Marne Air Soldier receives Purple Heart

Spc. Andrew Moseley, a Blackhawk helicopter repairer from 4th Battalion, 3rd Aviation Regiment, 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade, was awarded the Purple Heart Medal at Hunter Army Airfield, July 1.

Moseley was presented the Purple Heart for combat wounds received in action while on a flight mission to rescue a Special Forces team in Afghanistan in June 2018. Moseley received a bullet wound to the chest resulting in shrapnel wounds around the neck.

"I'm eternally thankful for my crew for getting me out of there when they did," said Moseley. "They truly did save my life."

Members of Moseley's family were also there to witness the medal presentation.

"I am so proud of him and I'm just so grateful that he made it home safely," said Sarah Tucker, Moseley's mother. "I thank my lucky stars every day that my son is still here with us."

Moseley received the Purple Heart Medal from the 3rd Infantry Division commanding general, Maj. Gen. Antonio Aguto.

"The personal courage that this

Soldier has truly amazed me," said Aguto. "Just two days after Moseley was wounded, he and his crew were out flying missions again. What a true testament to the Army values."

The Purple Heart Medal is awarded to members of the U.S. military who are injured, wounded or killed in action during combat operations. It is awarded by the President of the United States and is the oldest military medal given to service members.

"It's been a long road of recovery, but I have just been taking it one day at a time," said Moseley. "It's pretty significant to get this medal after what I have been through."

XVIII Airborne Corps announces Best NCO, Soldier

FORT BRAGG, North Carolina -- Bodies soaked in sweat. Fatigue clearly visible.

This was the weeklong image of Soldiers powering through the strenuous situational training exercises and physical tests of the 2019 XVIII Airborne Corps Noncommissioned Officer and Soldier of the Year Competition at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, June 24-28.

To prove they were the 2019 Dragon Warrior of the Year, representatives from the XVIII Airborne Corps' divisions and brigade separates were brought in after competing and winning at the division level.

"In the last five days, I've watched these soldiers push themselves to the limit and put everything on the table," said Command Sgt. Maj. Emilio Rivera, command sergeant major, Headquarters and Headquarters Battalion, Task Force Dragon, XVIII Airborne Corps. "They never gave up and pushed through with the maximum effort to succeed."

Day one's events included a graded layout of gear, the Army Combat Fitness Test, the Air Assault Obstacle Course and Combat Water Survival Training.

"My favorite part of the competition was the ruck, because I enjoy rucking, and it's something I have a passion for," said Spc. Nathan Brittain, Baker Battery, 321st Field Artillery Regiment, 18th Field Artillery Brigade. "The hardest part for me was swimming with full gear and the weapon. That part drug me down pretty good."

Day two picked up on some more Soldier skills as the competitors went through a day of situational training exercises. The lanes included a reaction to chemical attack, sending a situation report over the radio, evacuating a casualty, requesting a 9-line medical evacuation and reacting to direct and indirect contact. The lanes stretched over two miles long and kept competitors engaged and focused on new situations.

"The lanes sucked in the heat, but at the end, when you were done, it felt great," said Staff Sgt. Bijay Bastakoti, a cargo specialist with 403rd Inland Cargo Transfer Company, 330th Transportation Battalion, 3rd Expeditionary Sustainment Command. "That type of training takes a lot of preparation and time, but it will be great to be able to take that back to the Soldiers of my unit."

Day three was another blazing hot day with the heat index reaching 101 degrees, as the competitors moved to weapon qualifications on both the M9 pistol and the M4 carbine rifle. Rifle and pistol marksmanship was another graded event that the competitors had to excel at in order to win the competition. "To prepare for the competition, my unit helped a lot by scheduling time at the range and giving me some more practice with land navigation," Bastakoti said. "We could have pre-

pared a bit more for the ACFT and the Combat Water Survival Training-I'm not a swimmer-but I gave it my all and I didn't give up."

Before competitors made it out to the ranges and fired their weapons, another physical assessment was taken at 0630. They tackled the next challenge head on and competed against each other in the Soldier Readiness Test.

The SRT was originally proposed as the new Soldier physical fitness test, however the ACFT was eventually chosen to move forward. It includes flipping a tire six times, dragging a simulated casualty, lateral agility movements, loading a Humvee with equipment and completing an over-under obstacle at the middle point of a mile-and-a-half run.

