Introduction

Principles of **reduce**, **reuse**, **recycle** underlie policies established in Germany to foster sustainable materials management. The **Closed Substance Cycle and Waste Management Act**, first published in1994, was designed to integrate product responsibility into economic decision-making in order to build a life-cycle economy and avoid the generation of waste.

The Act established a hierarchy of avoidance, recovery, and disposal that emphasizes waste avoidance in production, promotes low-waste products, and provides incentives for waste recovery practices.

Properly sorting waste into recyclable fractions:

- \Rightarrow Saves energy
- \Rightarrow Reduces air pollution
- \Rightarrow Decreases greenhouse gas emissions
- \Rightarrow Saves money

Your participation is vital for the success of all recycling efforts!

 REDUCE
 the amount of trash discarded, e.g. choose products with less packaging. Choose loose fruit, cheese and meat. Buy products in glass jars and tins which can be recycled. Use "Bags for Life" available at supermarkets.

 REUSE
 packaging materials, containers and products, e.g. give unwanted clothes, books, toys, and household items to friends or charities. Reuse old carrier bags when at the supermarket. Use both sides of a sheet of paper.

 RECYCLE
 materials that can be reutilized, e.g., make use of your local recycling center. Recycle your garden waste at home in a composter. Close the loop, buy recycled products.

Recycling at USAG Stuttgart

Recycling has become very important because disposal fees are rising and awareness of the value of the materials we use for packaging have increased. Waste has become a secondary raw material. We must all work together in order to comply with local Host Nation laws and U.S. Army regulations. Like it or not, garbage is everyone's business. We all generate it, handle it, and pay to dispose of it.

This booklet will inform you about the recycling program in your county. Your active participation is needed to make the program work. With this information, we hope you will better understand why we have to recycle as well as what items to recycle and the easiest way to go about recycling at your home.

According to the USAG Stuttgart Policy Letter # 59, Illegal Dumping of Trash, it is prohibited to bring trash generated off-post onto US installations.



- \Rightarrow Take pride in our environment.
- \Rightarrow Participate and recycle!
- \Rightarrow Do it for our children's future,
- \Rightarrow And to bring credit to the U.S. Forces residing in our Host Nation!

Who, What and How

Who Everybody must participate in recycling!

- What All wastes which can be reused needs to be recycled, like paper, glass, metal cans and plastics.
- **How** By separating and sorting your recyclable materials from your normal trash and placing them in the proper containers.



- ⇒ Theoretically, all types of waste are recyclable; unfortunately, in practice, it cannot yet be realized.
- ⇒ About 50% of average household waste is recyclable; in offices it is even more. The most important materials are paper and glass.

Reduce - Tips for Waste Avoidance

Avoidance starts by thinking and observing. Think about what you need. Do you really *need* it, or is there a substitute which produces less or no waste?

You can control the amount of trash you have because most of it results from everyday shopping habits. That's why you should keep some basic tips in mind.

- ⇒ Take a reusable bag or basket with you when you go shopping; if you have to use a plastic bag, then use it as many times as you can.
- \Rightarrow Use returnable container systems.
- ⇒ Select unwrapped items. Choose ecologically sound, garbage-reducing products that can be recycled.
- \Rightarrow Avoid items that are double or triple packed with paper and plastic.

Avoid hazardous chemicals, they can harm the environment and that also means they are harmful to you and your family. Choose less hazardous or nonhazardous products whenever possible.

- \Rightarrow Some things are too good to throw away!
- ⇒ Friends or neighbors might be able to use them or you could sell them at a yard sale or flea market!

Avoid where possible:

- S Paper/ plastic cups & plates
- S Paper napkins
- Disposable razors

Non-returnable bottles

- Plastic bags
- S Wrappings

Household goods, clothing, and other items no longer needed can be donated to the Patch Thrift Shop, which is operated by the Stuttgart Community Spouses' Club (SCSC).

Paper & Cardboard

Producing paper from waste paper uses 70% less energy than is needed to make the same products from wood and the water consumption is cut by 98%. Recycled paper and cardboard can be used to make packaging, industrial paper, tissues, newspapers, and moulded cartons for eggs and fruit.



- \Rightarrow Please fold bulky materials such as cartons or boxes before putting into the container
- \Rightarrow Remove paper clips, adhesive tapes, plastics, and other packaging materials

Did you know that ...

- ... 75% of each tree that is cut down for paper is not used in a paper product .
- ... Recycling a single run of the Sunday New York Times would save 75,000 trees.



Orange Bin

Recycled plastic is used to make new bottles and containers, irrigation pipes and fleece jumpers. Aluminum is converted into cans and other products.



⇒ Put small electronic items into red bag (see next page)

 \Rightarrow All recycling items do not have to be cleaned but have to be empty!

