Stewart wins final ACOE gold

For a record seventh time, Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield is the Army Community of Excellence gold winner.

The Assistant Chief of Staff for Installation Management announced the 2019 win on March 6. Previously, Stewart-Hunter won gold in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2009, 2012, and 2015. Last year, the installation secured a bronze award.

The win is indicative of the garrison workforce's commitment to providing the best services possible to the installation's Soldiers, Families, and other supported populations, said garrison commander Col. Jason Wolter.

"Through continuous process improvement, the installation team evolves with the changing dynamics of the Army in order to ensure the readiness of our assigned Soldiers," Wolter said. "We also take care of their Families while Soldiers train and deploy. Reviewing our processes with periodic assessments ensures we make the best changes to operate effectively."

The exceptional teamwork between the instal-

lation and the local neighboring communities also assisted in winning gold, Wolter said.

"This award would not be possible without the exceptional teamwork from the Stewart-Hunter team and the partnerships we continue to build and sustain within our local communities," he said. "We are one team with the common goal of taking care of our Soldiers, Families, Retirees, and Civilians."

Wolter added the win is bittersweet because this is the final year for the ACOE award program.

Even though installations will not be recognized in this fashion in the coming years, Wolter said Stewart-Hunter's commitment will continue.

"As we continue to evolve as an Army and face constant change, the processes we have built will sustain us into the future," he said. "I challenge everyone to keep this momentum going and to continue improving Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield."

Other installations recognized are Fort Wainwright, Alaska, silver; Fort McCoy, Wisconsin, and Fort Riley, Kansas, bronze; and Fort A.P. Hill, Virginia, and Fort Drum, New York, honorable mention.

Raider Soldiers support light infantry rotations at Fort Polk

The “Desert Rogues” of 1st Battalion, 64th Armor Regiment, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, are trading in the mountains of Korea for the swamps of Louisiana where two of their companies are supporting light infantry rotations at the Joint Readiness Training Center, Fort Polk, Louisiana.

Soldiers from Company C completed gunnery with partner units from 2ABCT and departed for Fort Polk in early March to support the 3rd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division during their rotation. Company A will follow behind in support of 3rd Brigade, 10th Mountain Division.

Capt. Ben Novak took command of Co. A, 1-64 Armor in January after serving as the battalion's assistant operations officer during the rotation in Korea.

“Our operational focus is preparing for the dismounted fight as opposed to the heavy tank engagements we trained for in Korea,” said Novak. “Specifically training for survivability against enemy air and artillery assets that will be targeting us as the only armored element in the brigade.”

It is quite a change from the mission in Korea. While the battalion was headquartered south of Seoul at Camp Humphreys, most training and all gunnery was conducted at Rodriguez Live Fire Complex near the Demilitarized Zone.

The companies from 1-64 Armor will also include additional enablers from the 3rd Brigade Support Battalion and the 1st Battalion, 41st Field Artillery Regiment. Together they will make up the mechanized element for the light infantry brigade combat teams.

“Adding an armored/mechanized company increases the brigade’s lethality, speed, and ability to employ a striking force capable of destroying an enemy counterattack,” said Maj. Levi Thompson, operations officer, 3rd Infantry Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division.

“The ability to employ mechanized and light forces together at the Joint Readiness Training Center increases our ability to effectively fight as a combined arms team, building lessons learned, exploiting capabilities, and increasing a shared understanding before executing in actual combat.”

Part of the JRTC rotation is a live-fire portion which requires crews to be qualified before they arrive at Fort Polk. The 1ABCT tank and Bradley crews were able to qualify during 2ABCT’s gunnery. “Spartan Brigade” Soldiers completed their qualification tables in preparation for an April rotation at the National Training Center at Fort Irwin, California. They were also able to facilitate the individual

and collective gunnery tables for 1ABCT Soldiers.

“The biggest challenge was working the details between the two brigades to slot our crews into their gun line in a short amount of time,” said Sgt. 1st Class Jason Gamble, 1ABCT Bradley Master Gunner. “The senior leaders, planners, and master gunners from the Spartan Brigade made it easy to integrate our 14 tank crews and 17 Bradley crews into their training plan.”

Raider Brigade Soldiers will support additional rotations at both Fort Polk and the National Training Center throughout the year augmenting rotational units, providing opposing forces, and mentoring rotational units in observer, coach, trainer roles.

3rd ID, community honor Women's History Month

The 3rd Infantry Division Artillery hosted the Women's History Observance event at Club Stewart, March 20, on Fort Stewart. This year's theme was Visionary Women: Champions of Peace and Nonviolence.

Ginger Miller, a U.S. Navy veteran, a mother of two boys, as well as founder and chief executive officer of Women Veterans Interactive, was the keynote speaker for the event. A native New Yorker and former homeless service-disabled-veteran, she also supported her husband, a U.S. Marine Corps veteran suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder for more than 10 years.

