SUBJECT: CG Policy Letter# 5: Speeding and Installation Driving Privileges

1. References.

- a. 32 Code of Federal Regulations, Subpart B (Driving Privileges), 12 April 2005.
- b. Army Regulation (AR) 190-5 (Motor Vehicle Traffic Supervision), 22 May 2006.
- c. AR 600-20 (Army Command Policy), 24 July 2020.

2. Scope. This policy applies to all individuals introducing and operating motor vehicles on the installations of Fort Stewart, Georgia (FSGA) and Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia (HAAF).

3. Purpose. This policy establishes guidelines to maintain and improve safety and good order and discipline on FSGA and HAAF installations and to ensure the safe and efficient movement of vehicles and personnel on FSGA and HAAF.

4. Policy.

a. Delegation. I am designating the Garrison Commanders of FSGA and HAAF each the authority to implement programs, consistent with AR 190-5 and below, for installation driving privilege matters, to include the suspension and revocation of installation driving privileges on each their respective installations.

b. Speeding. All persons introducing and operating motor vehicles on FSGA or HAAF will do so in accordance with posted speed limits. All persons operating a motor vehicle on these installations traveling at a rate of speed 20 miles per hour or greater above the posted speed limit on FSGA or HAAF will have their installation driving privileges suspended for a minimum of 30 calendar days. Consistent with AR 190-5, paragraph 2-6.b. This suspension will become effective 14 calendar days after the individual is notified of their right to an administrative hearing before a designated hearing officer. If the individual elects to appear for an administrative hearing, the suspension will be deferred pending the outcome of the hearing. If the individual requests a continuance of the administrative hearing date beyond the 14-day period, the suspension will become effective immediately on receipt of notice that the request for

continuance has been granted, and remain in force pending a hearing at a scheduled hearing date.

c. Repeat Incidents of Speeding. Individuals cited a second time by law enforcement within a year for traveling 20 miles per hour or greater above the posted speed limit on FSGA or HAAF will have their on-post driving privileges suspended for 12 months in a manner consistent with AR 190-5.

5. This policy is effective immediately and remains in effect until suspended, revoked, or superseded. Nothing in this policy is intended to contradict or eliminate any of the responsibilities and requirements enumerated in the above references.