"The STX and the SRT were things I was not very familiar with at all, but the cadre explained the events well," said Pfc. Jakob Wrolstad, a multichannel transmission systems operator-maintainer with 51st Expeditionary Signal Battalion, 35th Signal Brigade. "We were already dealing with fatigue, but we went out there and did the best we could."

As the third day concluded, competitors were tasked with a ruck march and the land navigation course. These are additional Soldier skills that the competitors were graded on and were used to determine the best Soldier and NCO. They rucked throughout the entire night and were tasked to finish the land navigation course before daylight of the next day.

"My favorite part was that we were all competing against each other, but we all worked together as a team," Bastakoti said. "And it doesn't matter if you didn't win, because this is a great learning experience that we can all use to become better leaders."

As the week came to an end, the competitors had a chance to rest up and prepare for the 0900 board on Friday. Their performance at the board would be the final graded event.

"The most important thing the Soldiers and NCOs take away from this

competition is how to compete at the highest level," said Rivera, the HHBn. Task Force Dragon CSM. "They are competing with the best of the best and must perform with the ultimate endurance, strength and perseverance."

After tallying up the scores from the week's events, Command Sgt. Maj. John Cervenka, Task Force Dragon command sergeant major, XVIII Airborne Corps announced the winners during the awards ceremony hosted at XVIII Abn. Corps Headquarters on Fort Bragg, N.C.

Staff Sgt. Mathew Whitney, 3rd Infantry Division is the 2019 XVIII Abn. Corps NCO of the Year.

Spc. Nicholas Callahan, 44th Medical Brigade, is the 2019 XVIII Abn. Corps Soldier of the Year.

Whitney and Callahan will move forward and compete at the 2019 United States Army Forces Command Best Warrior Competition later this year.

"When I was announced as the winner, I felt both relived and stressed out at the same time," Whitney said. "It's a big responsibility to represent the XVIII Airborne Corps [at the next competition], but at the same time I'm looking forward to it."

This new restriction was put in place per change 1 to DoDI 1341.13, Post-9/11 GI Bill, dated Friday. As a result of this change, ARNG Soldiers are highly encouraged to transfer their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits as soon as they become eligible (not flagged, have six or more years of service, and at least one eligible dependent in DEERS) to avoid missing out on this extremely generous family benefit. Pentagon inducts first living Iraq war vet into Hall of Heroes

WASHINGTON -- Former Staff Sgt. David Bellavia took his place Wednesday alongside more than 3,460 Medal of Honor recipients currently listed in the Pentagon's most sacred place: the Hall of Heroes.

A day after he received the Medal of Honor from President Donald J. Trump, his name was enshrined forever in the Hall of Heroes.

Bellavia displayed great bravery while serving as a squad leader in support of Operation Phantom Fury during the second battle of Fallujah, Nov. 10, 2004, according to a White House statement.

SHARING HONOR

Defense officials, including David Norquist, acting deputy secretary of Defense; Ryan McCarthy, senior defense official performing duties of the secretary of the Army; and Gen. James McConville, vice chief of staff of the Army, all participated in the dedication ceremony.

Bellavia joins a select group, McCarthy said, for demonstrating the willingness to go above and beyond the call of duty.

"We are humbled to have Soldiers of this stature among our ranks," McCarthy said.

The Hall of Heroes is intended to celebrate the nation's most honored service members with dignity and respect, Norquist said, adding Bellavia's rightful place is among them.

"Today we reflect on the true meaning of courage, service, and selflessness," Norquist said, and "honor a rare person who embodies them all."

However, Bellavia insisted the honor wasn't just his. On multiple occasions, he dedicated his Medal of Honor to his fellow Soldiers.

"It's for them," he said.

ACTIONS UNDER FIRE

While serving as a squad leader in Fallujah, Bellavia exposed himself to a storm of enemy bullets to save his platoon after they became pinned down by heavy machine-gun fire.

"The Soldiers took casualties" and others were trapped inside, McConville said, adding Bellavia "recognized the danger and took immediate action."