Women Veterans Interactive is an organization designed to support and reach out to the nation's 1.8 million woman veterans. WVI was established to focus on women veterans who fight unique, up-hill battles during and after they transition to civilian life. The organization assists more than 1,000 women veterans in 12 states.

"Women Veterans Interactive has turned into a full-fledged non-profit organization," Miller said. "It's something I wish didn't have to exist, but it's necessary." She adds, "We have women today who are still getting out of the military not transitioning well."

The event at Club Stewart included speeches from women veterans currently serving on Fort Stewart as well as a skit that portrayed iconic people in history, like Angela Davis, Yoko Ono and Harry Belafonte, who were activists for peace and human

rights. The event displayed uniforms from the U.S. Air Force, Army, and Marine Corps to signify and recognize some of the first women to serve in our nation's armed forces. A Women's Army Auxiliary Corps uniform and a U.S. Navy Nurse Corps uniform were also on display.

Sgt. Imanic McCoy, a geospatial engineer assigned to the 3rd Infantry Division Artillery, read the Presidential Proclamation on Women's History at the ceremony and said Ginger Miller left her feeling inspired. She also said, "We are a community and yes, women, we are important, but it is also important that we all understand that we are sisters and brothers in arms."

Editor's note: International Women's Day is observed March 8 every year and recognizes women's achievements across the world. In 1981, U.S. Congress empowered the President to declare a week in March to be Women's History Week, beginning on March 7, 1982. The National Women's History Project petitioned Congress to designate the month of March 1987, to be Women's History Month. Congress continued to pass additional verdicts between 1988 and 1994, authorizing the President to proclaim March to be Women's History Month each year.

New system to eye tech-savvy Soldiers

SPRINGFIELD, Virginia
-- As the Army undergoes the largest modernization of its network in decades, technically skilled Soldiers may be placed in jobs outside their career fields to help push it forward, the Army's vice chief of staff said.

"Talent management is one of the biggest things we're doing behind the scenes in the Army right now," said Gen. James C. McConville, while speaking at an Army signal conference Tuesday.

Currently, the Army has three separate personnel systems for the National Guard, Army Reserve and regular Army.

Part of the Army's larger talent management strategy includes providing commanders with a tool, known as the Integrated Personnel and Pay System-Army, which allows them to identify talents across the total force. IPPS-A is now being tested by the Pennsylvania National Guard.

By 2020, the goal is to have the system Army-wide, making it easier for leaders to better manage Soldiers based on their knowledge, skills, behavior and even give them preference on where they want to serve, regardless of their military occupational specialty.

McConville said the system could benefit Soldiers who have backgrounds in signal, cyber and intelligence.

"If you have specific talents, you may be promoted ahead of your peers, you may get special com-

pensation for your skills, or you may go to graduate school so we can expand your talent as we go forward," he said.

Earlier this year, the Army stood up the Artificial Intelligence Task Force. Based at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh, the task force engages with academia and industry partners to further develop AI technology.

While building it up, McConville said it took weeks to find the right people to join the task force since the service still uses an "industrial-age" personnel management system.

The general, though, was impressed when the Army finally found Soldiers with AI experience, even some with doctorate degrees, hidden in other career fields.

"We have people in the Army who have all these capabilities," he said, "except that they're masked by their MOS."

McConville also credited the Army Signal Corps for being behind past modernization efforts that improved communication on the battlefield.

"You've always been the stewards of innovation in our Army," he said, "you've always embraced change and you used every method available to get the mes-

sage through."

In his remarks, Lt. Gen. Bruce Crawford, Army chief information officer/G-6, said last year's National Defense Strategy also sent a message to the Army: the service must change the way it fights from irregular warfare to great power competition with our near-peer competitors.

To do so, the Army network modernization strategy aims to develop a unified network and common operating environment, increase interoperability, and boost the mobility and survivability of command posts.

"Our quest is to deliver a network that is fundamentally different in many facets than the one that we have today," Crawford said.

One goal from these initiatives is to allow units to operate quicker in contested environments.

"This future network that we envision has to not only come back and be resilient enough to overcome the threat," he said, "but it also has to dramatically increase speed of decision making."

Tangible actions by the Army are expected in the next four to five months to help tackle its data challenges as part of these efforts, he added.

Raider scouts win Marne Gainey Cup

It was a 1-2 finish for "Garry Owen" at the Marne Best Scout Squad Competition as the team from Troop B, 5th Squadron, 7th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team edged out the unit's Troop A team, to represent the division at the Army-wide Gainey Cup Competition in late April.

The winning squad was led by Staff Sgt. Kristofer Sprunger, who said it is more than just an honor to win the Marne Gainey Cup and represent the division against the rest of the Army's top squads.

