AUDS MIGRATION

The Southeast Region must be fully migrated to AUDS by 25 September 2025. To migrate a computer to AUDS, the machine must be Windows 11 compatible. Anyone can get a head start on this. You just need to submit a ticket on Service Now and provide the **computer name, MAC address, and full name of the primary user**. Then, reimaging the computer. There is a new BitLocker pin, and the user must enter their email address into the "Username Hint" field in order to login.

The [AUDS Dashboard](#) is provided by the U.S. Army's Global Cyber Center (GCC). The dashboard provides both a high level and detailed view of AUDS migration across the globe. The main dashboard page provides a quick summary of AUDS migration efforts by Major Command (MACOM) with drilldown features for additional details. Additional dashboard pages include information on specific devices (computers / printers) and administrators. This dashboard can be a handy tool to provide additional insights on migration efforts for locations that fall under the purview of the Southeast RNEC.

OPERATION DISTINGUISHED GENTLEMEN (OPDG)

Fort Moore and the Maneuver Center of Excellence (MCoE) implemented Operation Distinguished Gentlemen (OPDG) in the Task Force-GA AOR to ensure successful support of Scenario Thirty-Nine (SC39) to honor James Earl Carter, Jr. OPDG kicked off at Fort Moore on December 30, 2024, providing JTF-NCR forward support to the state funeral for former President Jimmy Carter and the interment in Plains, Georgia.

Fort Moore NEC personnel maintained the necessary IT connectivity between several military and civilian agencies (i.e. Georgia Emergency Management Agency, National Park Services, and the Presidential Library). They also conducted several exercises and site visits as part of their responsibility for initial operations capacity (IOC) and full operations capacity (FOC) and ensuring IT equipment and sites were active and maintained throughout the OPDG's mission. Fort Moore NEC ensured communications between all five forward Satellite Joint Operation Centers and the EOC. Personnel also assisted with tracking movement of personnel within motorcades, convoys, RSOI movement, and logistics.




PLA 2875 TEMPLATES
