It is referred to as East Gate, it is open 5 a.m. to 9 p.m. (closed weekends, training and federal holidays). Gate 4 is the 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team entrance near the Shoppette on Highway 144. It is open 24 hours a day, 7 days/week. Gate 4A is closed but is located on Austin road. Gate 4C is the other 2ABCT gate. It is open 5 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. and is closed weekends, training and federal holidays. Gate 5 is the back gate or north gate. It is located past the golf course. It is open 24 hours/day, 7 days/week Gate 7, called the west gate, is located on West 15th St. and 6th St. It is open 5 a.m. to 9 p.m. And is closed weekends, training and federal holidays. Gate 7C is the commercial gate. It is located on West 15th St. it is open 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. and is closed weekends, training and federal holidays. Gate 8 is located on Veterans Parkway, it comes out near Ranger Joes. It is open 5 a.m. to 9 p.m. and is closed weekends, training and federal holidays. Gate 9 is near Wright Army Airfield. Stewart-Hunter recovers from shutdown

Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield is operational again following the government shutdown of services, Jan. 20-22, as it ceased operations to comply with the legal and regulatory requirements of operating in the absence of appropriations.

Because military personnel,

non-appropriated fund employees, and some appropriated fund employees were exempt, the Army was able to continue to provide for the nation's defense despite the reduced contributions of its civilian workforce. The 3rd Infantry Division retained its ability to deploy Soldiers in support of worldwide missions.

The 1st Armored Brigade will

continue deployment preparation activities as scheduled.

One of the most notable impacts was the reduced visitor access to the installation, which has resumed functions. Another was the postponement of the installation's two-day Hiring Heroes Transition Summit at Club Stewart. The new dates are to be determined.

Fair prepares Soldiers, Families for deployment

The recently announced deployment to the Republic of Korea for the 1st Armor Brigade Combat Team is quickly approaching and the "Raider Brigade" is finishing final preparations before boarding planes.

Soldiers and Family members, especially those new to the Army, have many questions about the deployment. To help Raider Soldiers and Families prepare, the brigade held a week long deployment fair for Soldiers and Families to get the answer they need from different organizations.

The brigade coordinated with over 15 organizations such as Red Cross, Army Community Service, Directorate of Plans Training Mobilization and Security, Directorate of Emergency Services, Directorate of Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation (DFMWR) to help answer any questions.

A representative for ACS, Chester Bradley asked the Soldiers and Families in attendance how they prepare for upcoming deployments. Some Soldiers and Families had answers from past experiences and for others this is their first Army deployment.

"I can help you prepare for a deployment," said Bradley. "When getting ready for a deployment, make sure you have a family care plan, a power of attorney and communicate with family members throughout the deployment."

There was more information given out to help with communication at the fair, and attendees received booklets on how to keep their relationships strong, finances in order, and families and friends informed during the nine months Raider

Brigade Soldiers will be gone. The fairs were not just for married Soldiers and Families but for everyone across the formation.

"This deployment fair was a great opportunity for single Soldiers because they received information to give to their families who could not make it to the fair," said Staff Sgt. Raymond Irizarry, the 1ABCT Family Readiness Liaison. "It was also important for young couples deploying for the first time to be informed about the different agencies that are available to them for any situation to assist them."

In addition to general information, all attendees had the opportunity to speak one-on-one with agency representatives. This gave single Soldiers and married Soldiers a chance to address individual situations and share valuable information to dependents.

In closing, Bradley said that the services are here for the Soldiers and Family members and they can reach out to ACS and the other organizations for any information.

Marne Tax centers open

Designed to help Soldiers, retirees and eligible Family members save money in legal fees, the 2018 Marne Tax center conducted grand openings at their two locations on Fort Stewart and Hunter Army

The Fort Stewart Garrison Command Sgt. Maj. Martin M. Conroy was on-hand to help with the ribbon cutting at the Stewart opening and expressed his appreciation for the service it offered.

