

SFL-TAP helps transition Soldiers with Ryder training

The Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield Soldier for Life – Transition Assistance Program career skills program announced the graduation of five transitioning service members through Ryder's new facility in Savannah.

The service members received 12 weeks of instructions in do things the Ryder Way. The Ryder training focuses on safety as a priority and integrates class room instructions with hands-on experience.

Following the class, graduates can start their new careers as Level 2 technicians.

The instructors have prepared them and their families to transition from military service to the next phase of their lives.

This group will go on to positions with their new Ryder families in Ohio, West Virginia, Texas, Florida and Savannah.

"I am very happy for these Service Members, said Katrina Everett, CSP installation administrator at

Hunter. "Graduations with 100% job placement add meaning to my job. This is why I come to work every day."

This graduation was only the first of the Ryder-Savannah career skills programs, according to Everett. She said they have a full September class and will have more cohorts in the upcoming months.

Are you ready for the civilian workforce? The SFL-TAPs career skills program has numerous options available to assist in coordinating job skills training, employment training, apprenticeships and internships for up to 120 days during a Service Member's final 180 days on active duty.

Local certifications include commercial driver's license; project management professional; Cisco networking; occupational safety and health administration; heating, ventilation, and air conditioning, salesforce and more!



Fort Stewart honors missing and captured service members

Three veterans in Vietnam War-era olive drab fatigues stood at parade rest as the 2019 observance honoring services members held as prisoners of war or missing in action kicked off at Fort Stewart's Marne Garden Sept. 20.

Veterans from Liberty County, Fort Stewart Soldiers, civilians and family members gathered to recognize the thousands of service members who remain missing from all of the nation's wars.

National POW/MIA Recognition Day is held annually on the third Friday of September. The day honoring missing and captured service members was established in 1979 by President Jimmy Carter and Congress.

The observance included setting the fallen service member table. Fort Stewart garrison senior enlisted leader, Command Sgt. Maj. Rebecca Myers, read the speech detailing each piece of the display.

"This table is set for one, and small, symbolizing the frailty of one prisoner alone against his oppressors," Myers said.

During the setting of the table, Myers said 72,661 World War II veterans; 2,616 Korean War veterans; 1,587 Vietnam War veterans; 126 Cold War veterans; five Gulf War veterans; and one Global War on Terrorism veteran remain missing.

Members of the Vietnam Veterans of America chapter 789 read the names of service members from across Georgia who remain unaccounted for.

Fort Stewart garrison commander Col. Bryan Logan thanked the Liberty County Vietnam veter-

ans for putting together the ceremony. He also reiterated the reason for the observance.

"Today we get to honor a very special group of Americans, our nation's prisoners of war and missing in action," Logan said. "These patriots suffered cruel confinement. Others still remain missing, their fates unknown."

The Department of Defense takes the mission of repatriating missing service members seriously and created a command to find the missing, Logan said.

"Accounting for these Americans continues to be our nation's highest priority," he said. "The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency was established with the mission to provide the fullest accounting procedures for America's missing. Their motto, appropriately, is 'until they are all home.'"

The symbol of POW/MIA Recognition Day appropriately echoes that sentiment with the words "you are not forgotten," Logan said.

"This reminds us that our nation's work is not done, that our commitment remains steadfast," he said. "It is our duty as Americans to remember our nation's heroes who have never failed to answer the call to defend their country or to secure freedom for oppressed people in other lands."

Retired sergeant major and VVA member Adna Chaffee said coming together every year on the third Friday of September to remember missing service members is a touchstone to our military's past.

"We need to remember where we came from," Chaffee said. "We can't forgot those who served before us, no matter what."



TRICARE holds open season

Tricare open season is the annual period when you can enroll in or change your health plan for the next year. The 2019 Tricare open season begins Nov. 11 and ends Dec. 9.

During Tricare open season, you can choose to do nothing. If you want to stay in your current Tricare health care plan, you don't have to take any action. You'll continue in your current health plan through 2020 or as long as you're eligible.

Enroll in a plan. If you're eligible for a Tricare Prime option or Tricare Select but not enrolled, you can enroll in a plan now.

Change plans. If you're already enrolled in a Tricare Prime option, or Tricare Select, you can switch plans and switch between individual and family enrollment.

What Happens if I Don't Take Any Action? If you aren't already in a plan and don't enroll in a plan, you'll only be eligible for care at a military hospital or clinic if space is available.

Outside of Tricare open season, you can enroll in or change enrollment to Tricare Prime or Tricare Select following a qualifying life event. A QLE is a certain change in your life, such as marriage, birth of a child, or retirement from active duty, which may mean different Tricare options are available to you. A Tricare QLE opens a 90-day period for you to make eligible enrollment changes. A QLE for one Family member means all Family members may make enrollment changes.

To learn more, visit www.tricare.mil/lifevents. Outside of the Federal Benefits Open Season, you may only make changes to your existing FEDVIP plan if you experience a FEDVIP QLE. Remember, FEDVIP QLEs may be different from the TRICARE QLEs.

