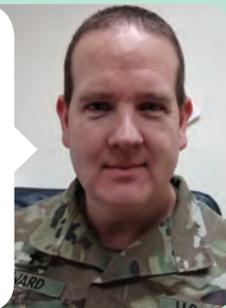

# Raider Soldiers blow away gunnery table five

Raider Crews are busy identifying and knocking down targets with their Abrams tank and Bradley fighting vehicle weapons systems as part of a brigade-wide gunnery here on Fort Stewart.

Tank commander and platoon sergeant for 1st Platoon, Company B, Sgt. 1st Class Erskin Duncan has been in the Army 17 years and has successfully completed 35 gunneries but feels this one is significant because it will probably be his last gunnery before moving into a 1st Sgt. position.

“I want to give my guys one last hoorah,” said Duncan. “One of the major challenges we face with this gunnery is training new personnel in new positions but we go through task after task to get proficient.”

All of the tank and Bradley crews in the Raider Brigade qualified while in Korea but with personnel turnover there are a lot of new faces at the range.

One of those new faces is eighteen-year-old Pvt. David Fender, a tank driver with 1st Platoon, Co. B, who is experiencing his first gunnery. The Ohioan Soldier said he has been in the Army a little under a year and really like the Army’s fast pace learning style.

“My favorite part about my job is serving with the crew I have now because they are smart and constantly teaching me new things,” said Fender. “This gunnery is the most memorable part of my career so far and I’m looking forward to qualifying and getting my first pair of tanker boots.”

There are several phases of gunnery, starting from ensuring the vehicles are fully mission capable to individual and crew training. Capt. Jacob Lopez, the assistant operations officer with the 5th Squadron, 7th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, was one of the lead planners for the gunnery while he still served in the brigade plans shop.

“This is one of the best things you can do in an armor brigade combat team. The importance of conducting gunnery is to maintain proficiency and hone our lethality,” said Lopez. “Crews put in many hours, utilizing simulation centers to practice shooting and maneuvering.”

Raider crews will continue to qualify through spring and then will conduct another gunnery in the fall before their 2020 decisive action rotation to the National Training Center on Fort Irwin, California.

# Leadership Georgia visits Stewart

Twenty-two representatives from Evans, Liberty and Waycross counties participated in Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield combined leadership tour, April 11 as part of the Leadership Georgia program.

Leadership Georgia is a multi-tiered training program for business, civic, and community leaders with a goal of building networks and working together to better Georgia at all levels. The program is affiliated with the Georgia Chamber of Commerce. It begins at the lowest level with programs conducted by county Chambers of Commerce.

“Our intent is to familiarize leadership classes with the installation and 3rd Infantry Division, the history, and impact to the region. Focusing on demonstrating Readiness, Modernization and Partnerships,” said Dina McKain, Fort Stewart Public Affairs.

Attendees started the day with a command brief provided by the Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield garrison commander, Col. Jason Wolter, who familiarized them with the installation, units, and basic mission.

Wolter explained the maneuver space and training capability, combined with the ability to deploy anywhere in the world rapidly - using road, rail, air and local seaside ports, made Fort Stewart one of the Army's premier power projection platforms. He noted most of the Soldiers and their Families live in the communities the attendees represent. He thanked attendees for helping take care of those Families, adding Soldiers were able to concentrate on their mission, knowing their Families were being taken care of at home.

The next steps included the installation's Directorate of Emergency Services' fire department; Winn Army Community Hospital; the 2nd Battalion, 7th Infantry Regiment motor pool; the Directorate of Plans, Training, Mobilization and Safety Engagement Skills Trainer; and the 3rd Infantry Division Museum.

They learned about the basic mission, resources and capabilities at each of the locations and in some cases about training and partnership opportunities.

## Girl Scouts visit HAAF military police station

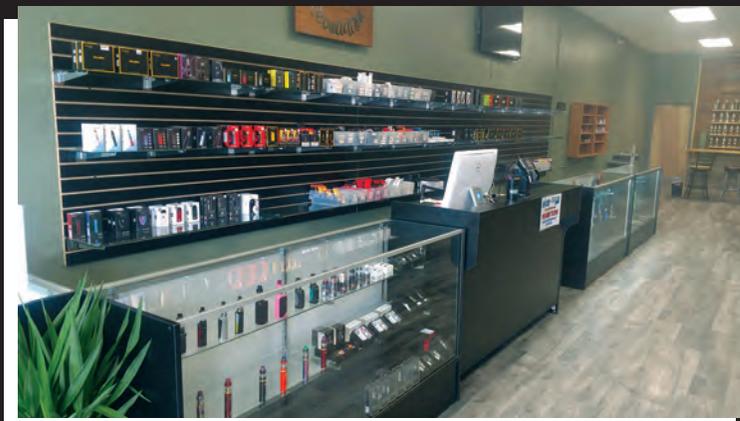

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# Adding color to the menu can help improve your health

**FORT LEE, Va.** – Consuming a variety of fruits and vegetables is beneficial to overall health and wellness. While virtually all fruits and vegetables are high in fiber and low in fat, each color provides unique nutrients and phytonutrients that help lower the risk of chronic disease and inflammation.

