The 2018 Housing the Force conference was hosted by U.S. Army Garrison Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield, Aug. 27 to Aug. 30 at Fort Stewart, Georgia.

The annual conference allows senior leadership and representatives of U.S. Army Installation Management Command to discuss ways of improving the housing needs of service members and their Families.

Approximately 330 housing officials from across the Department of Defense and privatized housing at military installations worldwide were in attendance to share best practices, learn new policies, and engage with peers and counterparts from other installations.

Personnel from the Office of the Assistant Chief of Staff for Installation Management Army Housing Division, Residential Communities Initiative, and Privatized Army Lodging were also in attendance.

During the conference, general sessions were held to discuss major topics, to include fiscal changes and policy.

This year's theme was "100 Years of Excellence, A Legacy of Service," said Chris Curry, Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield housing chief.

Truck company keeps 3ID moving

The 396th Composite Truck Company, 87th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division Sustainment Brigade, supports the entire division in a variety of transportation operations. They are one of few companies on Fort Stewart with the capabilities to move heavy, up-armored equipment. They keep the division ready to tackle any mission by being their transportation support.

"The company's mission is to support

the transport of troops, up-armored vehicles or equipment," said Pfc. Ashley Braze, a motor transport operator with the 396th CTC.

The Soldiers in Braze's squad use Heavy Equipment Transport Systems to move large vehicles such as tanks, Bradley Fighting Systems or cranes, wherever they are needed.

"My squad's mission is to support the whole division when it comes to up-armored vehicles and any other vehicle that needs to be transported on a bigger trailer," she said.

"We can transport tanks into the field

and if there are vehicles that go down we can pull them out and bring them back to the motor pool," said Spc. Cody Meredith, a motor transport operator with the 396th CTC. "If anyone needs ammunition, food or C-wire, we can transport that out there for them too."

The company participates in exercises when the unit goes to the Joint Readiness Training Center at Fort Polk, Louisiana or the National Training Center in Fort Irwin, California. The also assist the National Guard to enable them to complete their mission.

"We'll go out to the field when we're

transporting troops especially when we're supporting the National Guard. We'll transport them to the field and back as well as the stuff they need," said Braze. "We're always going to NTC or JRTC rotations, helping out the brigade or other companies in our division."

No matter what mission comes the company's way, they ensure that they are always ready to fight tonight.

"We look over our trucks every week and make sure they are good to go," Meredith said. "We dispatch two vehicles per squad so if anything comes down last minute we have vehicles ready."

CAMP HOVEY, SOUTH KOREA. Soldiers from the 10th Brigade engineer Battalion, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, recently opened the Sapper Lounge at Camp Hovey, South Korea, to help improve Soldier morale by providing more options when finding ways to spend their free time.

"Camp Casey is a long bus ride or taxi and there needed to be options that didn't include the 'Ville or being isolated in your room," said Capt. Michael Cohen, the 10th BEB Chaplain. "The Lounge will give the Soldiers something that they can be happy about and go to and spend time at."

The Sapper Lounge was a project that was started before Cohen arrived at the battalion. The idea gained support from both the battalion and brigade command teams.

"The Sapper Lounge's purpose is quite simple," said Lt. Col. Scott Swilley, commander, 10th BEB. "The Lounge aims to provide an opportunity to the Soldiers within the footprint easy access to be able to relax and enjoy themselves."

The Sapper Lounge has a large community room that has a projection TV with surround sound. There

is a video game room that offers both XBOX One and PS4 consoles and the adjacent room offers guitars for the Soldiers to play. The lounge also has a room with a dart board, putting surface, and board games to play with a group of friends. Finally, there is a full kitchen available that is stocked with snacks, and day-to-day essentials for Soldiers to stock up on things like toiletries.

Even though the Sapper Lounge has just been opened there are already plans for expansion. One plan in the works is to add a permanent grill for soldiers to use. Other plans include a pool table and shuffle board area.

There may be other improvements down the road, but the Sapper Lounge is already off to a phenomenal start compared to what the building was just a few weeks ago said Cohen.

"As we leave and the other unit comes in we can keep adding to [the Lounge]," said Cohen. "I don't think it's going to be done until the last person leaves."

Swilley said that Cohen, a Soldier named Spc. Herrin, and Staff Sgt. Alex Miller were the "inspiration and the driving force behind allowing this great facility to be created."