Education benefits transferability change

All actively serving members of the armed forces who have 16 or more years of service will no longer be able to transfer their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits to their dependents. This new restriction was put in place per change 1 to DoDI 1341.13, Post-9/11 GI Bill, dated Friday. As a result of this change, Army National Guard Soldiers are highly encouraged to transfer their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits as soon as they become eligible (not flagged, have six or more years of service, and at least one eligible dependent in DEERS) to avoid missing out on this extremely generous family benefit. Public Health Alert: lung illness associated with e-cigarette use

As of Sept. 6, more than 450 possible cases of a severe lung illness associated with e-cigarette products have been reported across multiple states. One person has died from the illness. All of the patients reported recent use of e-cigarette products, and many stated using devices containing cannabinoid products such as tetrahydrocannabinol or cannabidiol. Symptoms of the illness appear over the course of a few days to several weeks and include difficulty breathing, coughing, shortness of breath and/or chest pain. Some individuals also reported mild to moderate vomiting, diarrhea and fatigue.

Although the specific cause of the illness remains unknown, all reported cases include recent e-cigarette or vaping product use. The aerosol from e-cigarettes and vaping products can contain a variety of harmful or potentially harmful ingredients. Also, the contents of e-cigarette and vaping liquids are not highly regulated and can vary from product to product. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration is working with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and state health departments to collect information on products used by individuals affected by this outbreak.

Until a cause is determined, Soldiers and their family members who do not currently use tobacco products are encouraged to avoid all e-cigarette or vaping products, particularly those sold off the street or modified to add any substances not intended by the manufacturer. Do not use e-cigarettes in ways unintended by the makers, like dripping or dabbing. Dripping is when users drop e-cigarette solvents onto the device's hot coils, resulting in more concentrated compounds. Dabbing is when substances containing high levels of THC or CBD are superheated in the device. Adult smokers who are attempting to quit by using e-cigarettes should consult their healthcare provider for consideration of evidence-based alternative methods. If you use e-cigarette or vaping products, monitor yourself for signs of respiratory or gastrointestinal distress and seek prompt medical attention if you experience the indicators described above or any other abnormal symptoms. The Directorate of Human Resources Administrative Services Division on Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield provides a series of key operational tasks essential for the effective and efficient operations of the installation.

The ASD's main functions consist of Freedom of Information Act/Privacy Act support, safety, security, operations, training, mail and distribution, supply, information technology, data analysis, and continuous process improvement.

While all functions of the DHR are critical, the duties of the ASD involves comprehensive activities that have an impact on the entire directorate.

Under the leadership of the Director of Human Resources, Tom Allmon and the Chief of ASD, James Ervin, the ASD executes each task effectively and efficiently.

The mission of the ASD supports the installation in meeting its goals through its most valuable resource - its people. They focus on answering two questions; are we doing the right things and are we doing the right things right? Currently composed of ten team members, each individual carries out their tasks and functions with the mission in mind.

The ASD on Fort Stewart provides functions in two facilities, the Soldier Service Center and the Official Mail and Distribution Center. The functions are

performed on Hunter at the OMDC.

Indirectly working with Soldiers, the ASD ensures effective operations as well as maintaining the safety and security of Soldiers and Families utilizing the facility. Additionally, it ensures quality service is maintained while the Soldiers and Families are being serviced at the Soldier Service Center.

In order for other organizations within the Soldier Service Center to perform their job, the ASD provides IT services that allow systems to function properly, and necessary supplies are provided for employees to perform their job. The ASD collects information from other components of the directorate and analyzes the data to ensure continuous process improvements continue throughout the DHR.

The ASD tracks training and guarantees each DHR employee has completed the necessary training in accordance with applicable guidance. The ASD also provides FOIA/PA services for the entire installation to assist Soldiers, Family members, civilian employees, and any customer that is needing information pertaining to the installation. Directly working with Soldiers, the OMDC provides mail services to include incoming and outgoing mail services. The ASD employees at the OMDC inspect every mailroom located on the installations to comply with Army Regulations.

The ASD team members are competent and motivated to provide essential services for the directorate and its customers.

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Help support Suicide Prevention Awareness Month, every month

While September is the month that Soldiers and organizations across Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield bring awareness to suicide prevention, the installation offers year-round support to all Soldiers, dependents, civilians, and contractors who need help.

The Army and the installation's suicide prevention program is incredibly robust; however, the culture needs to change.

"To remove the stigma, we have to shift the culture," said Dr. Travis G. Morgan, behavioral health clinical team lead for the Division Artillery and 3rd Sustainment Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division. "Changing the culture has to start from all levels, top, bottom, and middle. It is tremendously important to saving a life."

There are numerous programs, initiatives, and efforts across the installation, designed to assist Soldiers who are having a hard time coping with Family, work, and everyday life; as well as suicidal ideation.

