and Civilians of the U.S. Army since July 29, 1775.

This year's celebration paid special attention to the heroic actions of Chap. Capt. Emil J. Kapaun, who gave his life in the line of duty during World War II.

"Our mission has never been more important," Chap. Lt. Col. Christopher Wallace said. "Our skills have never been more relevant; our time to serve is now. We care for the soul of the Army; it is our sacred duty."

The event kicked off with physical fitness training, an important part of any Soldier's day.

"Physical training is part of what a U.S. Soldier is," Chap. Col. Rajmund Kopec said. "If we look at the example of Chaplain Kapaun, first of all his spiritual fitness was most essential, but his physical fitness helped him carry the Soldiers from one foxhole to the another, so staying physically fit also helps to stay spiritually fit."

An awards ceremony took place after PT and culminated with the presentation of Legion of Merit awards to Master Sgts. Joseph Bouchard and Arthur Woods Jr.

"The Chaplain Corps has done amazing things for the United States Army," Brig. Gen. Jasper Jeffers, the deputy commanding general for maneuver for 3rd ID said. "When the bullets start flying, everybody loves a chaplain; I will tell you from personal experience."

The afternoon was spent talking about the lasting legacy of Kapaun.

"Kapaun was one of the first reinforcements that was sent to Korea to resist the invasion," Kopec said. "Kapaun ran through the enemy's fire to bring back Soldiers to safety. He had the need to help people."

Kapaun distinguished himself with extraordinary heroism and selfless service during the Korean War. On Oct. 31, as Kapaun ministered to Soldiers of 3rd Battalion, 8th Cavalry Regiment, enemies began attacking near his position in Unsan, South Korea.

As Chinese communist forces surrounded his battalion, Kapaun repeatedly exposed himself to enemy fire to recover wounded men and drag them to safety. As the enemy closed in, Kapaun rejected several chances to escape, choosing instead to stay behind to care for the wounded. He was taken as a prisoner of war by Chinese forces Nov. 2.

Kapaun spent the next seven months in the Sambukol and Pyoktong prison camps. During his time at these camps, he continued to minister and care for sick and wounded Soldiers. Other POWs who were with Kapaun credit him with saving potentially hundreds of lives before succumbing to his own wounds May 23, 1951.

Kapaun remained unaccounted for until March 2, when his remains were identified among the 867 remains buried as unknowns at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific in Hawaii.

Kapaun is currently being considered for the highest honor recognized in Catholicism; becoming a canonized saint. A preliminary evaluation of his sanctity, for canonization, was accepted by Pope John Paul II in 1994.

"There is no greater recommendation than being officially recognized as a saint of the Catholic Church," Kopec said.

Kapaun was awarded the Medal of Honor posthumously on April 13, 2013, by then President Barack Obama for his heroism.

The Defense Prisoner of War Missing in Action agency plans to return Kapaun's remains to Wichita, Kansas, Sept. 25.

"Chaplains have had an essential role in the history of the U.S. Army," Kopec said. "If I'm not spiritually strong, I'm going to fail because I'm going to break under pressure."

A team of 21 Soldiers from the 3rd Infantry Division who took part in a week-long simulation known as Quick Look VI returned from Fort Benning on July 16 to Fort Stewart. Sixteen of the 21 Dogface 3rd ID Soldiers are assigned to the 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team and the other five are assigned to the Division headquarters. From July 12-16, the Dogface team conducted simulations to determine the impact on the relative combat power of a motorized brigade combat team, or BCT, conducting cross-domain maneuver equipped with new electronic warfare technologies and other enablers against a nearpeer threat.

Additionally, the simulation served as a progressive iteration from previous simulations to identify employment considerations and divisional dependencies of a motorized BCT.

"The Quick Look VI exercise run by Fort Benning's Maneuver Battle Lab allowed our Dogface Soldiers to visualize the future of armed conflict and appreciate the true complexity of multi-domain operations," Maj. Alex Barron, top operations officer of the 2nd ABCT, 3rd ID said. "We tested concepts and future warfighting systems that will shape our future force and set conditions for the Army of 2035 to win our nation's wars. For our Soldiers, the opportunity to work with experts from the staff at 3rd ID headquarters opened our eyes to the conditions and capabilities of the space and cyber domains in a way that is difficult to see at the brigade echelon."

Specifically, Quick Look VI informed the integration of one of the Department of Defense's solutions to a contested digital environment, the Terrestrial Layer System, or TLS, with planned and future BCT capabilities provided to the battalion echelon affecting survivability and lethality as it pertains to the units' relative combat power. Also, the simulation gave insights on how the TLS integration with unit ground and aerial electronic warfare capabilities increased the BCT's ability to conduct cross-domain maneuver.

"The simulation was a great opportunity to contribute to the development and design of the future Army land force," Lt. Col. George Bolton Jr., commander of the 2nd Battalion, 69th Armored Regiment, 2nd ABCT, 3rd ID said. "Recognizing that conflicts in the future will require a certain level of expertise across all domains will help the Army visualize the capabilities that an armored BCT will have to have access to, or control over, in order to win in a cross-domain fight, which is essential to understand for success in future conflicts."

Furthermore, Quick Look VI provided insights on the integration and synergistic effects of additional enablers in cross-domain maneuver, such as close combat missile systems, long range precision mortars, and unmanned aerial systems.

"The Maneuver Battle Lab, Maneuver Capabilities Integration Directorate and the Maneuver Center of Excellence want to thank the 3rd ID at Fort Stewart for the excellent support provided to not only the Quick Look VI simulation but also the support provided to our experimentation over the last two years," Christopher Willis, the Maneuver Battle Lab Modeling and Simulations branch chief said. "The tactical knowledge and expertise provided by the operational force allows us to evaluate the cross-domain maneuver concept and required capabilities in a rigorous and realistic manner. We could not do our job and make the future Army better without partnerships like the one we have with the 3rd ID - Rock of the Marne!"