Cohen also wanted to give a special thanks to USO2GO Kit that was funded in part by the donations

made by the National Football League and many other organizations.

The Sapper Lounge is located in building S-3408 on Camp Hovey, next to the softball fields and gym. The current hours of operation are from 4-11 p.m. on duty days and from 10 a.m. to 2 a.m. on the weekends.

SAFETY SPOTLIGHT:

Power-tool safety

Many people men and woman alike have power tools in their home or garage.

They use them to save money by doing certain projects around their home themselves, such as hanging picture's, mounting televisions to the wall, fixing broken furniture or putting up shelfs.

When using power tools always read and follow the manufactures direction, before using power tools. You should also use the correct personal protective equipment for the job. When using a circular saw you should wear goggles, face dust mask and hearing protection.

Always check and inspected your PPE prior to using. It may not help if your goggles do not fit properly or the lens is scratched or discoloration.

Always inspect the electrical cord to ensure there are no cuts or bare wires showing. It is best to use tools that are double insulated of have three pronged cord and are plugged into a grounded outlet.

Some other safety tips:

- Never carry the equipment by the cord and always use the plug to disconnect it from the wall not the cord.
- Keep a clean work area to include the floor to avoid slips/trips and falls.
- Avoid wearing loose clothing that could be caught by the power tool.
- When possible secure your work with a clamp or vise to keep it from moving.
- Use the right tool for the job, a flat • head screwdriver is not a chisel.

The above is just a few of the many safety tips for using power tool, you can go on line and look up safety tips for the equipment you are using. By taking the time to find safety tips you could be keeping yourself injury free and not lose a finger or your sight.

Many people in the community cannot recognize the warning signs of domestic violence or child abuse and come to normalize the situation as an aspect of their relationship. This can make reporting difficult and sometimes near impossible due to how ingrained it can be in some relationships.

Yadira Shields Family Advocacy program specialist, encourages all members of the Army Family to be knowledgeable and have the resources to report any instance of known or suspect-

ed instance of domestic violence, child abuse or sexual assault.

hields has not only been working with Army Community Services for over six years but also has more than 12 years of experience working with victim advocacy and military family programs.

Shields is the person you would want to assist you in a turbulent period. She can be light-hearted but maintains a professional manner that exudes knowledge and expertise.

When navigation something like child abuse or domestic violence, the situation can seem more than helpless. Not only can it feel like a situation where nearly everyone is against you, it can be difficult to find support and structure that brings glimmers of hope into times of hopelessness. Found in building 82, Shields will not only direct you to the proper resources, but she will provide you with a calmness and knowledge that you are not alone and someone will give you the support that you need.

Awareness is vital to recognizing and preventing child abuse, domestic violence and sexual abuse. Speaking out against a spouse, parent or member of the community regarding child abuse and domestic violence can be difficult but can also encourage others to come forward, according to Shields. Shields conducts training and education classes across Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield, providing essential information recognizing signs and ways to report domestic violence or child abuse.

Suspected or known child abuse or neglect, please call 911 or it can be reported to 767-0025 and dial "2" when prompted, this will direct you to the military police desk.

3-15 Inf. spouses embrace the Soldier experience

Spouses from 3rd Battalion, 15th Regiment, 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, competed against one another in a motivational, physical training competition that exposed them firsthand to what their service members experience on a daily basis.

"It's good to get all the wives together," said Megan Sulwer. "I've never got to see where my husband worked, so it was nice to see that."

The Spouse Dragon Ride included a battalion history class, 1-mile run and a gear run. The gear run consist of spouses wearing a kevlar helmet, gloves, eye protection, and plate carrier while running a half mile. Immediately after completing the run, spouses continued their dragon ride against the clock on row machines, with 10 minutes to row one thousand meters. Finally, each person dragged a weighted Sked Basic Rescue System one hundred meters, down and back to the starting point.

"It was good. We pushed our limits and never gave up," Amaryllis Phillips said. "It was very challenging."

The Spouse Dragon Ride helps families bond while breaking a serious sweat during the summer at Fort Stewart. Families grow stronger by working together to get through each event.

Spouses wrapped up their day with classes on how to fit and wear gear as their Soldiers do, then mounted the same vehicles their Soldiers maintain.

New Pathfinder program assists transitioning military at Fort Stewart-Hunter AAF

"We're trying to create a collaboration between transitioning members of the military and the community," United Service Organizations director Regina Wages said at the USO's first Lunch and Learn on Aug. 21.