"This is another example of the Garrison and Soldiers from across the installation coming together to provide a great service to community members," Conroy said. "This type partnership really makes a difference; especially during deployments."

Stanley Robinson, a retiree, was the first customer at the Stewart tax center.

"It is a good benefit," Robinson said explaining why he comes back every year to the center. "And it's free."

Lt. Col Ken Dwyer, Hunter Army Airfield garrison commander; and Capt. Michael Yosua, the officer in charge at both Fort Stewart-Hunter Tax Centers; and Staff Sgt. James Perring, NCOIC, Hunter Tax Center, cut the ribbon of the Hunter Center, Jan. 23.

"In 2017, the Hunter Tax Center

processed over \$8 million worth of tax refunds and saved Soldiers and Families \$800,000 in tax preparation fees," Dwyer said. "Our Soldiers perform a service for our country. There is no greater feeling than taking care of them (with free tax filing assistance)."

Yosua said the center couldn't provide the service without the support of the Garrison, DIVARTY and other 3rd Infantry Division units. He said the center was completely manned by Soldiers trained in tax preparation.

The Stewart Tax Center non-commissioned officer in charge, Staff Sgt. Evonne Jones said working at the center was a fun filled adventure, and looked forward to the 2018 year.

The Fort Stewart Tax Center, located at 2233 Gulick Ave., building 816, and can be reached at 912-767-1040. The Marne Tax Center hours are Monday, Wednesday, 10 a.m. to 6:15 p.m., Thursday, 1-6:15 p.m. and Friday, 10 a.m. to 6:15 p.m.

- Educator Expenses
- Account and routing number for direct deposit/debit (cancelled check)



Spc. Bella Brown, a petroleum supply specialist with 135th Quartermaster Company, 87th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division Sustainment Brigade, recently completed the Marne Leader Development Course and was recognized as the distinguished honor graduate.

MLDC is a three-week course similar to the Basic Leader's Course. It enhances the basics of soldiering skills for specialists and young sergeants in areas such as battle drills, maintenance, nutrition and, most importantly, leadership.

During the course, her motivation to excel allowed her to gain confidence in several aspects including first aid, battle drills, leadership and personal poise.

"If I can be a role model to another person, that's better than the accomplishment," she said.

Brown said she learned the most from the field training exercise when she was in charge of navigating her team while carrying equipment through rough terrain with low visibility.

"Even though everything was hard, I didn't show it. I didn't want to seem weak."

Brown joined the Army two years ago and is working hard to become a Noncommissioned Officer. She will be attending the promotion board next month and BLC soon after.


"I serve to do something that others wouldn't dare to. I wanted to make my family proud and prove to myself that I can be a better person than what I was when I came in."

Train, Advise, Assist, Sustain 3ID RSSB MISSION IN KABUL

BAGRAM AIRFIELD, Afghanistan - The sprawling city of Kabul, Afghanistan curves up the Hindu Kush mountains, surrounding the Hamid Karzai International Airport (HKIA) where countless U.S. Soldiers, coalition forces, civilians and contractors work to support ongoing operations in the country. Amid the locals, fruit stands, and donkey-driven carts, a team of 3rd Infantry Division Resolute Support Sustainment Brigade Soldiers go out into the city to tackle their train, advise and assist mission. These Soldiers are invaluable in enabling a capable, credible and sustainable force for the long-term defense of Afghanistan.

Seven Soldiers make up the TAA team

for HKIA. They constantly conduct missions outside the wire to advise the Afghan National Army Soldiers on various logistics elements including supply, water purification, transportation and maintenance. They recently went to the new location of the ANA's Central Workshop (CWS) to tour the facility.

"The CWS is where all ANA vehicles, weapons and equipment go for repairs," said Sgt. Nikita "Ivan" Ivannikov, a water treatment specialist with the Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Special Troops Battalion, 3rd Inf. Div. RSSB. "It has better living conditions, brand new facilities and larger workshops and equipment."

