# Spartan Brigade set for DEFENDER-Europe 20

Soldiers from the 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, will be part of the largest deployment of U.S.-based forces to Europe for an exercise in the last 25 years.

DEFENDER-Europe 20 will increase strategic readiness and interoperability by exercising the U.S. military's ability to rapidly deploy a large combat-credible force and equipment from the United States to Europe; and alongside its allies and partners, quickly respond to a potential crisis.

DEFENDER-Europe 20 confirms that the U.S. commitment to NATO and the defense of Europe remains ironclad.

The joint, multinational training exercise is scheduled to take place from April to May 2020, with personnel and equipment movements occurring from February

through July 2020. The exercise supports objectives defined by NATO to build readiness between allies and partners, and deter potential adversaries.

Approximately 37,000 U.S., allied, and partner nation service members are expected to participate with roughly 4,000 coming from Fort Stewart's Spartan Brigade.

"This exercise is a great opportunity to highlight the 3rd Infantry Division's readiness and ability to deploy forces in support of our Nation's operations," said Maj. Gen. Tony Aguto, commander, 3rd ID. "Our Dogface Soldiers are trained, ready and extremely excited to be a part of this historic exercise."

This will be the first overseas exercise for the "Spartan" Brigade since they converted from an infantry brigade combat team to an armored brigade combat team last year. At

the completion of their conversion they completed a rotation to the National Training Center at Fort Irwin, California.

# 3rd ID CG shares information regarding accident

3rd Infantry Division commander, Maj. Gen. Antonio Aguto, accompanied by Michael Barksdale, the ground mishap investigator with the Army Combat Readiness Center on Fort Rucker, Alabama held a press conference Oct. 21 to share information about a training incident on Fort Stewart Oct. 20, where three Soldiers died and three more were injured.

A visibly moved Aguto released the names of those killed in the incident, including Sgt. 1st Class Bryan Jenkins, 41, of Gainesville, Florida; Cpl Thomas Walker, 22, of Conneaut, Ohio, and Pfc. Antonio Garcia, 21, of Peoria, Arizona.

"This is a tragic and devastating day for our community and nation," Aguto said. "These brave Soldiers gave everything for their nation, including their lives."

He thanked everyone from across the nation and world for keeping the Soldiers in their thoughts and prayers and expressed his most sincere condolences to the families and friends of those injured and killed.

Although the incident remains under investigation, Aguto said the M2 Bradley Fighting Vehicle, with its six occupants, was part of a company level movement around 3:20 a.m., when it left a bridge, rolling over into the water. He said they were maneuvering with their company as part of 2nd Battalion, 7th Infantry Regiments, train-up for the 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team's rotation to the National Training

Center on Fort Irwin, California. The three injured Soldiers were evacuated to Winn Army Community Hospital on Fort Stewart. Two were treated and released the same day and the third was transferred to Memorial Hospital in Savannah, where he was reported in stable condition.

Aguto said while training is tough, realistic and occurs in various terrains and weather conditions on Fort Stewart, safety is always a factor – and would be part of the investigation. He said leaders try to identify threats and mitigate them, but hopes to gather additional feedback from the investigation.

Barksdale said the field report would take about three to four weeks, then the reports would be provided back to the commander and eventually to the Army Combat Readiness Center.

Aguto said the installation has a number of resources to help the affected Soldiers and Family members, including behavioral health counselors, chaplains and casualty assistance officers.

"We are extremely saddened by the loss of three Dogface Soldiers and injuries to three more," Aguto said. "Our hearts and prayers go out to all the families affected by this tragedy."

The 1nd ABCT commander, Col. Trent Upton later said Jenkins, Walker and Garcia's loss was terrible for their families and the members of the unit too.

"The loss of any Soldier is always tragic, but losing multiple Soldiers only hurts that much more and affects the entire unit," Upton said. "Our thoughts and prayers are with the Families and we are working through this extremely difficult time and doing our best to support those affected by this tragedy."

# 48th IBCT uncasing ceremony celebrates redeployment

The 48th Infantry Brigade Combat Team hosted an uncasing ceremony at the Georgia National Guard Headquarters in Macon, Oct. 20.

The ceremony symbolized the unit's return home from a nine-month deployment to Afghanistan in support of Operation Freedom's Sentinel and NATO Operation Resolute Support.

The ceremony also marks the 48th IBCT's fourth return from combat since Sept. 11, 2001. The brigade

deployed in January of 2019 and returned in October 2019. The Afghanistan Campaign Transition II streamer was added to the brigade colors during the ceremony to honor their successful deployment.

"This event marks the closing of yet another significant chapter in the brigade's growth," said Col. Matthew Smith, commander of the 48th IBCT. "Each of these chapters serves to make our leaders and Soldiers better professionals who are more capable, lethal and survivable on the modern battlefield."

The 48th IBCT's mission is to mobilize, conduct pre-mobilization training and deploying rapidly to any contingency area – at home or abroad – by air, sea or land; whether in support of the governor during state emergencies or in conjunction with combined offensive and defensive operations worldwide.

