Dear Ms. McAllister:

Fort Stewart is pleased to submit the groundwater analytical results for Fort Stewart's former underground storage tank (UST) #70, Building 953, Facility Identification Number 9-089019. In correspondence dated December 28, 1998 (Perez to Coughlan), Fort Stewart recommended resampling the four existing monitoring wells at the former UST #70 site in order to confirm or deny that all previously detected groundwater contamination has been remediated (i.e., natural attenuation) to non-detect. The groundwater analytical data from the March 10, 1999 re-sampling event is provided for your use and convenience, and indicates that benzene was not detected in any of the four site wells.

In addition, the site has been re-ranked using the May 1998 Site Ranking Form and received a score of 50 (see enclosure). Thus, based on the analytical results from the March 1999 re-sampling event and the site score, Fort Stewart respectfully requests that Facility Identification #9-089019 be assigned a "No Further Action Required" status.