“It is so important to add a variety of color to your meals to ensure a healthy eating pattern,” said DeCA’s Health and Wellness Program Manager Deborah Harris, registered dietitian and certified diabetes educator. “Shop your commissary for a vast spectrum of colorful fruits and veggies, and aim for at least 8 servings daily – two servings at breakfast, lunch and dinner, and two for snacks – to benefit from their health-promoting properties. This may seem like a lot, but it truly isn’t. Just make sure half your plate is filled with fruits and vegetables and you are almost there.”

Here are some attributes of produce colors frequently cited in studies:

**Red:** A good source of the antioxidant lycopene may lower the risk of some cancers. Tomatoes, cherries, pomegranates, beets and watermelons are good sources.

**Yellow / Orange:** Rich in vitamin C and carotene may help with heart and vision health and may reduce the risk of some cancers. Examples include oranges, carrots, yellow apples, pears, lemons, butter-nut squash and corn.

**Blue/Purple:** Antioxidants that provide heart health benefits and may help to slow signs of aging, preserve memory function and reduce the risk of some cancers. Foods rich in these properties include blackberries, plums, prunes, blueberries, grapes, eggplant and red cabbage

**Green:** Promotes stronger bones and teeth, supports eye health and the immune system and may lower the risk of cancer, high blood pressure and bad cholesterol. Foods rich in these nutrients include broccoli, avocado, zucchini, celery, kiwi, cucumber, Brussels

sprouts and leafy greens.

**White:** May reduces the risk of cardiovascular disease and promotes healthy bones. Onions, mushrooms, garlic, cauliflower, white corn, turnips and white peaches are good sources.

“When shopping for produce, be cognizant of the health benefits of each color, filling your basket with your favorites, remembering that frozen and canned vegetables count too,” said Harris. “Then use the Nutrition Guide Program to find nutritious products in the center aisles to round out your menu. # Special Operations conducts PT with 3rd ID Soldiers

More than 40 Soldiers from Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield attended the special operations combat physical training event on April 10 on Fort Stewart.

The purpose of combat PT was to strengthen the muscles that Soldiers need for the Special Operations assessment and selection. The special operations focus was to let 3rd Infantry Division Soldiers know that they are available to provide information to Soldiers that are interested in joining the force.

“The combat PT is different than physical readiness training that regular units conduct,” said Staff Sgt. Steven Hickman, psychological special operations recruiter. “The PT prepares us to go down range and complete any mission we need to get done.”

During the event, Soldiers completed a one-mile run wearing an Improved Outer Tactical Vest carrying rubber dummy rifles. They also performed pull-ups, sled pulls, an ab-targeted medicine ball toss and carried sandbags.

“We’re interacting with Soldiers and leaders through PT to let them know that the option for Soldiers to join special operations is available and it’s a great opportunity,” said Hickman. “We also

want the conventional Army units to know that any unit can participate in our PT event.”

After PT, the recruiters spoke to Soldiers about joining special operations because it can open up opportunities for military and civilian education. They also explained the opportunity of traveling outside of the U.S. during missions.

The special operations community is comprised of civil affairs, psychological operations, 160th special operations aviation regiment and most notably, the green berets.

The requirements for civil affairs, psychological operations and Special Forces are a general technical score of 107 and a PT score of 240. Soldiers must score a 70 in each event to meet the requirement. These three forces are open to all military occupational specialties.

“As my time in special operations recruiting on Fort Stewart comes to a close, I want to see the success of our force continue,” said Sgt. 1st Class William Estojak, Special Forces recruiter. “I feel it is my duty to help supply the best and knowledgeable Soldiers to continue the mission.”

# Sleep into good health

The National Sleep Foundation highlights the benefits of sleep and its importance to safety and productivity. Sleep plays a vital role in good health and well-being throughout your life. Getting enough quality sleep at the right times can help protect your mental and physical well-being, quality of life, and safety.