Ivan also goes out to New Kabul Compound to advise the National Engineer Brigade on how to use water treatment equipment. Every member of

the TAA team has a certain military occupational speciality and will advise the Afghan Soldiers utilizing their knowledge.

"I advise the water purification platoon and taught them about cleaning water buffaloes," said Ivan. "We established equipment and showed them how to use it, so when they go out they can support their troops with clean water."

Since the RSSB Soldiers arrived in theater in October, they have worked to establish relationships and build trust between themselves and the ANA Soldiers. Every deployment rotation introduces new troops into the TAA mission, and these Soldiers were no different. They had to learn their job quickly to ensure they could fully support the ANA.

"They had to learn, on the fly, their

roles and what they had to do," said Sgt. 1st Class Benjamin Moody, the non-commissioned officer in charge of the TAA team with the 3rd Inf. Div. RSSB. "They are operating at a level way above what they're used to and they've adjusted well to the scenario."

The TAA team is a small piece of the Resolute Support puzzle, said Moody. They are an important part of the strategic piece that influences the Combined Joint Operations Area - Afghanistan. Through their efforts, the Afghan forces can continue to improve and eventually thrive.

"We help them to help themselves to build self-sustained forces," said Ivan. "The same stuff we teach them we see progress in. They learn and use skills the advisors teach to make their army better."

1st SFAB fields, qualifies on new XM17

FORT POLK, La. — Soldiers from 1st Battalion, 1st Security Forces Assistance Brigade qualified on the XM17 at the Joint Readiness Training Center, Fort Polk, La, Jan. 19-20, in preparation for their upcoming deployment in the spring of 2018.

According to the Army, the XM17 and XM18 handgun systems are replacing the M9 pistol. The “X” in “XM” stands for experimental and will be used until February, when the weapons complete type classification. Afterwards, the weapons will be referred to as the M17 and M18. The XM18 is the compact version of the XM17. Both weapons are capable of firing 9mm rounds.

Maj. Lucas Leinberger, firing range officer-in-charge for 3rd Battalion, 353th Armor Regiment, provided insight on the range and some of the fundamentals in basic marksmanship.

“We are working with members of the 1st SFAB to get some familiarization with the M17 pistol,” Leinberger said. “Part of that training is going through fundamentals such as sight picture, proper grip and trigger squeeze.”

The Army took a non-caliber specific approach to provide the best weapon system solution. The Army has plans to buy about 238,000.

“Personally, I noticed a better balance in the overall weapon – how it feels in your hand compared to the M9 and the M11 (service pistol) both unloaded and loaded with a full magazine,” Leinberger said. “I believe it is much easier to use; it is more ergo-

nomically correct. I believe it will make anyone who is firing the weapon more combat effective.”

The main reason for the change in weapon systems is to make the Soldier and units more lethal. The XM17 and XM18 modular handgun system program is one of the first in what is expected to be a whole line of modernization efforts that the Army will pursue over the next few years, according to the Army.

The XM17 and XM18 MHS program successfully involved warfighters in the source selection and post-award acquisition process more than any other small-arms program the Army has undertaken.

Sgt. Max Gilbert, a combat engineer for 2nd Battalion, 1st SFAB, has learned about the weapon and put his trust in it to make him more lethal in combat.


“The instructors here at the range were professional,” Gilbert said. “Yes, I feel that I am combat effective and combat ready.”

Maj. Brennan Speaks, brigade operations officer for 1st SFAB, talked about the XM17 and the commitment of the Army to make them more effective.

“Overall it is a great pistol; I am extremely pleased with it,” Speaks said. “I have fired over 500 rounds and not once did it jam or misfire. The fact that we are deploying and the Army has made their commitment to move these pistols to us, to me, says a lot about the Army’s commitment to the SFAB to ensure we have the best equipment to go overseas.”

