SUBJECT: USAG Stuttgart Command Policy Letter #19, Trash Separation, and Illegal Dumping of Trash

1. REFERENCES:

- h. Hazardous Waste (HW) Management Plan and the Solid Waste Management Plan of the USAG Stuttgart.
 - i. On-Post I Off-Post Recycling Booklet.
- 2. PURPOSE: This Command Policy prescribes and establishes guidelines to:
 - a. Save natural resources by separating recyclable material from the waste stream.
 - b. Ensure environmentally safe disposal of waste
 - c. Protect hum and environmental health by reducing pollution.
 - d. Maximize recycling and proper waste disposal to retain a quality of life.

- e. Reduce the amount of generated waste.
- 3. APPLICABILITY: The policy applies to all personnel entering USAG Stuttgart installations, performing work for or on behalf of the installation, and living on-post and off-post.
- 4. POLICY AND REQUIREMENTS: Recycling is mandatory. Adherence to this policy is everyone's responsibility and requirement. Commanders, Directors, and Supervisors are expected to implement methods and processes to recycle and separate materials. At a minimum, adequate separation systems (i.e., indoor containers) for the type of waste generated must be established in each building, common area, and office or shop. All organizations and activities will:
- a. Separate recyclable materials from the regular and non-recyclable waste and dispose of the waste according to the German regulations:
- (1) Separate paper, cardboard, glass, metal, plastics, bulky items (i.e., furniture, large metal items etc.).
 - (2) Separate electronic waste (i. e., appliances, electronic equipment etc.).
 - (3) Separate tires.
- (4) Separated hazardous wasted (i.e., batteries, oil, lubricants, paint, thinners, solvents, cleaners, lightbulbs etc.).
- b. Use designated collection points for regular waste and recyclables (paper, cardboard, plastics, glass, metal cans) on USAG Stuttgart installations. Ensure collection points and assigned receptacles are clearly marked.
- c. Bring all hazardous waste, bulky items, electronics, wood, tires, scrap metal to designated central collection points. Detailed information is provided in the On-Post Recycling Booklet and Off-Post Recycling Booklet.
- d. Sort all debris created from in-house or troop construction projects, wit the exception of contaminated items, into one of the following five categories and disposed at the designated area:
 - (1) Excavation material
 - (2) Road construction material
 - (3) Concrete and reinforced concrete

- (4) Masonry demolition material
- (5) Wood
- 5. Residents living off post will utilize their country or city pick-up services for trash and all types of recyclables. For more about recycling in your off-post community, contact your landlord and/or city hall (Buergeramt).
- This policy strictly prohibits:
 - a. Bringing any type of trash and recyclables onto USAG Stuttgart Installations.
- b. Dumping trash at any location other than designated collection points within USAG Stuttgart.
- c. Dumping trash outside appropriate container/bin within designated collection points.
- d. Placing any ammunition, explosive, hazardous material, or hazardous waste in any refuse or recycling containers.
- 7. Failure to comply with the provisions of this policy may result in adverse administrative or punitive action, including punishment under the Uniform Code of Military Justice for service members.
- 8. This policy supersedes any previous policies and is in effect until superseded or rescinded.