"The best part is working with this group of Soldiers," said Sprunger, who is from LaGrange, Indiana. "I'm thrilled that they'll get the experience to train and do their job as scouts at the highest level."

The competition began with a reconnaissance run which set the pace for the challenging five-day competition. The run was of an unknown distance at an unknown pace with a written test at the conclusion worth 100 points. The distance ended up being five miles at an eight-minute per mile pace. Teams were deducted 15 points from their written score for each team member who finished more than one arm's length from the final rank of the formation.

Over the remaining four days, the teams were tested in a stress shoot, call for fire, mounted and dismounted land navigation, gunnery skills test, and a 24-hour reconnaissance lane before the final charge on Friday morning.

Pfc. Mason Chapmond has been in the Army just over a year and a half and said that the hardest event for him was the final charge.

"It was our fifth day going hard and we've been gassed all week," said Chapmond, a native of Hot Springs, Arkansas. "As a team we just had to dig deep and get through it."

The final charge was the culminating event of the week and included tire flips, kettle bell squats, sprints, litter pulls, burpees, iron mikes, high crawl, and a final three-mile ruck march to the finish line.

"After just getting back from Korea and having so much going on it's really special to see the squad succeed," said Troop B 1st Sgt. Evan Reed. "It's so exciting to see six of our Soldiers come together to train and win."

Sprunger and Chapmond were the senior and junior members of the squad, the other four scouts were Sgt. Steven Holy, Spc. Daniel Satterwhite, Spc. Jonathan Hoskins, and Pfc. Mark Saenger.

The 2019 Gainey Cup is April 29 to May 3 and is open to all scouts serving in reconnaissance organizations. It includes 24 teams from active duty, national guard, and international units. The competition is designed to test scout squad proficiency in conducting reconnaissance and security in close proximity to enemy forces and civilian populations to provide commanders with fresh, accurate information about the terrain and the enemy. Scouts must be experts in employing fires, and other enablers, and rapidly developing the situation allowing battalions and brigades to concentrate their combat power at the decisive time and place.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER: FINDING BALANCE

***Do not plow with an ox and donkey yoked together.* — Deuteronomy 22:10 NIV**

The Jewish mystic Maharal observed the word “Shalom” begins with the Hebrew root word “Shin”, indicating God’s peace begins with balance. From that balance, we can transcend our current struggles and discover the joy, peace, confidence and security of being with God. However, without the balance that integrates us into being complete people, none can properly live in God’s presence. Maharal contended that life should be spent seeking the balance point between the unhealthy extremes. A happy mid-point can bring contentment to life.

It is difficult to find balance with either our time or emotions; both are fixed resources that cannot be increased. Family, friends, work, hobbies, faith, self-care and fitness may be among our demands. If we give all our effort and time to one area, the other areas will be neglected to the point of failure. For some of us, the balance between work and family is disproportionately unhealthy. It is not always long hours that create the imbalance; it can also be stress or emotional investment. When the demands of work are high, we will naturally have less emotional capacity for family life. Conversely, when our home life is demanding, our effectiveness at work is significantly reduced.

The results of imbalance can lead an over-functioning worker to potentially become an under-functioning member of their family. If we make important decisions and give maximum performance all day at work, there may be nothing left at the end of the work day, which may allow others, be it friends or family, to make important decisions and compensate for our under-functioning nature in the areas of life outside of work.

Many Soldiers compartmentalize their work and personal lives in a way that helps them and their families in the short term. Taken to its extreme, this can be harmful for most of us over time. Some Soldiers present themselves at work as natural leaders with keen intellects and strong work ethics. Occasionally, those same Soldiers have miserable home lives and are incapacitated with various struggles.

They seem like two different people, which is not healthy.

Most relationships have partners with complimentary personalities. In healthy relationships, the partners are near equals, with perhaps one partner being slightly over-functioning and the other slightly under-functioning. When the relationship shifts out of balance, the one who over-functions is often viewed as nagging or dissatisfied, while the one who under-functions often appears to lack effort or responsibility in making the relationship work. An unbalanced relationship with either our job or with another person will lead us to disappointment.

The best way to find balance starts with accepting that our relationships to our work and to others will not bring us lasting joy. When our identity is in our performance, we become enslaved by the illusions of happiness through power and praise.

Lasting joy comes from God who fills us with his peace and confidence from the Holy Spirit. We have peace when our identity is in him. When we refuse to deplete our emotional energy in a single area of life, we have the emotional reserve needed to function properly in other areas of our lives. The healthy balance is found in being fully engaged with both work and family, as well as other areas of life. This optimal-functioning comes from knowing and respecting our limits. When we push beyond our limits, we jeopardize our long-term wellness.