SFABs allow the Army to reduce, over time, the demand for conventional brigade combat teams for combat advising. This allow BCTs to focus on readiness for warfighting.

Pilot takes his last flight

Chief Warrant Officer 5 Arthur Porretta, an aviator assigned to 3rd Squadron, 17th Cavalry Regiment, 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division, conducted his final flight as an Army aviator on Jan. 22 at Fort Stewart.

Porretta logged more than 3,000 flight hours over the course of his career and is retiring after 21 years of dedicated service.

"I've been doing this since I was in eighth grade," he said. "Attending military schools, then to military college; this is all I've been doing."

His career began as an enlisted Soldier with the 3rd Squadron, 6th Cavalry Regiment at Camp Humphreys, Korea. Upon his return state-side, he was stationed at Fort Stewart, where he decided to submit his packet for flight school. He has been flying ever since.

Porretta's last flight in an AH-64

Apache Attack Helicopter was co-piloted by Chief Warrant Officer 4 Andrew Barclay. Their flight plan started mid-afternoon with an hour round trip from Hunter Army Airfield to Fort Stewart.

"We couldn't have asked for better weather," Barclay said

As a tradition in the aviation field Porretta's aircraft received a traditional wet down, courtesy of the Hunter Army Airfield Fire Department as he approached the maintenance pad and taxied in. The tradition signifies mission complete for retiring pilots.

Porretta was greeted by his wife of 17 years, Dina, and his two daughters.

"It's really cool being able to come back to Hunter and finish here," Dina said.


Porretta assisted his daughters into the cockpit for the last time. There were no tears shed; however, all who were on the flight line donned enormous smiles during the celebrated event.

"I'm excited about retiring, but more so looking forward to what's next," he said.

From his first flight in 2003 to his last flight in 2018, having them both at the same location signifies his career

coming full circle.

Porretta's official retirement ceremony will commence mid-Spring.

TRICARE Enrollment Restored

The ability of TRICARE beneficiaries to enroll or change enrollment has been restored following a planned system maintenance.

If you filed enrollment applications or primary care manager (PCM) changes during the freeze by mail or phone, regional contractors are now processing those applications. If you made no enrollment or PCM changes, you were not affected.

TRICARE beneficiaries can once again enroll or change your enrollment by mail or phone. Online enrollment via the Beneficiary Web Enrollment (BWE) website will be brought back online in the first week of January 2018.

Since Dec. 1, 2017, enrollments in TRICARE health plans were delayed, or "frozen," while data was transferred to the new stateside regional contractors. That data transfer is complete.

The assignment of new or updated PCM will take some time. If you have an assigned PCM, please continue to see that PCM unless you are notified of a new PCM by your managed care contractor. If you don't have an assigned PCM, you can see an authorized TRICARE provider. Please do not call your regional contractor regarding PCM assignment in January.

This system maintenance is in preparation for changes coming on Jan. 1, 2018. These changes include transitioning from three to two stateside regions and regional contractors. Additionally, those eligible for TRICARE Standard and TRICARE Extra will be converted to the new TRICARE Select plan.

Community members visit Hunter

Guest from the Gulfstream, sponsored Student Leadership program; Immanuel Baptist Church; and Richmond Hill High School, visited Hunter Army Airfield Jan. 18 as part of the installation's combined tour.

Stops on the tour varied. The bulk of the visit included 650 students from RHHS; who visited the Truscott Air Terminal. There, Lt. Col. Arlin Wilsher, 3rd CAB rear-detachment commander, provided a motivational talk to students as part of the Student Leadership Program.

The SLP is a community partnership between Gulfstream, Savannah-Chatham County Public Schools, local businesses, post-secondary institutions and non-profit organizations. The program is designed to equip high school students with tangible skills to explore options beyond the classroom. Six hundred high school students (150 per grade) participate in the four-year program. This is the fourth year the military program has been hosted at Hunter Army Airfield.