Bellavia, then with A-Company 2nd Battalion, 2nd Infantry Regiment, provided suppressive fire so his Soldiers had a chance to slip out of the house. Although he and his Soldiers escaped, the insurgents continued firing a barrage of gunfire.

During the second part of the battle, Bellavia called in a Bradley Fighting Vehicle for support, but its 25 mm caliber rounds were unable to penetrate the enemy-controlled building.

"Not knowing how many insurgents were still alive, David reacted with his M16," McConville said.

After assessing the situation, he reentered the darkened building. He knew he had to "destroy the enemy to protect his Soldiers," McConville said. "And that's exactly what he did."

The room was pitch black when he initially killed one insurgent as they were reloading their RPG launcher. Then shortly after, he shot and wounded a second insurgent as they fired at him from the kitchen.

Bellavia acted on "determination and instincts," McConville said. He killed multiple other enemy insurgents in close-combat.

He is credited for saving American Soldiers' lives and clearing an insurgent stronghold that night, above and beyond the call of duty. He is the first living service member from the war in Iraq to receive the nation's highest honor.

HIS OWN WORDS

"We defend, we avenge, we sacrifice, we bleed, and we are willing to die for this unique creation, the United States of America," Bellavia said, addressing the audience.

With his Medal of Honor on his chest, he continued to honor his fallen brothers during his speech.

"They gave their lives for me, for you, and for the countless citizens who will never know them."

As he concluded his address, he reminded the audience why "we fight."

"We fight so that anyone out there thinking about raising arms against our citizens or our allies realize the futility of attrition against a disciplined, professional, and lethal force built to withstand anything you can dream of throwing at us," he said.

Americans want this kind of country, he said, and stand ready to defend it.

DIVARTY unveils Wall of Honor to memorialize their fallen

3rd Infantry Division Artillery unveiled a Wall of Honor during a ceremony June 28, at their headquarters, to memorialize 40 DIVARTY Soldiers who made the ultimate sacrifice during Operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom.

Soldiers, Family members and friends and were on hand to solemnly remember the fallen, and to view the new memorial just inside the headquarters entrance.

Chap. (Maj.) Archie N. Durham, DIVARTY chaplain, opened the ceremony with an invocation reflecting on the lives and loved ones of those killed in action. He noted the importance of demonstrating to current service members that they will never be forgotten and to Family members, that their sacrifices will never be taken for granted.

Following the playing of the National Anthem by the 3rd ID Band, Pvt. Alexander Owens, assigned to DIVARTY, read Kathleen Mills' poem, "Honor", a promise to the fallen, that they will be remembered.

In his speech during the ceremony, Col. Robert W. Marshall, DIVARTY commander, recalled a line from the poem, which spoke of a vow "to carry the torch of free-

dom," was fitting for their ceremony of remembrance.

"That is the challenge to us all: to remember them, to be inspired by them and to carry the torch because they cannot," Marshall said. "In their honor, I ask that you challenge yourselves to be better than you were yesterday, and to be better than today, tomorrow."

Before the unveiling of the Wall of Honor, Sgt. 1st Class Alejandro Rodriguez, a fire control master gunner with DIVARTY, solemnly read the 40 names of the fallen. A program was also provided with information about each of those remembered during the ceremony.

Although it was a team effort, Staff Sgt. Sean F. McCormick, DIVARTY religious affairs noncommis-

sioned officer-in-charge, played an important role in seeing the Wall of Honor project to completion.

For McCormick, the project was therapeutic for he lost a friend who was killed during a deployment to Iraq.

"This ceremony and the Wall of Honor is important because all Soldiers who gave the ultimate sacrifice should be honored and remembered," McCormick said.

The Wall of Honor provides those who enter the DIVARTY headquarters building a reminder of the enormous sense of duty and selfless service of those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice. It serves as a source of inspiration for those who continue to serve.

As I said before, you never know how you may be a blessing to others or how others may be a blessing to you.


The Bible talks a lot about people being a blessing to one another. One example that comes to mind for me is the account of Elijah and the widow (*1 Kings 17*).

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756th EOD robot clears suspicious package at Hunter commissary

A suspicious package caused the evacuation of the Hunter commissary at around 8:30 a.m. June 9.