Ironically, we train ourselves and others how to behave in the relationships that effect our wellbeing. When we feel that we need to control another person or abandon our responsibility in a relationship, then we let the scales slip further out of balance and this may lead to disaster. However, we also have the power of self-discipline to take responsibility for ourselves and provide the freedom for our partners to take responsibility for themselves. By promoting independence in each partner, a relationship not only finds harmonious balance, it also increases the choice to stay in a relationship rather than feeling trapped in it.

Actively seeking this balance of priorities and responsibilities prepares each of us to experience the peace of God in all areas of life.

PGA golfers conduct free golf clinic

Professional Golf Association golfers took time from preparing to compete in the Savannah Golf Championship to share their knowledge with members of the military community March 26 with five supporting Hunter Golf Course and three at Fort Stewart.

The PGA golfers were among the field of 156 players competing for the \$99,000 payout to the tournament's winner in the four-round **Web.com** Tour event at the Deer Creek Golf Course on The Landings March 28 - 31.

"It's an honor to just be able to give back to these guys because we know how much they sacrifice," said Christian Brand, professional golfer who participated in the clinic. "This community really rallies around the local military and being here gives us a sense of perspective on who heroes really are."

Twenty active and retired Service Members turned out at Hunter for the rare opportunity to receive instruction from a PGA player.

The ability level of the participants varied from those brand new to the game to seasoned golfers.

"It was a great opportunity to get input from pros about the bad habits in my swing," said Air Force Tech Sgt. Garry Pertillo with the 165th Airlift Wing. "I learned a few things that will help my game. I now have a better understanding of what to do and can get away from bad techniques that ingrain poor habits," Petrillo, who has never had a formal lesson

and learned what he knows from Youtube videos.

Retired noncommissioned officer and amateur golfer, Steve Williams, got something different from the experience. "I really enjoyed speaking with the pros to hear how they play different shots", Williams remarked. "... And then to watch them hit was absolutely amazing."

"It's great that the professionals took time from practicing for the tournament to help out Soldiers," said Capt. Tony Moltz.

Similar responses were expressed at Fort Stewart's event, which had about 30 community members attending.

Golf professional Mark Silvers of Savannah was pleased to be on Fort Stewart and to give tips to Soldiers on improving their golf games.

"The fact that if we can do some things good in the community around us is always great for everybody," Silvers said. "Obviously, our military is incredible. They do so much for us and anything we can give back is a pleasure. The reason we get to do what we do here in the United States is because of our military."

The tips Silvers provided were helpful, said Spc. Blake Majors, 92nd Engineer Battalion.

"They know a lot and know what they're talking about," Majors said. "They see exactly what's wrong with somebody's golf swing so it's easier for them to help you out. (Silvers) told me to do a couple of things and within five or six balls it was just a game changer."

"You may spot him at the driving range, at the putting green, or perfecting his golf clap while watching the tournament," she said.


Supporting the event is important to maintain community relations, said Murray.

Workhorse, Knighthawk plow through with sling-load training

Marne Air Soldiers from 2nd Battalion, 3rd Aviation Regiment and 603rd Aviation Support Battalion, 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade conducted sling-load operations and casualty evacuations March 21 on Fort Stewart, as part of their field training exercise.

The Knighthawk and Workhorse battalions worked together to maintain unit readiness and prepare them for any mission that may occur.

“We are conducting sling-load operations, so we can learn how to get our retransmission vehicles out to far sights in order to support the brigade mission keeping communication open,” said Staff Sgt. Matthew Stoner, platoon sergeant for Company C, 603rd ASB. “The purpose of this training is to maintain unit readiness and to be prepared for any mission.”

Workhorse Soldiers were put to the test when it came to the field training that was prepared just for them.

“We will call up nine-line medical evacuation on the radio to conduct CASEVAC (casualty evacuation) training,” said Stoner. “The Soldiers will be trained on how to assess casualties, assisting units in a hostile environment with small unit tactics and small unit defense.”

As the Workhorse Soldiers readied for the day’s training, they could hear the propellers chopping in the far distance. As the sound began to get louder and louder to the point that it was literally on top of them coming out of the trees was the CH-47 Chinook, here to pick up their equipment.

“We were supporting an air mission request for Company C, 603rd ASB, we went down to conduct sling-load and CASEVAC training,” said Chief Warrant Officer 2 Elias Eave, CH-47 Chinook pilot for Co. B, 2-3 Avn. “The training was good for us because this gives up the opportunity to train on something, we

do not get a chance to do often.”

Knighthawks Soldiers lifted an up-armored Humvee and a trailer during the day and later in the afternoon the Workhorse Soldiers called-up nine-line request for the Knighthawks to respond to.

Eaves gave insight on what opportunities that opened up.

“We usually do not get the opportunity to conduct CASEVAC training as a CH-47 Chinook pilot,” he said. “But it was good, because I was flying with a newer pilot who has not experienced this training.”

Eave also noted the training also allowed them to work on dynamics, receiving the nine-line request and landing zones from the guys on the ground.