Other sites visited by other groups included the Army Family Service Center, the Hunter flightline, the engagement skills trainer, and the installation consolidated dining facility.

"Today was a great day for the Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield Community Outreach Program as we informed more than 700 citizens ranging from high school students to older Americans about the mission of Fort Stewart/Hunter Army Airfield and exposed them to the quality men and women serving their nation," said Steve Hart, Hunter Army Airfield Public Affairs Officer. "I would like to think they departed with a greater understanding of the installation's mission and

units and an increased appreciation for what our Service Members do."

The Immanuel Baptist Church "Silver Nuggets" visited the EST; which simulates live weapons training. Gregory Davis, an EST instructor explained the system to the guests.

"More than 1,000 individuals visit the engagement skills trainer every month, Davis said. "The facility has demonstrated it is both safe and economic."

Davis said the EST has the capability of fulfilling several roles in training including basic marksmanship, collective training and escalation of force. He said the facility was versatile in meeting Soldier and leader needs – capable of supporting individual call-for-fire or small arms fire, as well as larger systems such as vehicle mounted crew serve weapon training.

He noted while the range doesn't replace actual live-fire ranging, the facility was especially efficient regarding basic marksmanship training – such as aiming, breathing, and trigger squeeze.

Pvt. Jennifer Flores, a Soldier with the 258th Movement Control Team attending basic marksmanship training Jan. 18 at the EST, helped demonstrate the facility with her fellow Soldiers – feeling the pressure as she continuously shot near-perfect scores.

Flores, although from Texas said she wasn't familiar with firing weapons before joining the Army; said she benefited from the EST.

"I love training here," Flores said as she scored 35 of 40 for the day. "Training here helps prepare me for the actual range later."



The S1 will validate all supporting documents are loaded into IPERMS. Soldiers will need to complete a DA Form 5960 and have it certified by their company level commander. If designated by the company commander, the first commissioned officer in the Soldier's chain of command can certify. Then the S1 will upload the DA Form 5960 into IPERMS. The Fort Stewart Defense Military Pay Office will only be involved in the recertification if there is a change to be made in the payment of the BAH entitlement.

7 Soldier-athletes headed to the Olympics

SAN ANTONIO – Seven Soldiers will be among the other athletes representing the United States Feb. 9-25, in the 2018 Olympic Winter Games in Pyeongchang, South Korea.

Returning in Bobsled will be 2010 Olympic Gold Medalist Sgt. Justin Olsen from San Antonio, Texas; 2014 Olympic Bronze Medalist Cpt. Chris Fogt from Alpine, Utah; and 2010 and 2014 Olympic team member Sgt. Nick Cunningham from Monterey, California; who are all part of the U.S. Army Installation Management Command's World Class Athlete Program. Olsen and Cunningham are members of the New York National Guard. They will be joined by Sgt. First Class Nathan Weber, who is

not part of WCAP.

Sgt. Emily Sweeney from Suffield, Connecticut, and Sgt. Taylor Morris from South Jordan, Utah, will compete in Singles Luge, along with Sgt. Matthew Mortensen from Huntington Station, New York, who is competing in the Doubles Luge event. They are also Soldier-athletes in WCAP, who've made the U.S. Olympic Team.

The Soldiers' participation in the Olympics is a testament to their enduring resilience and the Army's commitment to teamwork, determination and perseverance, and the nation encourages the world to follow and share their progress in social media using #SoldierOlympians.

Opening Ceremonies for these Winter Olympics are scheduled for Feb. 9, and luge events run Feb. 10-15. Bobsled

competitions are scheduled to run Feb. 18-24, all to be broadcast by the National Broadcasting Company through NBC News and NBC Sports.

The WCAP program is composed of national and international caliber Soldiers who have been recognized in their sport, and who maximize and embody high performance agility, mental preparedness and physical strength. These Soldier-Olympians connect Americans with the Army and show that they are more than just war-fighters.

Other Soldiers are in contention to coach these Olympians on Team USA.
