AD HOSTNAME REVIEW

The AD Hostname Review dashboard and paginated report was designed to review computer objects within the region's AD organizational unit and compare their hostname against criteria outlined in NETCOM's Army Enterprise Infrastructure (AEI) Naming Convention and Standards. The dashboard and paginated report compare three key areas of each computer object name for site, unit identifier, and function code. The site identifier within the hostname is compared to known operating locations within the Southeast Region (e.g. STEW, NOVO, MOOE). The six digit Unit Identification Code (UIC) within the hostname is compared against Army's active UICs listed within the Force Management Systems website (FMSWeb). (Additional development will add UIC information for Air Force, Marine, or Navy organizations.) Lastly the two digit function code is compared to function codes outlined within the AEI Naming Convention and Standards.

Numerous local and higher-level processes leverage a computer object's name for effective analysis, management, and tracking. The dashboard and paginated report are designed to identify naming issues that impact these efforts. The dashboard provides multiple interactive views with filters to enable the review information based on specific portions of the naming convention by site or device type (e.g. workstation or server). The paginated report can be exported to Excel to enable local reviews and sharing.