Did you know that ...

... Plastics thrown into the ocean kill as many as 1,000,000 sea creatures every year!

... It takes up to 500 years to decompose plastic items in landfills.



Red Bag

The red bags which are picked-up together with the Orange bin are for small electronics only. **Place it within the Orange bin**. The individual electronics are disassembled mechanically, harmful substances are removed and valuable noble metals are recovered and recycled into new products.





This includes:

Only small Electronic Scrap :

- ✓ Electric toys
- ✓ Hair dryers & shavers
- ✓ Cell phones, MP3 players
- ✓ Calculators, cameras
- ✓ CDs & DVDs



Red Bags are distributed at all Recycling Centers like in:

- ⇒ Böblingen-Hulb
- ⇒ Herrenberg-Kayh
- \Rightarrow Leonberg
- \Rightarrow Renningen-Malmsheim
- \Rightarrow Waldenbuch/ Steinbronn
- \Rightarrow Jettingen

NOTE: Place the Red Bag into the Orange bin.

Did you know that ...

- ... Most electronics contain heavy metals and organic chemicals which have been proven to cause a variety of health hazards, including cancer if not recycled properly.
- ... Cell phones contain very high amount of precious metals such as silver and gold. Americans throw away approximately \$60 million worth of silver and gold per year.



Biodegradable Waste

The container for biodegradable waste is solely for compostable waste from the kitchen and garden. It is turned into compost in large-scale compost plants and can be used as fertilizer. Bio waste is also used in large biogas plants for energy production. As a result, biodegradable waste is 100% recyclable.



This includes:

- Coffee grounds with filter paper & tea bags
- ✓ Paper egg boxes
- ✓ Fruits & vegetables
- ✓ Leaves & grass
- ✓ Tree & hedge cuttings
- ✓ Meat (raw & cooked)
- ✓ Food leftovers (raw & cooked)





This does not include:

- ⊘ Diapers
- O Animal litter
- ♦ Charcoal & ash
- O Dust & cigarette butts
- ♦ Vacuum cleaner bags
- Siodegradable bags
- O Packed food
- ⊘ Bones
- Wood (other than garden clippings)
- O Paper napkins/ towels
- \Rightarrow Large pieces of wood do not go into the bin, they can be disposed at a recycling center.
- ⇒ Never use plastic bags, even if labeled as bio-degradable, decomposable or *Biobeutel*!
- \Rightarrow Line your bin and wrap your waste with newspaper against odor and moisture and rinse your bin with garden hose from time to time.
- ⇒ In the winter: place a sheet of newspaper on the bottom of your bin to prevent waste freezing to bottom.



Glass

Glass is collected and sorted by color. Once melted down, it is remoulded back into the new bottles and jars. Recycling glass requires only 50% of the energy necessary to make glass from sand.



- \Rightarrow Drop off glass by color (clear/green/brown). All other colors go as green.
- \Rightarrow All glass jars must be empty.

Did you know that ...

... A 100 watt light bulb can be lit for 4 hours from the energy saved by recycling a glass bottle or power a PC for almost half an hour.



Residual Waste

Some waste that cannot be recycled yet is called residual waste. The waste is collected for thermal treatment in waste incineration plants generating heat and electric power.

... During incineration harmful gases, particles, and heavy metals are emitted into the atmosphere. A reduction of residual waste benefits not only the environment but also human health!



Hazardous Waste | Batteries

Hazardous waste poses a threat to human health and to the environment. Its disposal requires compliance with high environmental standards. Hazardous waste is to be disposed at the recycling centers while household batteries can also be dropped into special boxes which are located at all shops selling batteries.



Important:

- \Rightarrow Hazardous waste can only be disposed at special recycling centers (see page 10)
- \Rightarrow Provide substances in original and labeled container!
- \Rightarrow <u>Never</u> mix different types of substances!
- \Rightarrow Used motor oil has to be returned to the shop where it has been bought.
- \Rightarrow Return car batteries at a recycling centers or at a shop in exchange of a new one.

Bulk | Large Electronics

Bulk waste and large electronics (max. 3 m³) are **picked-up upon request** (surcharge). The order is done either by phone or online. However, bulky waste these can also be brought **directly to the Recycling Center** at any time of the year and free of charge.





Furniture, household items and bulky metal scrap too big for normal waste bins:

- Bedsteds & mattresses
- ✓ Couches & chairs
- ✓ Cupboards & carpets
- ✓ Tablets & cabinets
- ✓ Washing machines
- ✓ Ovens, BBQs
- ✓ Large electronics *
- ✓ Air conditioners



This does not include:

- O Cardboard boxes
- Residual Waste bags
- S Renovation work waste
- S Radiators & oil tanks
- Small electronic scrap



* Pick-up of large electronics such as washing machines, refrigerators, dish washers are charged additionally.

