

# New Army housing survey available through Dec. 13

WASHINGTON -- After eight months of efforts and initiatives across the Army to improve housing conditions, residents of U.S. Army family housing will have another chance to rate the quality of housing and housing services in 2019 as the Army released two more surveys -- one on Army-owned and -leased housing, and one on privatized housing.

The surveys was emailed Nov. 7 for Army-managed housing, the other on Nov. 12 for privatized housing. CEL & Associates Inc., an independent third-party organization, will administer the survey for the Army. The email will be from *ArmyHousingSurvey@celassociates.com*. Earlier this year, CEL & Associates emailed housing surveys to nearly 100,000 residents.

The surveys are open through Dec. 13. The Army needs firsthand accounts of what Soldiers and their families find important in Army housing and to gauge satisfaction with property-management services.

The housing surveys will be used to find areas that are top priorities to residents, to identify which areas are successful or need improvement, and to determine where funding could have the most effect, according to Lt. Gen. Jason Evans, Army DCS G-9.

"The Army will improve homes, communities, and customer service -- from Army housing staff and the private housing management companies -- through the candid feedback we receive from our Soldiers and their families," Evans said.

Army housing officials hope for a high participation rate, which will provide a more accurate depiction of resident satisfaction and of changes that have been implemented over the past eight months.

All surveys are confidential and the reporting structure ensures that the Army will not see responses unless CEL is satisfied that participants' anonymity is retained.

Residents who have not received an email with the survey link should contact their local housing offices.

# TF 1-28 wins Marne Week 2019

Each year, the 3rd Infantry Division hosts a week of sporting competition events, known as Marne Week, to celebrate the division's birthday. This year, the division turned 102 years old.

The Marne Division earned its name "Rock of the Marne" from the Battle of the Marne during World War I, and each year 3ID celebrates its birthday with Marne Week.

On Nov. 15, the Society of the 3rd Infantry Division hosted the division ball, and all sporting events kicked off on Nov. 19, with what was supposed to be a division run.

"I cannot tell you how proud I am to be a Dogfaced Soldier and getting the chance to serve with everyone of you," said Maj. Gen. Antonio Aguto, commanding general for 3rd ID and Fort Stewart, prior to the division run. "Thanks for what you do everyday and when you go home this morning thank your Families on behalf

of command sergeant major and I."

With nearly 10 thousand Soldiers on the field, Aguto "zonked" the entire formation and released all of the Soldiers until their sporting event started.

With more than 23 sporting events during Marne Week, Day 1 consisted of flag football, a golf scramble, basketball, the Marne Mudder, dodgeball, functional fitness, bowling, combatives, and a range dedication ceremony for Distinguished Service Cross recipient, Staff Sgt. Stevon A. Booker, who was killed during combat operations in Iraq in 2003.

"The whole point of this week is to build comradery and friendship, but I got to tell you that there is some real talent out there," said Aguto. "The effort that everybody put into it this week was phenomenal."

On Day 2, the Soldiers competed in events such as volleyball, swimming relays, functional fitness, and combative tournaments. Day 3 was exciting for Families and spouses, because Marne Family Day and spouse's kickball were a

huge hit. Additionally, the Soldiers participated in tug-o-war, Frisbee, and soccer.

Marne Week allowed Soldiers across the installation to compete in events and ultimately earn points for their battalion and brigade through friendly competitions.

"Winning matters," said Command Sgt. Maj. Michael Coffey, senior enlisted advisor for the 3rd ID and Fort Stewart. "I have the privilege of recognizing the battalion team that won, it was tough with all the good competition it was out there."

"The first-place (Battalion Category) winner was 2nd Battalion, 7th Infantry Regiment, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team," said Coffey. "The second-place

winner was 3rd Battalion, 67th Armored Regiment, 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team, and the third-place winner was the division's Headquarters and Headquarters Battalion."

For the brigades, the winner of Marne Week was Task Force 1st Battalion, 28th Infantry Regiment. 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team placed second and the third-place finisher was 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team and.

During the closing ceremony, Aguto thanked the Soldiers for their participation.

"Thanks for all that you do every day, thanks for being Dogfaced Soldiers and thanks to the commanders for supporting us," said Aguto. "Rock of the Marne!"

# Guard brigade recounts successes in Afghanistan

**WASHINGTON** -- Lt. Col. Matt Johnston and Sgt. 1st Class Nicholas Nigro noticed a stark difference in the Afghan national defense forces this time around.

During the height of the Afghan surge in 2009-2010, Johnston served as a company commander when the 48th Infantry Brigade Combat Team of the Georgia National Guard deployed its entire force. About half of the 48th returned to Afghanistan this year to provide infantry support to an Afghan special operations task force from January to September.