The lunch highlighted the new USO Pathfinder program, a program that advocates for transitioning service members. It helps ease members back into civilian life by providing vital resources to simplify the process.

Held at the new Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield USO center, the lunch brought local companies such as Gulfstream, WorkSource Georgia, and DOT Transportation, Inc. to speak about opportunities offered outside of the military for those transitioning. Pathfinder officially launched in May 2018.

"The program is designed to take the complexity and stress out of the service members' transitions," Wages said. "They have to adapt to the civilian world again, and they have to learn how to speak civil language."

Wages served for seven years overseas at Jalalabad Airfield, commonly referred to as Forward Operating Base Fenty as the USO director in support of Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Resolute Support (2009-2016).

Wages built the USO at OB Fenty in 2010 and provided morale support and supplies to all FOBs and outpost-Train Advise Assist Command East in Northern Afghanistan, she said. Back on Fort Stewart, she knew that a USO facility could benefit many in both Georgia and South Carolina.

USO Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield opened in February 2018, Wages said. Since opening, they have served 119 service members, veterans and spouses with clients in South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Florida and Puerto Rico, she continued.

"We support any and all installations in need of USO support in southeast Georgia — covering USO needs at Parris Island, all the way to Brunswick," Wages said. "The Pathfinder Transition program covers Georgia and South Carolina."

Sgt. 1st Class Mike Holguin, who's served for 20 years, is close to retirement

and is currently in the Pathfinder program. He said it offers a way for soldiers to re-learn the civilian lingo and habits without having to figure it out by themselves once they're out of the service.

"Being in the military is a full-time mindset that is hard to let go of when you have finished serving your time," Holguin said.

Holguin is on his second tour with the 3rd Infantry Division here in the Hinesville/Savannah area. The Pathfinder program, he said, has opened his eyes to several employment opportunities that allow him to maintain his current lifestyle. "There's a lot of potential here if everyone puts in a little time and research," he continued. "The program has helped us develop our resumes into a product to give employers, provided extensive lists of contacts and helped sort through jobs based on interest," he said.

"The staff members have gotten to know me on a personal level and remain in constant contact providing updates and possible job opportunities," he said. "My advisor has assured me that he will do his best to help me find a comfortable job, either local or abroad, and will remain with me until I do so, and for that, I can't be more thankful."

Holguin's wife volunteers with the USO, so he's been with the program since the beginning, he said. When asked if he encourages others in the transition process to utilize the Pathfinder program, it was a resounding yes.

"I have been and will continue to push this out to every soldier I come into contact with," Holguin said. "If nothing else, this is a great opportunity to establish that solid resume that everyone needs once you start transitioning back to civilian life."

The USO's Pathfinder program has partnered with companies in and around the area that hire veterans, in order to provide a starting point to those leaving the service.

David Purdom, the military outreach and recruiting analyst with Gulfstream Aerospace in Pooler, said that Gulfstream takes an active approach when reaching out and hiring service members.

"We know that all service members are exiting the military with a strong sense of leadership skills and our efforts usually go specifically to their previous experience and how that translates into the culture and workforce of our company," Purdom said.

Representatives from Gulfstream travel all over the country to different job and career fairs speaking to veterans on and off installations, he said. They also visit several Transition Assistance Program classes to speak with them about resume writing and interview skills, Purdom continued.

Gulfstream's current yearly hiring ratio consistently stays around 18 percent of veterans yearly, Purdom said. Right now, there is a 26 percent veteran workforce population. Partnering with the USO to help veterans seemed natural, and Gulfstream is currently in the process of creating a full partnership within the new Pathfinder program, he said.

Megan Earle, Program Manager for WorkSource Georgia, spoke about some of the services they offer veterans, including resume building and tuition assistance.

"We assist with basic skills, like resumes and interviews," Earle said. "All services are free, but our most popular service is we can help pay for college tuition." Specifically, they will cover part of an associate or bachelor's degree, as long as all pre-requisites have been previously completed, she said. Short-term certifications are normally covered, she continued.

"It has to be something that's in demand in this area," Earle said. "Something that we know someone's going to leave our program and gain employment really quickly and easily."

Or, they can assist with other costs associated with earning degrees — like books, supplies, uniforms and graduation applications.