Maj. Gen. Thomas M. Carden, the Georgia National Guard Adjutant General, attended and spoke on behalf of the Georgia National Guard.

"Seeing these colors uncased today is more than a ceremony and more than a symbol," said Carden. "It's an opportunity to thank these outstanding Soldiers and those they represent; their Family and this amazing community."

Future efforts by the 48th IBCT will be to continue reset procedures while conducting monthly and annual readiness training.

All actively serving members of the armed forces who have 16 or more years of service will no longer be able to transfer their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits to their dependents. This new restriction was put in place per change 1 to DoDI 1341.13, Post-9/11 GI Bill, dated Friday. As a result of this change, Army National Guard Soldiers are highly encouraged to transfer their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits as soon as they become eligible (not flagged, have six or more years of service, and at least one eligible dependent in DEERS) to avoid missing out on this extremely generous family benefit. ### TRICARE holds open season

Tricare open season is the annual period when you can enroll in or change your health plan for the next year. The 2019 Tricare open season begins Nov. 11 and ends Dec. 9. During Tricare open season, you can choose to do nothing. If you want to stay in your current Tricare health care plan, you don't have to take any action.

**Enroll in a plan.** If you're eligible for a Tricare Prime option or Tricare Select but not enrolled, you can enroll in a plan now.

**Change plans.** If you're already enrolled in a Tricare Prime option, or Tricare Select, you can switch plans and switch between individual and family enrollment.

**What Happens if I Don't Take Any Action?** If you aren't already in a plan and don't enroll in a plan, you'll only be eligible for care at a military hospital or clinic if space is available.

Outside of Tricare open season, you can enroll in or change enrollment to Tricare Prime or Tricare Select following a qualifying life event. A QLE is a certain change in your life, such as marriage, birth of a child, or retirement from active duty, which may mean different Tricare options are available to you. A Tricare QLE opens a 90-day period for you to make eligible enrollment changes. A QLE for one Family member means all Family members may make enrollment changes.

To learn more, visit [www.tricare.mil/lifeevents](http://www.tricare.mil/lifeevents). Outside of the Federal Benefits Open Season, you may only make changes to your existing FEDVIP plan if you experience a FEDVIP QLE. Remember, FEDVIP QLEs may be different from the TRICARE QLEs.

# UPAR academy empowers units to tell their stories

Twenty-four Soldiers from across the 3rd Infantry Division attended the quarterly Unit Public Affairs Representative Course at the Sgt. 1st Class R. Paul Smith Education Center at Fort Stewart, Oct. 16-18.

Appointed by their battalion commanders as an additional duty, UPARs from a smattering of military occupational specialties learned the fundamentals of the public affairs framework and acquired media tools to tell their units' stories at the lowest level.

While MOS-designated public affairs personnel operate at the brigade and division echelons, companies, troops, squadrons, and battalions can message their commander's intent through print and social media.

This year, the UPAR Academy, administered by 3rd ID's Public Affairs team, certified approximately 150 Soldiers on public affairs related task to include, Associated Press-style news writing, operational security adherence, and interviewing techniques. Representatives discussed implementation of best practices encountered in class, specifically how to message unit priorities and commander's intent.

Master Sgt. Shelia Cooper, 3rd ID senior enlisted public affairs, explained how the UPAR program structure thrives on this proximity and diversity, on the fact that units have differing priorities and intent:

"We only have so many MOS-qualified mass communication specialists at headquarters so the battalions and line companies provide coverage to help tell the Army story. We empower proficient produc-

ers who are close to the action and can display an array of viewpoints."

Cooper added, "Every soldier is a sensor and every soldier is a source, especially given the quality of content that smartphones can now produce."

In fact, UPAR instructors focused on cross-leveling print and digital skills and as a result, have refined the curriculum to emphasize videography techniques for smartphones. The instructors delivered an entire block of instruction on smartphone video production and editing to include tips on tailoring video to certain social media platforms and target audiences.

UPARs from 6th Squadron, 8th Cavalry Regiment, Sgt. Raymundo Prado and Spc. David Kraman, said they felt the video class was particularly helpful and that they look forward to experimenting with different video styles in both a garrison environment and a forward deployed one. Prado and Kraman said they both hope to support contingency operations overseas at some point in their careers.

"Of course, I'm dying to put a GoPro on one of our Bradleys during live fire exercises," Prado said.

"I like the idea of getting creative to mine the product and polish the product. It'd also be an incredible opportunity to try that out abroad and capture interaction between U.S. forces and foreign partners, as well as local nationals."

"We're used to being with the forward line of troops as scouts, conducting reconnaissance and security," Kraman added. "UPAR duties challenge us to deliver timely and accurate reports for our battalion and Families in a similar way on a variety of topics."

Though he was surprised to be appointed UPAR,

Kraman agreed with the program structure.

"Giving regular Soldiers the chance to tell stories promotes diversity of skill," Kraman added. "Diversity of skill is one of the Army's greatest strengths."