Johnston, a brigade operations officer during the 2019 deployment, and Nigro, a platoon sergeant, said they saw a more organized, capable force in the U.S. ally this time.

"The Afghan national forces are in the lead now," said Johnston, who spoke at a Pentagon press brief-

ing Wednesday. "Whereas in 2009-2010 we may have led the patrols. We supported them on this deployment. That's the major difference."

"They're planning their own operations, coming up with their own timelines, their own maneuvers ... We're supporting them in an advisory role," he said.

About 20% of the Soldiers from 2009-2010 remained with the IBCT and deployed again. This time the junior Soldiers and officers were now experienced NCOs and field-grade officers.

This time the 48th IBCT deployed in support of Operation Freedom's Sentinel and the NATO-led Operational Resolute Support.

The 48th Soldiers provided mission command operations. IBCT elements acted in a training, advise and assist role with Afghan Soldiers and supported security operations throughout the nation. The unit provided a fires battalion to add indirect fire support at various locations and a field artillery headquarters

to serve the whole region.

About 1,600 of the 48th Infantry Brigade Combat team returned to the U.S. in July and another 400-500 followed in September.

With one third of the unit associated or working in law enforcement, the 48th IBCT Soldiers had unique qualifications to counsel and assist Afghan forces. During the U.S. operation Guardian Angel, American forces formed the mission as a risk mitigation measure to counter potential insider attacks.

The 48th IBCT depended on Soldiers' intuitive abilities to assess potential threats, said Col. Matthew D. Smith, 48th IBCT commander.

"If you consider the environment that law enforcement officers work in, they have thousands of human contacts," Smith said. "Much more than most of us do on any given day. That serves as training; it gives you a sample size of how people react in certain situations. That carries over to the battlefield."

During the deployment early last summer, tragedy struck.

Johnson said U.S. intelligence reports pointed to a possible assassination attempt of a brigade commander.

An Afghan brigade commander died in the attack. However, not a single U.S. Soldier sustained an injury. Smith credited the unit's preparation and training with helping prevent any U.S. casualties.

"Obviously the death of a partner is tragic on many levels," Smith said. "But it was somewhat counterintuitively a high point for Sgt. Nigro's platoon that they handled it so well."

After the nine-month deployment, the unit awarded 14 purple hearts to Soldiers who suffered gunshot wounds or shrapnel or concussive injuries.

Smith credited the unit's alignment with the 3rd Infantry Division in the two years leading up to the deployment and relationships formed with the division's leadership. When the 48th IBCT replaced the 1st Brigade, 4th Infantry Division, that familiarity helped pave a smooth transition.

"My guys were still ready to perform because we continued to train in our off time," Nigro said. "All the training we did throughout our deployment allowed us to be ready, flexible and effective at the end."

# Controlled burn season starts on Fort Stewart

Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield's Forestry Branch begins the installation's controlled burn season Dec. 1.

Controlled burning is a managed burn that uses low intensity fire to improve and enhance our Soldiers' training lands, clear underbrush to reduce wildfire hazards, and improve wildlife habitat. As a result of Fort Stewart's aggressive burn program, the number of wildfires has steadily decreased over the past decade. Since the year 2000, not one day of training has been lost on the Installation due to wildfires.

Extensive preparation and work goes into each planned burn. The Forestry Branch develops burn prescriptions for each area that will be burned during the season. These planned burns may involve burning 500 acres to 2,500 acres per day and may occur on any day during the burn season. Even with preplanning, the dates of each burn are only estimates as they are dependent upon weather conditions as well as access to military training areas. However, the Forestry Branch goes to great lengths to ensure the Installation and surrounding commu-

nities are aware of scheduled burns and are up-to-date on any changes to the burn plan for a particular day.

During a burn, Forestry monitors weather via the National Weather Service in Charleston, the Georgia Forestry Commission, from five local remote access weather stations located throughout Fort Stewart and close observation from at least two of the five fire towers located on the Installation.

Fort Stewart foresters do everything within their power to manage smoke impacts from these burns and ensure the safety of residents both in and around Fort Stewart. However, there are uncontrollable conditions, such as sudden changes in wind direction and/or intensity that can cause smoke to drift into surrounding neighborhoods or highways. For this reason, the Forestry Branch asks residents to be aware of the ongoing burn season and to use extra caution when traveling through areas where smoke may be present.

Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield recognizes our



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# Winn reaffirms readiness at health summit

For the last seven years the Fort Stewart Marne Health Summit has been a free educational resource, which allows local and international providers to receive up to 19 continuing education credits during a multi-disciplinary, multi-service, interactive, three-day training seminar at Fort Stewart's Main Post Chapel, Nov. 19-21.

