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

BEHIND THE LENS

Community resolute: We will not forget

Community members gathered Sept. 21 at Marne Garden on Fort Stewart to remember our nation's Service Members who remain Prisoners of War or Missing in Action, during a ceremony hosted by the Vietnam Veterans of America, Chapter 789.

3rd Infantry Division Commander, Maj. Gen. Lee Quintas was the guest speaker at the event, who emphasized the importance of the occasion.

"Today, as we fly the familiar black and white flag across our nation, we understand that it is not only a symbol to honor all of our POWs and MIAs, it is a reminder of our sacred obligation, to all men and women in uniform, that we will never leave them behind; we will never forget," Quintas said. "This promise, so significant to us, is the seventh line of our Soldier's Creed; that all Soldiers learn from our very first day in the United States Army, 'I will never leave a fallen comrade.'"

Quintas said the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency, established follow-

ing WWII, estimates more than 82,000 Americans remain missing from all U.S. involved conflicts. Adding there remain 1,594 Americans unaccounted for from the Vietnam War. The 3rd ID itself has 554 MIA from World War II, and 272 unaccounted for from the Korean War.

"During these wars, and ever since, Families have endured the pain and agony of not knowing the status of their loved ones," Quintas said. "We, as a nation, must never forget those who have endured pain, deprivation and imprisonment while serving in the Armed Forces of the United States."

Quintas said, recently, the accounting agency announced two MIA Soldiers from the Korean Conflict were identified and returned -- Master Sgt. Charles McDaniel and Pfc. William Jones.



Since the end of the Vietnam War, more than 1,000 service members have been found and brought home.

"We will continue until the mission is complete; this is our solemn promise to our members of the Armed Forces, and as we've learned from our first days as a Soldier – We will never leave a fallen comrade," Quintas said.

For those who remain missing from Georgia, veterans from VVA Chapter 789, read the names of Service Members from across Georgia – calling for community members to keep them in their hearts and prayers.

“We are going out to support the American people in support of the Defense Support of Civil Authorities,” 1st Lt. Joshua McGrain, a platoon leader for Company C., 2nd Battalion, 3rd Aviation Regiment, 3rd CAB.

“We want to build relationships between the local communities and the United States military.”

After receiving the mission, the pilots huddled and made final adjustments to their plans before rolling out.

“I am very proud to be chosen to go on this mission,” said McGrain. “I am proud to go and help the people who were affected by this hurricane.”

Soldiers throughout the military are stationed all over the world, to include Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield.

The mission was close to home for some of the responders.

“I have family that resides in both parts of the Carolinas,” said McGrain. “My Family was affected, but I am glad that everyone is okay.”

Several expressed their opinion about this type of mission.

“This is my first time ever doing a mission like this,” said Spc. Adam J. Bauer-Vickers, a crew chief from Co. 2-3 Avn. “This mission is going to be cool, we are making a difference.”

3rd CAB supported the Army Response to Hurricane Florence efforts within 48 hours of notification. The 3rd CAB continues to train and remains ready to support when needed.

Signal Soldiers enlighten USMA cadets

The U.S. Military Academy's Department of Military Instruction hosted its Branch Week, Sept. 10-14, bringing several hundred tons of military equipment, vehicles and weapons for the academy's spin on a college career fair.

Soldiers from the 63rd Expeditionary Signal Battalion, 35th Theater Tactical Signal Brigade stationed at Fort Stewart, were in attendance to show cadets the Army's Signal Corps has the strategic function of establishing communication networks in remote areas.

While the tanks, helicopters and armored vehicles attracted crowds, the week-long event was an opportunity for the cadets to learn, after 16 years of warfare in the Middle East and with the constantly growing importance of electronics in the Army, the challenges facing this generation of cadets are different than any before.

Representing the Signal Corps were Soldiers from Co. A, 6rd ESB. They introduced hundreds of cadets to static displays with state-of-the-art communications equipment and explained how today's Army uses more than the gear cadets are currently using during training.

