Marne Week ends, Commanders Cup announced

Every year, the 3rd Infantry Division hosts a week-long sports competition called Marne Week to celebrate the division's birthday.

This year, the division celebrated the 100th anniversary of the Battle of the Marne – the historic World War I battle where the division adopted its moniker of “The Rock of the Marne.”

After extensive field training from July through November, Marne Week was a great opportunity for Soldiers to participate in friendly competition and earn points towards the Commander's Cup. Soldiers were able to see another side of who they work with during competitions that help build esprit de corps.

“Marne Week was fun, I participated in more than one event,” said Staff Sgt. Mark Trejo, the Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Special Troops Battalion, 3rd

ID Sustainment Brigade provost marshal noncommissioned officer in charge. “It was competitive and built camaraderie, it was a great event. I wish we did it more, the competitiveness can't be described.”

Teams from across Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield competed in combatives, softball, volleyball, functional fitness events, and much more.

“I enjoyed Marne Week, there was a lot of participation and excitement,” said Spc. Dominique Goldsborough, an intelligence analyst with HHC, STB, 3rd Inf. Div. Sust. Bde. “It was a great honor to represent my unit and perform one of my favorite activities, combatives.”

There were also family-oriented events, such as Family kickball, family day and a tree lighting ceremony. Families support our Soldiers and Marne Week was a fun way to incorporate spouses and children as well as transition into the holiday season.

Many events were centered on team play and arduous physical tasks. For example, the Marne Mudder includ-

ed challenges like climbing over walls, crawling face-first through muddy water, fireman carrying teammates and pushing a truck. There was also a functional fitness event that featured the new Army Combat Fitness Test, functional fitness circuits, and a swim relay.

“Functional fitness hurt a lot, I found things that I was strong in and things I needed to improve in,” said Trejo. “We need to put a lot of those exercises in our physical training program to prepare for the ACFT because if Soldiers aren't prepared for it they're going to get hurt.”

With readiness continuously at the tip of the Army's spear, having events that tested Soldiers' physical prowess and mental agility was an important part of Marne Week events.

3rd ID senior enlisted advisor bids farewell

Dogface Soldiers assigned to 3rd Infantry Division "Marne Division" bid farewell to the division senior enlisted advisor Dec. 11.

Small elements of each brigade under the 3rd ID formed up by brigades in Club Stewart to begin the ceremony, where Command Sgt. Maj. Daniel T. Hendrex relinquished his responsibility as the Marne Division's command sergeant major.

During the opening comments Maj. Gen. Leopoldo Quintas Jr., commanding general of 3rd ID, stated that his time with Hendrex flew by.

"It is hard for me to believe we're saying farewell to the Hendrex Family," said Quintas. "I don't know if 18-months has ever passed so quickly. I attribute it to the many significant accomplishments that have occurred across the Marne Division."

In July 2017, Hendrex took responsibility of the division and within a month after taking over, the division was deployed for nine months to Bagram, Afghanistan, where he greatly impacted the way the Marne Division operated.

"Hendrex's knowledge of the environment [in Afghanistan], the mission, and especially the people, allowed us to rapidly assume our new responsibilities at Bagram," Quintas said. "Hendrex, a tireless advocate for Soldiers and noncommissioned officers, achieved one of the most important accomplishments for the division - really the Army. He stood up the Basic Leaders Course at Bagram, so that Soldiers can continue their formal professional development and get promoted in a timely manner, even while deployed."

The division redeployed in spring of 2018, and Hendrex con-

tinued to reshape and organize key programs to enable and provide the Dogface Soldiers and leaders with personal and physical readiness.

"With physical readiness as a lead component, Hendrex took on some of the toughest issues like, reconditioning physical readiness training," Quintas said.

Towards the end of the ceremony, Hendrex looked back at several key area that inspired him the most.

Family, history, the Marne Express, Sergeant Audie Murphy Club, and Medal of Honor recipients were a few of the most inspirational areas that impacted Hendrex.

"The history of the division is unlike any other. I didn't understand it as a young sergeant, but I will tell you that I did when I came back," Hendrex said. "It wasn't until we had the opportunity to go to France for our 100-year history and we walked the ground of Greives Farm where our first Medal of Honor recipient served his heroic actions."

During Hendrex closing remarks he spoke about the sacrifices his family has made over the years.

"To my children sitting next to my wife, the military will always create friction as you try to be a Soldier, complete a mission and do the best you can do and with that time becomes a problem," Hendrex said. "Since we have been here, the community and the outreach has been fantastic, not only to myself, but our Family. It is truly going to be hard for us to say good-bye and with that we will. I will always be a Dogface Soldier no matter where I go."

Hendrex stated that being here on Fort Stewart/Hunter Army Airfield has been the time of his military career.

Hendrex will assume responsibility of the III Corps at Fort Hood, Texas, later this winter.

Be advised this spill is not considered a major spill and does not impact your drinking water. An estimated 3,600 gallons of sewage flowed into a nearby stormwater collection system before discharging into Taylors Creek.

This spill was caused by a malfunction in the pump motors. Installation personnel responded immediately, correcting the problem, averting further spillage and minimizing the impact to the environment.

Cadets revel in rivalry, Army wins

PHILADELPHIA -- Despite being his fourth time seeing it, the annual Army-Navy game did not lose any significance for Cadet Jack Ray Kesti as he cheered from the stands in the frigid temperatures.

The rivalry has become an annual tradition in the Kesti household. Kesti, who hails from nearby Phoenixville, Pennsylvania, had his parents and girlfriend cheering for the Black Knights from the stands, too. Kesti's younger brother Sam, a freshman, also attends the U.S. Military Academy and was at the game.