The way you feel while you're awake depends in part on what happens while you're sleeping. During sleep, your body is working to support healthy brain function and maintain your physical health. In children and teens, sleep also helps support growth and development. The damage from sleep deficiency, or lack of can occur in an instant (such as a car crash), or can create harmful effects to the body over a long period of time. For example, ongoing sleep deficiency can raise your risk for certain chronic health problems such as hypertension, decreased immunity, obesity, and depression. It also can affect how well you think, react, work, learn, and get along with others. Quality sleep can improve and enhance all aspects of your life. Be an active participant in your health outcomes.

Try to follow these sleep practices on a consistent basis:

- Stick to the same bedtime and wake up time, even on the weekends. This helps to regulate your body's clock and could help you fall asleep and stay asleep for the night.
- Practice a relaxing bedtime ritual. A relaxing, routine activity right before bedtime conducted away from bright lights helps separate your sleep time from activities that can cause excitement, stress or anxiety which can make it more difficult to fall asleep, get sound and deep sleep or remain asleep.
- Avoid naps, especially in the afternoon.
- Power napping may

help you get through the day, but if you find that you can't fall asleep at bedtime, eliminating even short cat-naps may help.

- Exercise daily. Vigorous exercise is best, but even light exercise is better than no activity. Exercise at any time of day, but not at the expense of your sleep.
- Alcohol, cigarettes and caffeine can disrupt sleep. Eating big or spicy meals can cause discomfort from indigestion that can make it hard to sleep. It is good to finish eating at least 2-3 hours before bedtime.
- Wind down. Your body needs time to shift into sleep mode, so spend the last hour before bed doing a calming activity such as reading.
- For some people, using an electronic device such as a laptop can make it hard to fall asleep, because the particular type of light emanating from the screens of these devices is activating to the brain. If you have trouble sleeping, avoid electronics 1-2 hours before bed.

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# Affirmation of Life: Getting to the left of Suicide

According to *Military.com*, a total of 321 active-duty service members took their lives last year. From that number, the Department of the Army suffered the loss of 138 Soldiers to suicide. In an effort to reeducate the formations who have recently experienced suicide in their ranks, Soldiers and civilians from 3rd Infantry Division participated in a suicide prevention event, "Affirmation of Life" hosted by 3rd ID Artillery at the Newman Fitness Center, April 10 on Fort Stewart.

The event kicked off with opening remarks from the 3rd ID DIVARTY commander, Col. Robert Marshall. He was followed up with an opening prayer from the DIVARTY chaplain, Maj. Archie Durham.

Guest speakers from the event included retired Sgt. 1st Class Thomas Dewitt, Julie Albert, and retired U.S. Army Maj. Gen. Mark Graham.

Dewitt, a veteran of war, recounted two separate events while deployed. The first one centered on the loss of a gunner who died in his arms and the second was a medic who was more concerned about other wounded Soldiers than his own life. Both events had a tremendous impact on his life once he returned home to his family.

"After returning from deployment, I got a call that they were starting my medical evaluation board that day," said Dewitt. "I got in an argument with my wife; I had been drinking, so I grabbed a gun and went over to a pond in my backyard. I had the gun in my mouth, the crazy thing is, till this day, I can taste the CLP (cleaning solution) in my mouth, but I heard my daughter calling for me."

Dewitt remembered calling 911 because he didn't want his daughter to find his body. It was then he realized he had hit the lowest point of his life. After this, he no longer trusted himself and called a psychiatrist and got the help that he needed.

"The best thing that I ever found is you guys, my peers" said Dewitt. "Going and speaking to my peers who have gone there, been there done that and going through it. That is why I refer to myself as Tommy, because over half of my life I have referred to myself as Sgt. 1st Class Dewitt. My time is over and I'm ok with that. I still have my family, friends, and amazing support chain. Please understand that mental help can

be fixed when addressed maturely."

Julie Albert, an embedded behavioral health provider for the DIVARTY clinic, explained the services available to all Soldiers here on Fort Stewart.

"We are here for the leaders," said Albert. "Leaders that have questions and concerns about their Soldiers and resources that are available and how to access those resources. If we see similar complaints about an issue, we bring that issue to their attention to help bring down the stress levels."

The keynote speaker for the event, Graham, who retired from the U.S. Army Forces Command headquarters after 34 years of service, is all too familiar with suicide. In June 2003, his youngest son Kevin committed suicide. That heartbreak was followed seven months later when his other son, Jeffrey, died after being struck by an improvised explosive device in Iraq on patrol.

"Our son, Jeff, before he deployed to Iraq, asked us to keep telling our story," said Graham. "They're a lot of Kevins out there that have no voice. Please continue to give them a voice."

Graham is living up to that promise by speaking at engagements like the Affirmation of Life event across the country, reminding Soldiers that there is help available out there that is one call away.