The Soldiers demonstrated rapid insertion Signal Corps capabilities, to include use of the satellite communications radios. The 35th TTSB Soldiers explained their communication capabilities, and how as Signal Soldiers within an expeditionary brigade can deploy world-class communications anytime, anywhere.

The role of communication during Hurricane Harvey was discussed. When in 2017 the storm struck Puerto Rico, knocking out electricity and communication systems, Army Signal Soldiers responded to help provide civilian first responders a real-time, accurate assessment of the physical condition of the city.

It was noted, in areas where without power, infrastructure or public amenities, satellite communications can provide an array of services such as telephones and email support.

One pillar of the U.S. Army's Signal Corps is to plan, build, operate, and defend the network that expands not only the U.S. Army's capability but Joint networks throughout the world that enable mission command for full spectrum operations that support U.S. joint, inter-agency, intergovernmental, and multinational activities, challenges, issues, and to keep up with the ever-changing future operating environment.

"We are excited about the future of our relationship. We are planning to begin programs at several other Army installations in the coming year."

During the Lights of Love ceremony, Families and loved ones will gather to place decorated paper lanterns on the field in remembrance of the fallen Soldiers.


"Anyone interested in honoring a fallen service member is invited to Cottrell Field to place a luminary bag in the light display," said Murphy.





I know I'm not alone when I say that I hope we never become apathetically cynical to the topic of suicide. We as a society and our armed forces hear almost daily of someone who has tragically taken their own life. It is an unfortunate form of conditioning that if we're not careful, we as a culture can become anesthetized and less zealous in our efforts to combat it. That's something we never want to happen!

I was 19 when my secret was fully revealed, a brand new private in the Army. How I remember that day vividly. The Army SHARP program has a slogan that says, "Break the silence, change the trajectory." Well that is exactly what I did. I told one person whom I trusted with my secret. From that day, I made a decision to no longer suffer in silence. I also made a decision that I was going into battle. I grew up in a military family and in an effort to help stabilize me educationally, my parents had me live with my grandparents who were teachers for the first few years of elementary school. Down the street were my other grandparents whom I visited often. I had a very special relationship with this grandfather - at least that is what I was told by him. On my visits and overnights I was repeatedly sexually abused, raped and exposed to sexually explicit material and acting out. He was a master at the art of grooming. I can remember the subtleness of it all starting back to kindergarten. I can remember him telling me not to tell anyone, that it was our little secret. Didn't think much of it at ages 5, 6 and 7, but around the age of 10 it all just stopped. He wasn't interested in me anymore. So I tried to be a normal kid and just buried that part of my life. Or at least I thought I did.

This type of trauma does a number on a person. Your mind does a re-hardwiring and goes into protection mode. My biological parents had no idea and gave me nothing but love and security and I could never thank them enough for their efforts. But the trauma kept me in a state of hiding and the once innocent young boy died a slow death. The false boy was born and began to live a life of shame, guilt, shallowness, deceit and fear. This young boy, now adolescent, learned to build a fortress around his life that was impenetrable by anyone, even himself. I became a professional chameleon blending in with all environments, my surroundings, the perfect people-pleaser. The damage had already been done and no amount of love at that stage was going to reverse the effects. I tried so hard to mask the external facade in an effort to cover the stench of death inside. I was very successful at times, but I have no doubt I left a wake of destruction in the lives of many. Failed relationships, feeble attempts at intimacy, the constant search for numbness were now a lifestyle. The cycle was

in full swing. Suicide seemed to always be a consideration. Although no attempts were ever made, the ideations were rampant. "Could there ever be any hope?" I would often wonder.

Healing the young catatonic boy inside started with giving him his first breath. That breath of life came when I had the courage to allow God and those who were walking in grace a chance. Honestly, it was the day my healing began, almost 19 years ago. The hardest step for me in recovery was admitting it ever happened and I was in need of rescuing. I was my own Savior, you see. I could only trust myself, at least I thought. I had manufactured an entire system of coping that worked for me. To venture out and embrace a different system was terrifying. When I was first taught the Christian teaching "to die daily and to pick up my cross," I was relieved... You see, in my mind, I was already dead and hated myself. For the past 19 years I have been learning to love myself appropriately and learning to allow others to love me. My friends that it is still difficult at times. God's Grace and love are constantly being revealed in new ways all the time!