- ⇒ Pick-up is upon request with a lead time of around 3 weeks (charge of 20 €).
- \Rightarrow An express pick-up (within 3 working days) is charged additionally.

Clothes & Shoes | Textiles

Wearable clothes and shoes and other textiles can be disposed in special containers often provided by non-profit-organization. Please pack all materials for donation in bags. Containers labelled with "*AWB*" are only for clothes and shoes. Containers by the "*Red Cross*" are also for other textiles.



- \Rightarrow Please use only those containers labeled by the "*Red Cross* "or with "*AWB*".
- \Rightarrow Sometimes they are labeled as "*Altkleider*" and are only for clothes and shoes.

 \Rightarrow All recycling items do not have to be cleaned but have to be empty!

- ♥ Window glass & mirrors
- ♦ Lead & crystal glass
- ♦ Light bulbs
- O Ceramics & porcelain

- \Rightarrow Drop off glass by color (clear/green/brown).
- \Rightarrow All other colors go as green.
- \Rightarrow All glass containers must be empty.

Did you know that ...

... Glass can keep getting recycled since it never wears down.

Residual Waste

Some waste that cannot be recycled and turned into new products is called residual waste. The waste is collected for thermal treatment in waste incineration plants generating heat and electric power.



- \Rightarrow Keep the amount of residual waste as low as possible!
- \Rightarrow Put greasy and oily paper or cardboard (e.g. soiled pizza boxes, sandwich wrapping paper) into the residual waste bins, not into paper & cardboard bins.

... During incineration harmful gases, particles, and heavy metals are emitted into the atmosphere. A reduction of residual waste benefits not only the environment but also human health!

Hazardous Waste | Batteries

Hazardous waste poses a threat to human health and to the environment. Its disposal requires compliance with high environmental standards. Hazardous waste is to be disposed at a mobile collection point while household batteries can also be dropped into special boxes which are located at all shops selling batteries.



mportant:

- \Rightarrow Hazardous waste must be disposed at mobile hazardous waste collection points. Please check page 22.
- \Rightarrow Provide substances in original and labeled container!
- \Rightarrow Never mix different types of substances!
- \Rightarrow Car batteries are returned at a recycling centers or a shop in exchange of a new one

Electronics

All electronical devices are to be disposed at a recycling center. The individual electronics are disassembled mechanically, and harmful substances are removed. The highly valuable materials such as noble metals are recovered and recycled into new products.



⇒ Large electronics can also be picked-up together with bulk collection (additional charge per device, see next page) while direct disposal at a recycling center is free of charge.

... Most electronics contain heavy metals and organic chemicals which have been proven to cause a variety of health hazards, including cancer if not recycled properly.

Bulk Waste

Bulk waste is **picked-up upon request two times a year**. The order is done by requesting a waste pick-up using the disposal card (provided together with the pick-up schedule). However, bulky items can also be brought directly to the recycling center any time of the year free of charge.



- $\Rightarrow\,$ Pick-up is upon request, 2 times a year, free of charge with a lead time of around 2 weeks.
- \Rightarrow Large electronics can also be picked-up together with bulk collection comprising an additional charge per device.

Clothes & Shoes | Textiles

Wearable clothes and shoes and other textiles can be disposed in special containers often provided by non-profit-organization. While some containers are only provided for clothes and shoes, others are meant also for other textiles. Please pack all materials for donation in bags.



- \Rightarrow Please use only those containers labeled by a non-profit-organizations.
- \Rightarrow Sometimes they are labeled as "*Altkleider*" and are only for clothes and shoes.

Did you know that ...

- ... around 65% of all donated clothes are distributed as second-hand clothes.
- ... 30% are not wearable and are recycled into new fabrics while the remaining 5% are thermally recycled.

Recyclable Waste Round

Recycling is the process of separating, collecting and remanufacturing or converting used or waste products into new materials.



 \Rightarrow All recycling items do not have to be cleaned but have to be empty!

- ... Plastics thrown into the ocean kill as many as 1,000,000 sea creatures every year!
- ... It takes up to 500 years to decompose plastic items in landfills.



Recyclable Waste Flat

Recycling different products will help the environment as it preserves natural resources. It also takes less energy to process recycled materials than to process virgin materials.



Did you know that ...

- ... 75% of each tree that is cut down for paper is not used in a paper product .
- ... Recycling a single run of the Sunday New York Times would save 75,000 trees.


Biodegradable Waste

The container for biodegradable waste is solely for compostable waste from the kitchen and garden. It is turned into compost in large-scale compost plants and can be used as fertilizer. Bio waste is also used in large biogas plants for energy production. As a result, biodegradable waste is 100% recyclable.



