MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: USAG Stuttgart Command Policy Letter #17, Reporting of Child Abuse and Domestic Violence

1. REFERENCES:

2. DEFINITIONS:

- a. **Child Abuse.** The physical or mental injury, sexual abuse or exploitation, or negligent treatment of a child. It does not include discipline administered by a parent or legal guardian to his or her child provided it is reasonable in manner and moderate in degree and otherwise does not constitute cruelty.
- b. **Domestic Violence.** An offense under the United States Code, the Uniform Code of Military Justice, or state law that involves the use, attempted use, or threatened use of force or violence against a person or a violation of a lawful order issued for the protection of a person who is (a) A current or former spouse; (b) A person with whom the abuser shares a child in common; or (c) A current or former intimate partner with whom the abuser shares or has shared a common domicile.

3. DESIGNATED REPORT POINT OF CONTACT (RPOC):

- a. The Directorate of Emergency Services (DES) Military Police (MP) Desk is designated as the RPOC for known or suspected cases of child abuse and domestic violence.

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4. REPORTING OF CHILD ABUSE AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE:

a. All installation law enforcement personnel, physicians, nurses, social workers, school personnel, Family Advocacy Program (FAP) and Child Youth Services (CYS) personnel, psychologists, and other medical personnel will report information about known or suspected cases of child abuse and domestic violence.

b. Commanders will report suspected child abuse and domestic violence to the designated RPOC on the installation and provide all relevant information to those investigating the report.

c. Every service member, employee, and member of the military community is encouraged to report information about known or suspected cases of child abuse and domestic violence to the RPOC as soon as the information is received.

5. ADDITIONAL NOTIFICATIONS:

a. The MP Desk SGT will notify the on-call Military Police Investigator, the on-call CID agent, and on-call FAP POC of all child abuse reports.

b. The MP Desk SGT will notify the on-call Military Police Investigator, the on-call victim advocate, and on-call FAP POC of domestic violence reports.


c. The MP Desk SGT will notify the responsible Polizei agency of reports of child abuse and domestic violence occurring off the installation.

d. The MP Desk SGT will notify the Director, Child Youth Services for any reports of abuse in CYS facilities.

e. The Director of Emergency Services will designate select individuals to notify the Inspector General of reports involving O-6 Promotable officers and above.

f. The DES will submit a Serious Incident Report (SIR) using the Army Law Enforcement Reporting and Tracking System (ALERTS) as required.