"Seeing people in your class and seeing them do well on the football field is a really cool feeling," Kesti said.

Cadet Hope Moseley, a freshman, attended her first game, in which the Black Knights upended Navy 17-10 and held off a late Midshipmen surge Saturday night. It was the No. 22 Black Knights' third straight win over their rival.

Army improved to 10-2 and will play Houston in the Armed Forces Bowl Dec. 22. If Army gets 11 wins this year, it will be its best season since 1958 when it went undefeated with one tie and finished No. 3 in the country.

Moseley said the buildup to the contest had been mounting all week. Cadets hung banners in the student barracks, played flag football games and burned a boat in anticipation of Saturday's game.

"It's a great experience of tradition," said Moseley, a native of Belton, Texas. "Even though it's a rivalry, it shows how strong our bond is to our country."

Moseley said she was inspired to apply to the academy by her cousin, Maj. Andrea Baker, a West Point graduate stationed in San Diego.

President Donald Trump officiated the coin toss and also briefly visited the sidelines of both teams. During the first half, Gen. James McConville, the Army's vice chief of staff, enlisted 21 Army recruits in a special ceremony. McConville, who graduated in West Point's Class of 1981, said he has attended "quite a few" Army-Navy rivalry games during his career, and said the contest's significance cannot be overstated.

"It's America's game," McConville said. "Why it's special is because of the extraordinary young men and women who represent the best of America and they are here today."

Sporting black and red uniforms in honor of the 1st Infantry Division and its efforts during World War I, Army stormed to a 10-0 lead. After turnovers by both teams, Navy scored on a late drive midway in the fourth quarter to cut the deficit to 10-7. Army junior quarterback Kelvin Hopkins then scored on a

1-yard sneak for the go-ahead score with 1:28 left in the game.

Cadet Jay Demmy, a sophomore center on the Army rugby team, said the friendships he has formed with fellow athletes on the Black Knights football team makes the contest even more meaningful.

"There's so much history behind this game and so much passion that to me, it's awesome to be a part of it," said Demmy, who hopes to join the infantry after graduation. "Playing a sport here... rugby, coming to the football games and seeing all the guys I know -- all the brothers I'm going to be fighting with in the near future on the field and off the field is nice."

The game takes on a larger significance, making the contest meaningful for so many nationwide, Demmy said.

Many cadets have friends attending the U.S. Naval Academy. Kesti attended high school with Midshipman Joe Ellis and the two engaged in friendly trash talking and texting each other during the game. The annual prisoner exchange, in which students from both service academies attend a semester on the opposite campuses, further extends the bond between the two schools.

"I think [the game] is about camaraderie and coming together," Moseley said, "and knowing that even though you can have a friendly competition, in the end, we're all fighting the same fight for the people of America."

Sgt. Maj. of the Army Daniel A. Dailey, clad in his Army Greens uniform, said that all Soldiers can

embrace the history and pageantry of the game, which was attended by celebrities such as actor Mark Wahlberg and former Dallas Cowboys great and Navy graduate Roger Staubach.

"This is a long-standing history of rivalry between two of the finest schools in America," Dailey said. "When we're on the battlefield, we're all friends. But one day out of the year we come together for good camaraderie, good fun, but it is a true test of will for us and the Navy."

"This is the quintessential American football game right here, Army-Navy. It doesn't get better than this."

After the game, Army junior running back Rashaad Bolton proposed to his girlfriend on the field. Although Navy has struggled to a 3-10 record this season, Bolton said the Midshipmen were still a formidable foe.

"Navy's a well-coached team," Bolton said. "We just fought. Our coaches did a great job preparing us these three weeks."

Army coach Jeff Monken, who improved to 43-30 during his five seasons at Army, has credited the West Point student section with providing a much-needed boost to the players. There has been a resurgence of the Army football team, which has gone 20-5 since ending Navy's 14-game winning streak in 2016.

"When the football team's playing well I feel like it brings our school together more, because you get that unity and you get fired up," Demmy said. "Coach Monken preaches that we're the 12th man on the field. Having that good student section, having that uproar brings fire to the people on the field."

Safety Spotlight: Warning to online holiday shoppers

Special to the Frontline

As increasing number of consumers do the majority of their holiday shopping online and swindlers have taken notice and devised a wide range of schemes to capitalize on the relative anonymity of cyber space. The CCIU and FTC offer tips to help thwart online crooks:

Check out the seller: If you have not used a particular online shopping site, do some independent research. Call their phone number to verify that you can reach

them if issues come up with your purchase. If they don't have a phone number, you should take your business elsewhere. Also, search the Internet to see if anyone else has experience with the site.

Read return policies: Make sure the online shopping site has policies that meet your needs and expectations. Some sites charge shipping and handling for returns, as well as a restocking fee.

Know what you're getting: Read the product description closely. If name-brand items are sold at an extremely low

price, they could be counterfeit or stolen. Remember the old adage: "If it's too good to be true, it probably is."

Don't fall for a false e-mail or pop-up: Legitimate companies do not send unsolicited e-mail messages asking for your password, login name, or financial information, but scammers do. Delete these e-mails without clicking on any links.

Look for signs a site is safe: When you are ready to buy something from a seller you trust, look for signs that the site uses a secure connection - such as a closed

padlock on the browser's status bar - before you enter your personal and financial information. When you are asked to provide payment information, the beginning of the Web site's URL address should change from http to http or https, indicating that the purchase is encrypted or secured.

Secure your home computer: At a minimum, your computer should have anti-virus and anti-spyware software and a firewall. Visit the FTC's OnGuard Online site at <http://onguardonline.gov>.