This includes:

- ✓ Food leftovers (cooked & raw)
- Coffee grounds with filter paper & tea bags
- ✓ Paper egg boxes
- ✓ Fruits & vegetables
- ✓ Leaves & grass
- ✓ Tree & hedge cuttings
- ✓ Paper napkins/towels
- ✓ Flowers & plants
- ✓ Meat & bones

Electronic Waste

All electronical devices are to be disposed at a recycling center. The individual electronics are disassembled mechanically, and harmful substances are removed. The highly valuable materials such as noble metals are recovered and recycled into new products.



⇒ Electronics can also be picked-up twice a year free of charge (use of bulk waste disposal card) while direct disposal at a recycling center is possible throughout the year. For pick-up request please call 07141-144-5656.

Hazardous waste poses a threat to human health and to the environment. Its disposal requires compliance with high environmental standards. Hazardous waste is to be disposed at the mobile collection truck while household batteries can also be dropped into special boxes which are located at all shops selling batteries.



* Used motor oil has to be returned to the shop where it has been bought.

Important:

- $\Rightarrow\,$ Hazardous waste must be disposed at mobile hazardous waste collection. Please check page 34.
- \Rightarrow Provide substances in original and labeled container!
- \Rightarrow Never mix different types of substances!
- \Rightarrow Car batteries are returned at a recycling centers or a shop in exchange of a new one.



Clothes & Shoes | Textiles

Wearable clothes and shoes and other textiles can be disposed in at the recycling centers. Please pack all materials for donation in bags.



Did you know that ...

- ... around 65% of all donated clothes is distributed as second-hand clothes.
- ... 30% are not wearable and are recycled into new fabrics while the remaining 5% are thermally recycled.



Bulk Waste

Bulk waste is **picked-up upon request once a year**. The order is done either by phone, mail or online. However, these can also be brought directly to a Recycling Center any time of the year (twice a year) free of charge with the disposal card (provided through mail together with pick-up schedule).



This includes:

Furniture & household items too big for normal waste bins:

- ✓ Bedsteds, mattresses
- ✓ Couches & chairs
- ✓ Cupboards & carpets
- ✓ Tablets & cabinets
- ✓ Large toys
- ✓ Mirrors
- Scrap metals like bikes, pipes ect.





This does not include:

- O Cardboard boxes
- S Residual Waste bags
- S Renovation work waste
- S Radiators & oil tanks
- ♦ Electronic scrap



- ⇒ Pick-up is upon request, once a year (free of charge, further pick-ups are charged). Bulk waste can also be disposed directly at a Recycling Center 2 times a year with the provided waste disposal card.
- \Rightarrow Scrap metals such as bikes, pipes, baby buggies, laundry rags, metal rags can be picked-up twice a year without extra charged (further pick-ups are charged).

Paper & Cardboard

Producing paper from waste paper uses 70% less energy than is needed to make the same products from wood and the water consumption is cut by 98%. Recycled paper and cardboard can be used to make packaging, industrial paper, tissues, newspapers, and moulded cartons for eggs and fruit.



- \Rightarrow Please fold bulky materials such as cartons or boxes before putting into the container
- \Rightarrow Remove paper clips, adhesive tapes, plastics, and other packaging materials

Packaging Materials

Recycled plastic is used to make new bottles and containers, irrigation pipes and fleece jumpers. Aluminum is converted into cans and other products.

Glass

Glass is collected and sorted by color. Once melted down, it is remoulded back into the new bottles and jars. Recycling glass requires only 50% of the energy necessary to make glass from sand.



- \Rightarrow Drop off glass by color (clear/green/brown). All other colors go as green.
- \Rightarrow All glass containers must be empty.

Wearable clothes and shoes and other textiles can be disposed in special containers often provided by non-profit-organization. While some containers are only provided for clothes and shoes, others are meant also for other textiles.



- \Rightarrow Please use only those containers labeled by a non-profit-organizations.
- \Rightarrow Sometimes they are labeled as "*Altkleider*" and are only for clothes and shoes.

Bulk Waste

Bulk waste is **picked-up upon request two times a year**. The order is done either by phone, mail with the disposal card attached (provided through mail together with pick-up schedule), or online. However, these can also be brought directly to Recycling Center any time of the year free of charge.



- ⇒ Pick-up is upon request, twice a year (free of charge with disposal card) with a lead time of 3-6 weeks.
- \Rightarrow An express pick-up is possible (lead time: 48 hrs) comprising an additional charge.
- ⇒ Bulk waste and large electronics can also be disposed directly at a Recycling Center two times a year (free of charge with waste disposal card).