Naval Hospital Beaufort, U.S. Navy Lt. Jules Martowski, was one of the providers in attendance for this year's conference, looked at the seminar as an opportunity to reaffirm his individual medical readiness.

"This is incredibly important from a readiness perspective," Martowski said. "We need to make sure as military providers, both civilian and military alike that we're up to date on our knowledge, skills and abilities, making sure we're staying abreast of current scientific knowledge and applying that knowledge as we can, to make our war-fighter the most ready they can be."

The seminar provides a diverse range of topics from a wide range of guest speakers who cover emerging issues in behavioral health and medical treatment, however the summit's primary goal is to ensure all providers in attendance are medically ready.

"Bringing all these speakers in, it keep us up to date on current clinical practices and demands of the Army. So it allows us to make sure that we're always mission ready," U.S. Army Medical Department Activity-Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield, Licensed Clinical Social Worker, Heidi Hill said.

MEDDAC Commander, Col. Michelle Munroe, kicked off the seminar with a look back at the past, present and future of MEDDAC's Winn Army

Community Hospital.

"It's interesting, I did this historical timeline back in my mind, [and] next year we will have been in operation for 80 years," Munroe said. "Eighty years this hospital has been taking care of Fort Stewart and their Families."

U.S. Army, Regional Health Command-Atlantic, Commander, Brig. Gen. Michael Place, the keynote speaker spoke about leadership during turbulent times and analyzing the characteristics of leadership and change through a collaborative forum with the audience in attendance.

"Being a leader gets you involved with people," Place said. "If you can provide purpose, direction, motivation to accomplish the mission, then leadership is actually a verb. You have to do something. It involves change."

Place is just one of over 30 speakers who volunteered their own knowledge, skills, and abilities and most importantly their time to ensure the continuous medical readiness of all providers at this year's summit.

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## CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

# Sharing a extra helping of blessings, thankful thoughts for the holidays

Sometime Thursday in the midst of football and feast, hopefully many of us will pause to count our blessings. The reality is, however, very few if any of us will recite a list that looks anything like the one Jesus offered:

*Blessed are you poor. Blessed are you who hunger now. Blessed are you who weep now. Blessed are you when men hate you, and when they exclude you, and revile you, and cast out your name as evil, for the Son of Man's sake. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy! For indeed your reward is great in heaven. (Luke 6:20-23)*

I don't share this in some effort to make all the turkey and pumpkin pie less appetizing, but I do think it is important to recognize the huge incongruity between our American Christian definition of blessed and the definition Jesus offers in the gospels. If we don't, we will almost certainly fail to give thanks for that which is most important.

Instead we will offer all of our gratitude to the Almighty for things that may simply be the results of our good fortune to be born into the time, society, and families we were. Even if you believe your birth into a life of possibilities rather than into a struggle to survive is the result of providence rather than chance, the idea that this constitutes God's blessing upon you is scripturally dubious because Jesus pronounced the blessing upon those in the latter situation.

A verse in Acts reflects an attitude of the early church which most of would find borderline ridiculous. Having been arrested, interrogated, and beaten, Luke says the apostles *"left the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonor for the name."* (Acts 5:41) In other words, they were specifically thankful for experiencing things almost any sane person would want to avoid. Were they crazy? I don't

think so.

Having witnessed the resurrection of Jesus and been filled with the power of the Holy Spirit, the apostles lived with a consciousness of God's Kingdom that rendered comforts of the temporal realm irrelevant.

Anything which brought them closer to God was to be celebrated, even if it involved suffering. Perhaps as they rejoiced they recollected Jesus' words, *"Blessed are you when men hate you."* Knowing that they were in fact blessed, they offered their praises to God.

According to Matthew, in the same sermon that Jesus pronounced blessings upon the poor and persecuted, he also proclaimed, *"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal."* (Matthew 6:19)

Again we are reminded that those things which can be lost, destroyed, or stolen should probably not be labeled blessings. Dedication in pursuing those things usually results in our missing out on the real blessings—namely, the certainty that we are God's children, the joy of fulfilling our role in His Kingdom, and the possession of His Spirit which enables us to, as St. Paul encouraged, *"Give thanks in all circumstances."* (1 Thessalonians 5:18)

Thursday I will offer thanks before dinner. I will do so in a nicer house than I ever imagined I'd own and in anticipation of eating more food than some in this world will eat for a week. I might give thanks for those things, but they aren't blessings; they are reminders of responsibilities I have as a steward to share. They also hold a potential to become obstacles to actual blessedness.

What I am most thankful for is the knowledge I have of a God who forgives and the chance I have to serve. I pray that will never change, even though I am sure my physical circumstances eventually will.