"We have behavioral health specialists, Army Community Service, Military Family Life Consultants, legal, chain of command, and chaplains that can assist Soldiers in need," said Morgan.

Morgan stated that his clinic deals with Soldiers; however, if anyone comes to his clinic with suicidal ideation, they would receive help.

Every Soldier, dependent, and civilian on the installation has a responsibility and commitment to reach out by helping those who are at risk of suicide.

"Effective suicide prevention requires every Soldier, Family members, and civilians to be aware of the signs for suicide and know how to respond," said Maj. (Chaplain) William Robinson, 3rd ID deputy chaplain. "Soldiers should look for significant life changes."

The signs of suicide include, but are not limited to:

- Threats to harm oneself or others.
- Buying or seeking firearms and pills.
- Talking or writing about death or suicide.
- Feeling hopeless or trapped.
- Increased drug and alcohol use.
- Engaging in reckless and risky behavior.

- Outburst of rage, anger or dramatic mood changes

- Withdrawing from work, society, family, and/or friends

"You have to have a relationship with the people before asking a question like 'Do you want to harm yourself,'" said Robinson. "This sort of question should be asked by someone who has intimate knowledge about the Soldier, like a team leader or squad leader."

If a person is suicidal, the time to take action is now start by employing the three components of ACE: Ask, Care, and Escort.

ASK - Each person has the responsibility to ask your buddy if they have thoughts of harming themselves.

CARE- Care for them in a time of need by removing them from the environment and potentially harmful items, actively listen, stay calm, and control the situation. Escort your buddy — Never leave your buddy alone.

ESCORT: Escort the individual to someone who can help them. This may include their chain of command or supervisor, Military Family Life Consultant, a chaplain, primary care provider, or a behavioral health professional.

Soldiers don't need to face the world alone; there are events on Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield that can help create a sense of community.

"Soldiers want to be part of something," said Robinson. "There are a lot of events within our community that helps build relationships and bonds between groups of people. Most people need to just put their phones down, build real relationships, and be connected to each other."

With these connected relationships, battle buddies are usually the first to notice high risk and behavioral changes. Lend a hand to those in need by getting them to a professional who can help.



Fires coordination exercise develops junior officers, builds cohesive crews

The Desert Rogues of 1st Battalion, 64th Armored Regiment, 1st Brigade Combat Team, have a saying, "Get better every day". It is a catchphrase that affirms the motivation and commitment the unit has for getting the most out of training opportunities.

In preparation for upcoming platoon live-fire exercises, 1-64 Armor, conducted a fire coordination exercise, Sept. 18-20, focused on developing its platoon leaders to be effective leaders on the battlefield.

"This is a leaders validation for live fire," said Lt. Col. Alex Perez-Cruz, commander of 1-64 Armor. "It allows platoon leaders to understand how to integrate all war-fighting functions and ensures that they understand how to use all the resources that are at their disposal."

For this exercise, those resources included M1 Abrams tanks, Bradley Fighting Vehicles, machine guns, mortars, and howitzers. Platoon leaders used what they had learned from several months of weekly officer professional development sessions to position each weapon system and to maneuver to an objective.

"We're learning how to synchronize and layer fires and be able to work with all the different enablers and assets available as a tank commander," said 2nd Lt. Chuka Ufomadu, an armor officer and platoon leader assigned to 1-64 Armor. "We had to figure a lot of things out on the fly which is very important for mission success."

Platoon leaders were tasked with maneuvering their assets toward an objective using proper cover of movement techniques. Upon reaching pre-determined phase lines, platoon leaders called for indirect fires from 120mm mortar teams to suppress the enemy on the objective. At the final phase line, within sight of the objective, platoon leaders used their direct fire weapon systems to destroy the enemy.

Although the focus of the exercise was validating the capabilities of platoon leaders, the training provided

crucial opportunities for growth for their Noncommissioned Officers and Soldiers as well.

"My crew benefitted a lot," Ufomadu said. "I learned a lot about my platoon just from spending time with them in the field. It definitely helps us become a more cohesive team. We get to know each other a little better, and understand each other's temperaments."

Spc. Carlos Jimenez, a tank crewman assigned to 1-64 Armor, was responsible for ensuring his tank was properly maintained leading up to the exercise, and that his crew is physically and mentally ready to fight.

"As long as we remember our training and we're in the right mentality; cool, calm, and collected; we're going to be alright and accomplish the mission,"

Jimenez said. "I feel confident. We work effectively as a team. It's good to get out in the field and train and build cohesion among the Soldiers."

Ufomadu is confident, too.

"It's only going to get better from here," he said. "We wrote down the areas we need improvement in, and also areas we need to sustain. So we'll make those improvements for subsequent runs and keep improving on what we are already good at."

For Perez-Cruz, his platoon leaders and their crews are meeting the goal of getting better every day.

"I'm super proud," said Perez-Cruz. "We're improving every day. These Soldiers are showing what it means to be a Rock of the Marne Soldier."