"We wanted to come out and let people know they're irreplaceable," said Graham. "And everyone is important to all of us, and we want to keep them alive and end the suicides that are happening around the country."

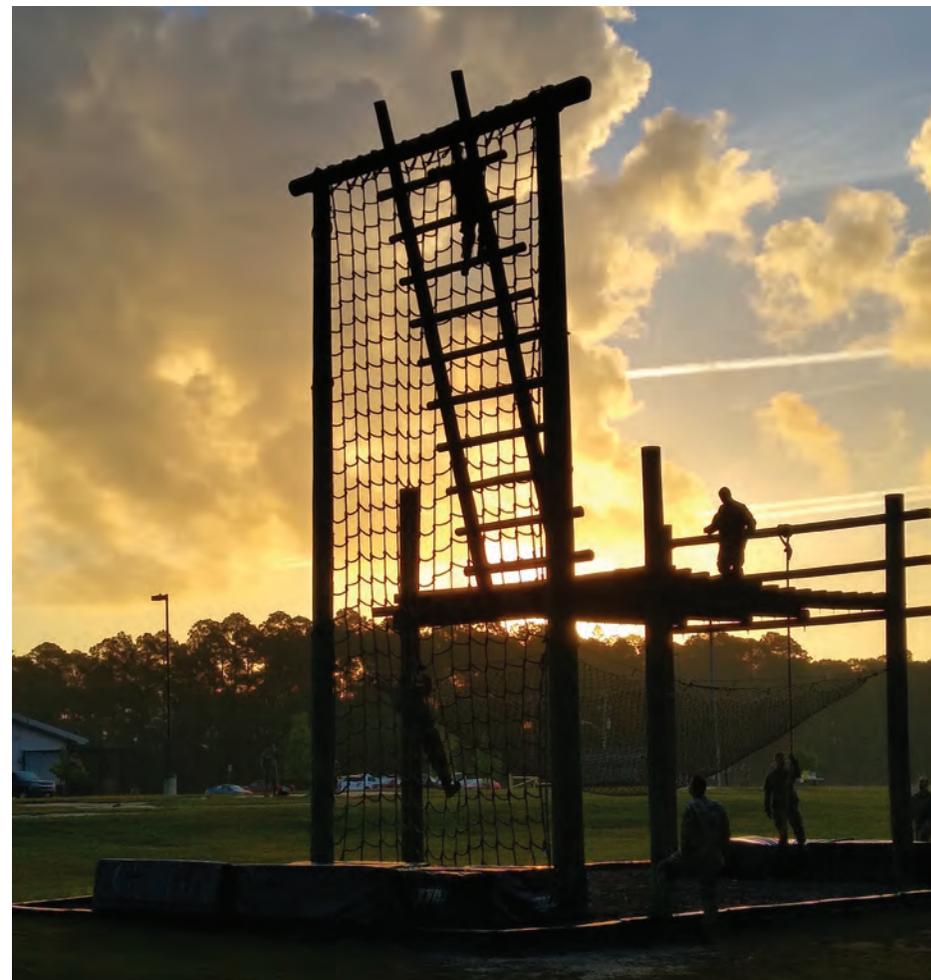

# Spartan spouse becomes a national swim champion

Sharon Taylor, spouse of Capt. Daniel Gomez, 2nd Armored Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division, represented the Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield families at the 2019 YMCA Masters National Swimming Championship, April 13-14, at the Rosen Aquatic Center in Orlando, Florida.

Taylor, in her age group, won three gold medals for the 100-yard individual medley, 200-yard breaststroke, and 100-yard breaststroke. She also earned three silver medals for the 50-yard backstroke, 50-yard freestyle and the 200-yard IM; and two bronze medals for the 100-yard backstroke (3rd place) and the 50-yard butterfly (4th place).

Swimmers from YMCA's across the nation participated at the YMCA Masters National Swimming Championship, with Taylor representing the Islands Branch YMCA from Whitemarsh Island.

In addition to winning eight medals at Nationals, she broke five age-group Arkansas citizen's records in the 100 and 200 yard IMs, 100 and 200-yard breaststroke events and the 50-yard freestyle.

She broke a 26-year-old record in the 100-yard IM.

Taylor currently holds multiple records in the sport of swimming, to include 16 Arkansas age-group citizen's records, three South Carolina age-group state records, three Oklahoma age-group state records, and three Delmarva-league records in the state of Delaware.

Gomez said he is proud of his wife, noting besides being a full-time Army spouse and mother of three, she holds a Bachelor's Degree from Florida International University, a Master in Business Administration from Goldey-Beacon College, Delaware; but has help raise three children through multiple deployments.