E-Kit has made it easier to set-up the antenna for communications, the new integrated mass antenna can be set-up, broken down in five minutes and rolled up in cylinder for quick and easy storage.

“The overall achievements of the technology expo were to give Soldiers and civilians a better understanding on how technology will be used in the communication field. The tech expo event was to inform the installation on how to Network Enterprise Center works,” said Leichman. “It was a great opportunity to see how Soldiers and civilians worked with the tech expo.”

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
# BOOM! 92nd Engineers begins training cycle with a bang

The 530th Clearance Company, 92nd Engineer Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division, conducted a five-part demolition range training event at the Engineers Qualification Area, Oct. 17, on Fort Stewart.

The demo range challenged combat engineers to regain their confidence, enhance their technical proficiency and prepare themselves for missions overseas through a confidence blast, timber cutting, urban breaching, cratering and steel cutting.

“Practicing with demo will make combat engineers more effective in three main [focus] areas: mobility, counter mobility, and survivability,” said 1st Lt. Zachary Butler, the officer in charge of the demolition range, assigned to 530th Clearance Co.

“The biggest thing for a range like this is to aid the combat engineers in becoming technically and tactically proficient through the use of the skills learned in advanced individual training and assessing how they would employ these charges in different scenarios,” said Butler.

A back to basics approach reassures the Soldiers of the knowledge they acquired throughout their AIT training and reminded them of what steps are necessary to successfully prepare and detonate charges made up of detonation cord, composition C-4 and other explosives, said Butler.

Before any explosions went off, the combat engineers prepared their C-4 and got their measurements ready for a clean and accurate demolition.

“We determine how many inches of det-cord is needed for the specific training portion and how much explosive per inch is needed to determine the minimal safe distance for the Soldier detonating,” said Sgt. Joseph Rice, a combat engineer assigned to 530th Clearance Co. and one of the safety operators on the range.

“All of that goes into confidence building for these Soldiers to feel sure about the actions they’re taking here and on the battlefield,” said Rice.

According to Rice, one of the goals for the leadership was to guide the Soldiers into feeling more

confident about making mistakes and using them as springboards to success.

“Fear, that’s the biggest thing. We’re using explosives and materials that if you make the wrong move, apply the wrong pressure, you can detonate the explosives and those are our fellow engineer’s lives that may be lost, to include civilians also,” said Spc. Lamar Jelks, a combat engineer assigned to 530th Clearance Co. and one of the safety operators on the range.

“Putting my trust into the non-commissioned officers on the ground, and engaging the mission knowing that you have been set-up for success while paying attention to the little things prevents the things I and other combat engineers fear happening,” said Jelks.

This demolition range kicks off the training cycle for the 92nd Engineers Battalion who have recently returned from supporting the Special Operations Joint Task Force-Operation Inherent Resolve mission, fighting Daesh, in the Middle East.

Their support of SOJTF-OIR consisted of route clearance and various other projects depending on their locations in Syria, Iraq and Afghanistan.

Fiscal Year 20 will contain various training missions for the 92nd Eng. Bn., preparing their Soldiers for future missions in austere environments.

“On an individual and team level, this type of training continues to ensure that combat engineers lead the way on enhancing the 3rd Infantry Division and the Army’s warfighting position through demolitions,” said Butler.







# Clearing the way with combined arms training

Soldiers of the 9th Brigade Engineer Battalion, 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, completed a combined arms training exercise last week named Gila Focus. The exercise tested unit readiness, and prepared 2nd Battalion, 69th Armored Regiment, 2ABCT, for their upcoming Panther Focus on Fort Stewart, Oct. 8.

9BEB joined forces with 2-69 Armor to conduct a breach and allow their vehicles and troops to advance forward on the battlefield, simulating crossing a body of water.

"The concept is to train the maneuver forces along with the engineer forces on a combined arms breach. 2-69 Armor provides support by fire and obscuration allowing for our engineers to move forward and remove any mined obstacles, bridging a wet gap and destroying a wire obstacle," said Capt. Christopher Kletzien, Co. A, 9BEB commander.

Spc. Martin Romo, 9BEB, said that clearing the mined obstacle required the use of the Mine Clearing Line Charge, which is fired from an Assault Breacher Vehicle.

"The MICLIC fires up to 100 meters with charged explosives attached to the wire that upon landing can cause a chain reaction to create an 8-meter gap to allow for infantry and armored vehicles to pass," said Romo.

Sgt. Motice Turner, 9BEB team leader, says that's where the explosive bangalores come in.

"The bangalores which are primarily used to clear wired obstacles can be interconnected with another Bangalore depending on what we need to move," said Turner.

After the breach, they completed train-

ing with a movement through the obstacle.

Kletzien added, "The biggest challenge was being able to capitalize on the opportunity to synchronize engineers with a maneuver force together and working through the different challenges, tactics, techniques, and procedures. You learn what the other unit is thinking and doing thus being able to predict their next action the more we train together."

Our Jerusalems have to be entered, dealt with and conquered. Your unit ministry team and Garrison Religious Support Office are here to help in your life's Jerusalem.



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