"We don't want them to face barriers," she said. "We want them to go to school and get that degree and enter the workforce."

There is also a youth program, which assists 16-24 year olds, Earle said. WorkSource Georgia also offers on the job training and experience, Earle said, because school isn't for everyone.

There are currently two Pathfinder scouts located at Stewart-Hunter USO, Tammy Duke and AJ Veal, who can be contacted about the Pathfinder program,

"We've seen the whole gamut of housing, and now as a senior commander, I am responsible for that," Quintas said.

"If there is a home for my Family and me, it is Fort Stewart," Quintas said. "We are very proud of this place."

Quintas has served in the Marne Division three separate times and has spent most of his Army career in Fort Stewart. He said there are three categories of Army housing: historical housing, housing built in the 1970's and new 21st-century housing. "My primary concern is this discrepancy between the housing built in the 1970s and the housing built this century," Quintas said.

The discrepancies are in the square footage of housing; the condition of the quarters; and in the heating and cooling accommodations, he said.

"The bottom line is that 3rd ID Soldiers are proud of their service," Quintas said. "We want them to be equally proud of the housing that they live in."

Elements are spread throughout the battlefield and it is up to the S6 communications section to maintain the flow of information. Through technical and tactical proficiency, these Soldiers keep the 3rd Infantry Division Sustainment Brigade online and informed.

During the last week of August, units in the 3rd ID participated in the second command post exercise. This exercise is one of three to prepare the units for the Warfighter exercise taking place at the end of the year.

The brigade's objective for CPX II was to provide fire support, information management and analysis, and to practice moving mission command.

Communications Soldiers in Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Special Troops Battalion, 3rd IDSB, worked 24 hours a day to provide the brigade with communication services.

terms of FM radio, tactical site radio and Joint Capabilities Release Blue Force Tracker to the tactical operations center and the [brigade] commander so that he can have situational awareness of what division [headquarters] and the rest of the brigades are doing," said 1st Lt. Garrett Warren, the officer in charge of command and control and current operations for HHC, STB, 3rd IDSB.

Not only does the section provide lower tactical internet, or basic communication tools, they also provide higher level security services that elevate communication in a field environment. Leaders are also able to use chatrooms provided by S6 to effectively communicate to other command groups in the division.

"We are also providing upper tactical internet in terms of Command Post of the Future, Transverse and Ventrilo chatrooms so that the other units can combine information in regards to sustainment and logistics so that we are all on the same page as a division."

Along with providing these services to the

brigade, the communications personnel also had to assist with user issues with accessing the sites, maintaining portal capabilities and keeping the lines of communication open. There were learning opportunities for these Soldiers to work with equipment they would have to use in future exercises.

"This is my third time in the field as network operations and so far it's been a good experience," said Sgt. Chris Sturtevant, an information technology specialist with HHC, STB, 3rd IDSB. "I've gotten more hands-on experience with the equipment and I will walk away with more knowledge than I had [before] we came out here."

All of these lessons learned during CPXII will improve the communications section going into CPXIII and Warfighter where they will be training to rapidly deploy and engage with enemies while maintaining combat power. The S6 will be able to provide more services for the brigade to keep the Providers ready to fight.

The job of maintaining network connection for the exercise was the responsibility of Yourgal and his Soldiers.

"My main task during CPX II has been to monitor the network to ensure phone and data connections for the exercise is operational," Yourgal said. "Without us, they can't call or even work, every phone and computer is connected through us."

As the field exercise progressed the job of the Nadal Network section became increasingly more important. "We had a lot of issue with power early on in the exercise," Pvt. Jacob E. Manley, Nadal Network Operator, DHHB, 3rd ID said. At one point it got really chaotic because we had generator issues. We started the exercise depending on another section for power and the generator kept going down. When we have no power, no one can work. It was important to draw power with our own generator to maintain connection."

"We've been treating quite a few Soldiers for heat injuries, allergies, rashes and assisting with preventative medicine by handing out hand sanitizer," Oliver said. "The weather has been hot and humid and one of the main injuries we have treated has been heat injuries. Most of the Soldiers that been heat casualties have been new to the unit and not acclimatized to the weather just yet. It takes 72 hours to hydrate the body. Drinking coffee, smoking and alcohol consumption contributes to heat injuries. The body is starting the day at a disadvantage and it's harder to hydrate while consuming products that dehydrate you."
