SUBJECT: USAG Stuttgart Command Policy Memorandum #25-006, Ammunition and Explosives (A&E) Amnesty Program

1. References:

- a. Department of the Army Pamphlet (DA PAM) 385-64 (Ammunition and Explosives Safety Standards)
- b. DA PAM 700-16 (Ammunition Management)
- c. Army in Europe Regulation 385-64 (Explosives Safety)

2. Purpose. To ensure maximum recovery of military A&E items found outside the supply system and provide an opportunity for individuals to safely return found, stolen, or misplaced ammunition without fear of prosecution. This program is not intended to circumvent normal turn-in procedures.

3. Applicability. All personnel assigned to the USAG Stuttgart area of responsibility.

4. Policy:

a. A&E outside the supply system must be recovered and controlled. Small arms ammunition, up to and including .50 caliber, may be turned in at amnesty collection points by individuals on a no-questions basis without fear of reprisal or prosecution from leadership.

b. All other A&E will be considered hazardous and will be handled only by trained and qualified Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) personnel after coordination through the Military Police (Emergency contact: DSN 110; Civ. 07031-15-3102/-3095).

5. Responsibilities:

a. USAG Stuttgart Safety Office:

(1) Review submitted unit Amnesty policies to ensure compliance with regulations.

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(2) Develop and publicize the Garrison Amnesty Program/SOP, detailing specific functional responsibilities and guidance.

(3) Monitor the Amnesty Program to ensure units do not abuse the program in lieu of proper turn-in procedures.

b. Tenant units that use or expend A&E:

(1) Establish and implement unit A&E amnesty programs IAW the references.

(2) Submit unit A&E amnesty programs to the USAG Stuttgart Safety Office for Garrison Commander approval.

(3) Ensure unit amnesty programs do not intimidate or prevent individuals from freely turning in ammunition.