"Never-the-less, she has managed to train, compete, and succeed at state and national championships, in events sanctioned by the National governing bodies U.S.A. Swimming and U.S. Masters Swimming," Gomez said proudly.

He added Taylor has listed 17 times in the U.S. Masters Swimming's Top 10 for the years 2005, 2017, and 2018, and continues to be ranked nationally, making the Army families proud.



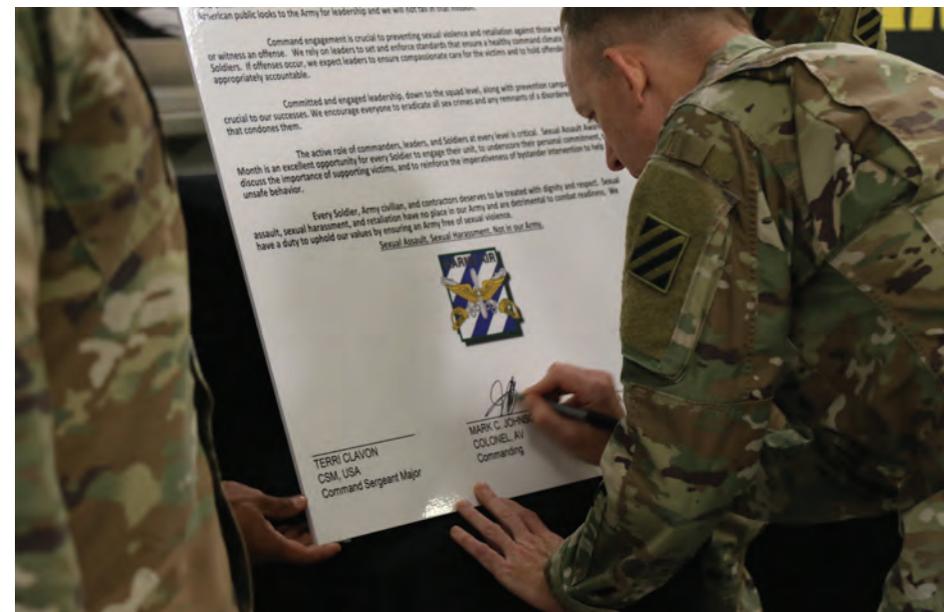

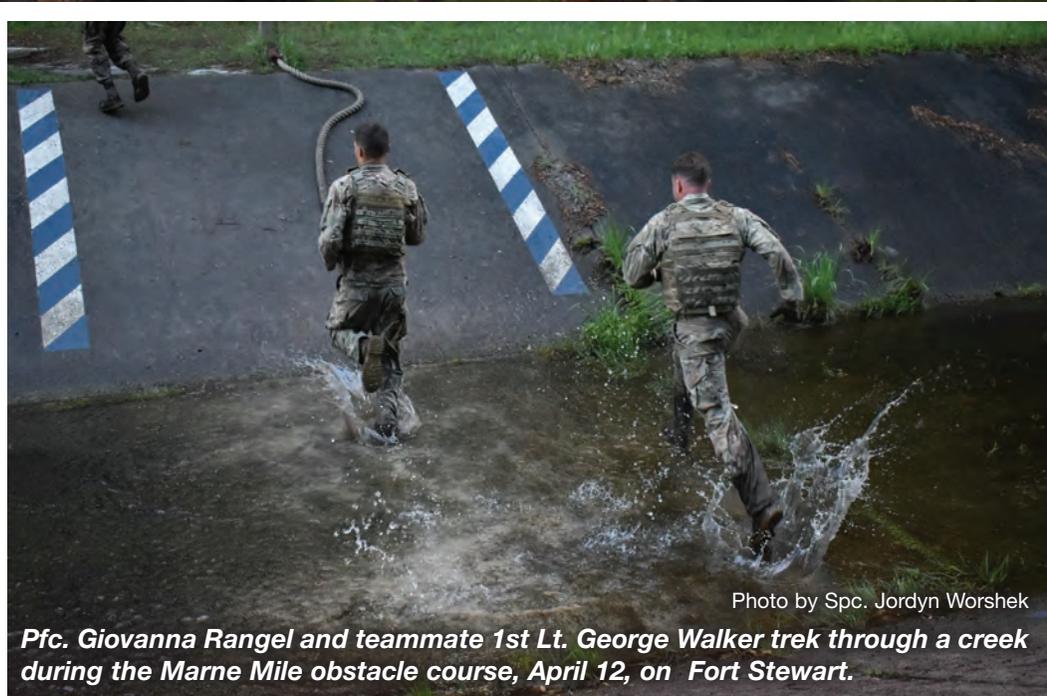
