SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER CLINICAL CARE (SUDCC)

Substance Use Disorder Clinical Care is the Army's new model for providing substance use disorder and other behavioral healthcare in an integrated, unit aligned, and colocated manner.



PROGRAM MISSION

SUDCC's mission is to provide substance use disorder clinical care, including assessment, treatment, rehabilitation, aftercare for Service Members and other beneficiaries within an integrated medical and behavioral health model to enhance health and readiness

PROGRAM VISION

A fully integrated, unit-aligned, co-located comprehensive substance use disorder treatment program that utilizes national best practices to optimize best care delivery, treatment outcomes and force conservation for Service Members and other beneficiaries.



PROGRAM GOALS

SUDCC at Fort Stewart/Hunter Army Airfield is designed to treat adults suffering from substance use disorder. Other contributing issues will be addressed such as depression, anxiety or other co-occurring disorders.

The program uses the motivational enhancement model of treatment and cognitive behavioral therapy, thus encouraging patients to explore their substance use history, draw conclusions about consequences, and the desire or need for treatment.

SUDCC is an abstinence based treatment program. Patients are encouraged to attend 12-step meetings outside of regular group hours. Random urine drug screens are required throughout treatment.

Patients will participate in a variety of patient-centered therapy groups and individual sessions provided by licensed, trained, and experienced staff.