For me it has been about the connections and the relationships that I have formed through the years. These are what ultimately saved my life. If we would risk relationships of vulnerable authenticity, eventually we will know a community where the worst of us could be known and we'd be loved more, not less in telling it. Unresolved issues begin to melt, historic wounding begins to lose its power. We begin to come under the influence of trusted others. And God pours wisdom, truth, insight and discernment into our very being as a gift. My challenge is that we would create a military community that is intentional about fostering environments where those who are silent can feel empowered to change their own trajectory. To come out of hiding through positive connections and relationships with others. C.A.R.S



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SAFETY SPOTLIGHT:**Watch where you park your vehicle**

I have seen this plenty of times at local shopping centers, there is an open disabled parking spot close to the entrance, it could be a clear day out or possible raining and a vehicle without the proper disabled plate or tag hanging in the vehicle pulls in the spot and runs into the store.

They may think I'm only getting some milk or something it won't take me long; but some times it takes longer. Some people might think this is not a safety issue, but it is to the person that is elderly using a walker. Now they may have to walk twice as far and could possibly be carrying an oxygen tank.

Using that parking space isn't only inconsiderate, it is against the law.

Parking for persons with disabilities 40-6-226 Offenses and penalties notes:

1) Any person violating subsection (c) or (c.1) of this code section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

(2) Any person violating subsection (a), (a.1), (b), (d), or (e) of this Code section shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$500.

In addition to the penalties provided for in subsection (f) of this code section, any vehicle which is illegally parked in a parking place for persons with disabilities which is marked by a sign bearing the words "Tow-Away Zone" as described in paragraph (3) of Code Section 40-6-221 on public or private property may be towed away or caused to be towed away by a proper law enforcement agency or the official security agency of said property at the expense of the owner of the vehicle or, if the vehicle is leased or rented, at the expense of the person responsible for payment on the lease or rental agreement. In accordance with Georgia code Title 40 – motor vehicle and traffic chapter 6.

So please don't park in disabled parking spots, look at it like this; what if the person this happens to is your grandparent or your parent.



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Cars used to raise suicide prevention awareness

The 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team and Fort Stewart embedded behavioral health specialists hosted the Second Annual CARS Against Suicide event at Fort Stewart, Ga., Sept. 21-22.

CARS stands for connections and relationships save. Medical professionals with the Spartan team, used the backdrop of a car show to engage participants in conversation about suicide prevention awareness.

"We wanted to drive home the point that there's help out there," said Cpt. Michael Brown, Brigade Nurse, 703rd Brigade Support Battalion, 2ABCT.

The two-day event began with guest speakers Lt. Col. Kenneth Dwyer, Hunter Army Airfield Garrison Commander, and Scott Rigsby, a double amputee and Ironman finisher.

The Fort Stewart USO hosted a car show with vendors and activities for Soldiers and their families during the second day of festivities.

Brown teamed up with Cpt. Jason Davis, the 3rd Battalion, 15th Infantry Regiment, 2ABCT Chaplain.

"What if we could connect those who might be struggling with those who've overcome similar struggles—Lt. Col. Dwyer. Scott Rigsby. These guys exemplify resiliency and no matter what you're going through, we have something to learn from them." Davis added, "If we find ourselves in a dark place, we need a vehicle to travel to a place of hope."

After losing both of his legs in a car accident, Scott Rigsby found himself in a dark place. Rigsby stated, "Maybe they all can look at me and say, 'You know what? Life is tough, but if this guy can make it, then I can make it.'"

Dwyer lost his left hand and eye in combat, while commanding a Special Forces Operational Detachment team.

"Leaders who are vulnerable to others give them an opening to break their own silence. If you need help seek help," Dwyer said.

The Spartan team plans to host another event next year to encourage suicide prevention awareness.
