Fort Stewart/Hunter Army Airfield is pleased to receive the Georgia Environmental Protection Division's (GA EPD's) correspondence dated June 14, 1999, in reference to the Corrective Action Plan (CAP)-Part A submitted for Hunter Army Airfield's former underground storage tanks (USTs) #27 and #28, Building 8059, Facility Identification Number 9-025083*1. Per GA EPD's review comment, Alternative Threshold Levels (ATLs) have been calculated for toluene and ethylbenzene detected in the UST closure soil sample. Specifically, Fort Stewart/Hunter Army Airfield is pleased to provide replacement pages for pages 5 and 7 of the CAP-Part A form and a replacement Appendix VI to address development of the respective ATLs.

Based on the information submitted in the CAP-Part A and the replacement pages enclosed, Fort Stewart/Hunter Army Airfield respectfully request that GA EPD assign a "No Further Action Required" status to Facility Identification Number 9-025083*1, as the concentrations of toluene and ethylbenzene detected during UST closure activities are below their respective ATLs.