The package was located behind the commissary by a commissary employee.

"The package seemed suspicious because it was a crate and not cardboard, as are most deliveries to the commissary," said Marites Pennington, Hunter commissary director. "Our receiver brought it to my attention, I looked at it and I called the military police desk. They sent MPs here before I was even off the phone."

Shortly thereafter the Hunter Fire Department was on the scene and Pennington evacuated the commissary.

The 756th Explosive Ordnance Disposal was requested from Fort Stewart.

EOD personnel sent their remote-controlled robot to where the package was located, while they observed its appearance via the robot's cameras.

First Lieutenant Joshua Coll, platoon leader, sent one of his Soldiers forward in a bomb suit with detonation cord. When the Soldier returned to a safe distance from the package, it was deto-


nated. After it was learned the crate only contained packaging material such as Styrofoam and bubble wrap, Coll declared the site safe.

"I'm proud of the manner in which commissary personnel handled this matter," said Lt. Col. Dave Escobar, Hunter garrison commander. "They were vigilant and knew to not handle the suspicious package and to call emergency responders. Our police, fire and EOD personnel responded quickly and appropriately," Escobar added with a sense of pride.

Robotic combat vehicles could change way Army looks, fights

AUSTIN, Texas -- Similar to how a boxer with a longer reach finds it easier to hit an opponent, the Army is looking to punch through the standoff defenses of near-peer adversaries.

Army Futures Command is behind many of the Army's efforts to achieve that overmatch, which include over 30 projects within its Cross-Functional Teams that are responsible for tackling modernization priorities.

While speaking at the International Armored Vehicles USA conference Tuesday, Gen. John Murray, the AFC commander, noted robotic combat vehicles as one endeavor that could help Soldiers knock out defenses.

During a Joint Warfighting Assessment in May, Murray observed Soldiers and Marines conducting defensive and attack maneuvers using breacher vehicles with robotic capabilities at Yakima Training Center in Washington.

By fiscal year 2023, he said he expects "critical decisions" to be made on robotic combat vehicles after years of experimentation.

"If there's one single thing I think that will change fundamentally the way we look and the way we fight," he said, "is the possibility of deploying robotic combat

vehicles in the future, either completely autonomous or semi-autonomous as wingmen."

This fall, proposals are also due from industry partners on their ideas for the Optionally Manned Fighting Vehicle, which will replace Bradley Fighting Vehicles starting in 2026.

AFC officially stood up last year, he said, after the Army missed a generation of modernization while fighting for years in counterinsurgency campaigns.

Representing the most significant Army reorganization effort since 1973, the command was created to prepare for the ongoing waves of changes in warfare.

"The Army fundamentally woke up and realized that we have missed the wave," he said. "They were crashing on the shore and we were about chest deep in water."

China and Russia, he said, took note of how the Army waged war and developed anti-access/area denial capabilities to separate Army units and their partners on the battlefield.

"Where we have been is no longer good enough," said Maj. Gen. Gary Brito, head of the Army Maneuver Center of Excellence. "The operational environment, threat and technology are driving us to change."

Today's potential adversaries, Brito said, have expanded the battlefield in four ways: time, domains, geography and nontraditional actors.

While less kinetic, the space, electronic warfare and cyber activities that they use are still effective, he said.

The Army's new multi-domain operations concept, which leaders said could start becoming doctrine in the next year or two, is finding ways to defeat those capabilities.

"Multi-domain operations is here to stay," Brito said. "We cannot put our heads in the dirt."

Whether autonomous or not, he added next-generation combat vehicles will need to be innovative, agile, flexible and adaptive in order to succeed in a more chaotic and dispersed battlefield.

Senior Army leaders, including Murray, realigned nearly \$30 billion over the next five years to modernization programs, such as combat vehicles.

"If we don't do it now, we'll probably be in [M1 Abrams tanks], Bradleys and [M113 armored personnel carriers] in 2035," he said. "We just knew we couldn't do that. We were behind."

The character of war is changing, he explained, which is compounded by the proliferation of technology that is also available to adversaries.

"The rate of technological innovation will continue to increase at an ever-accelerating pace," he said. "We're not going to be able to slow it down. We're going to have to figure out how to adapt to that rate of innovation."
