

Course Title: **Basic Rider Course**

Course Number: BRC

School: Army Traffic Safety Training Program - Fort Cavazos

Description: Motorcycle Safety Foundation Basic Rider Course. Required by AR 385-10, The Army Safety Program.

Notes:

- Soldiers need to provide an authorization memo from either their Commander or First Sargent. This to make sure your command team is aware and will not pull from the class.
- Open to Active-Duty Military assigned to or supported by Ft Cavazos. Two-day course.
- Class size varies between 6 and 12 students, with a minimum of 5 or 11 students to hold.
- Class starts at 0700. Building 90074, West Ft. Cavazos motorcycle driving range on Mohawk Rd (approx. ¼ mile east of the Clarke Rd/Mohawk intersection/traffic light - look for sign on left side of Mohawk (sign is hard to see in early morning darkness – slow down)).
- Motorcycles provided unless you ride a scooter.
- Be on time please, class start promptly at 0700. Late arrivals are not accepted into class.

Participant to provide the following Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):

(1) DOT approved motorcycle helmet.

(2) Eye protection designed to meet or exceed American National Standards Institute Standard Z87.1-2003 for impact resistant goggles, wrap around glasses or full-face shield attached to the helmet. Issued RFI eyewear will meet this requirement.

(3) Full fingered leather or other abrasion-resistant material gloves or mittens designed for use on a motorcycle.

(4) Foot protection that provides sturdy over-the-ankle protection for the feet and ankles.

(5) Long sleeved shirt/jacket and long durable trousers.

Limited helmets and gloves are available for those who don't have PPE.

Course Title: **Advanced Rider Course**

Course Number: ARC

School: Army Traffic Safety Training Program - Fort Cavazos

Description:

- Motorcycle Safety Foundation Advanced Rider Course. Required by AR 385-10, The Army Safety Program.
- Must be repeated every 5 years.

Notes:

- Soldiers need to provide an authorization memo from either their Commander or First Sargent. This to make sure your command team is aware and will not pull from the class.
- Open to Active-Duty Military assigned to or supported by Ft Cavazos. One-day course.
- Class size maximum 6 students with a minimum of 5 students to hold.
- Class starts at 0700. Building 90074, West Ft. Cavazos motorcycle driving range on Mohawk Rd (approx. ¼ mile east of the Clarke Rd/Mohawk intersection/traffic light - look for sign on left side of Mohawk (sign is hard to see in early morning darkness – slow down)).
- Serviceable Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) must be on.
- Same dress requirements as for the BRC
- Be on time please, class start promptly at 0700. Late arrivals are not accepted into class.

Prerequisite:

- Instructor will verify completion of the Motorcycle Safety Foundation Basic Rider Course/BRC1 or a previous MSBRC, ERC/BRC2, or ARC completion card.

At the start of the class, participants must:

- (1) Show a valid motorcycle driver's license,
- (2) Show proof of motorcycle ownership/registration in student's name,
- (3) Show proof of motorcycle insurance in student's name,
- (4) Your motorcycle must pass the following inspection items:

Operating headlight high/low beam; Operating horn; If equipped with turn signals, they must function fully; Operating tail/brake lights; Tires in good condition.

Course Title: **Intermediate Driver Training**

Course Number: IDT

School: Army Traffic Safety Training Program - Fort Cavazos

Description:

- One time Army requirement, only for Soldiers under 26 years of age. Course reinforces the initial traffic safety training course given in AIT. Not required for a military license (AR 385-10).

Notes:

- Open to Active-Duty Military assigned to or supported by Ft Cavazos.
- Time: 0900-1130; Building 90076, West Ft. Cavazos motorcycle driving range on Mohawk Rd (approx. ¼ mile east of the Clarke Rd/Mohawk intersection/traffic light - look for sign on left side of Mohawk (sign is hard to see in early morning darkness – slow down)).
- Be on time please, class start promptly at 0900. Late arrivals are not accepted into class.

Course Title: **Remedial Driver Training**

Course Number: RDT

School: Army Traffic Safety Training Program - Fort Cavazos

Description:

- Remedial Driver Training/Driver Improvement Training. Required IAW AR 385-10, The Army Safety Program.

Notes:

- Time: 0730; Building 90076, West Ft. Cavazos motorcycle driving range on Mohawk Rd (approx. ¼ mile east of the Clarke Rd/Mohawk intersection/traffic light - look for sign on left side of Mohawk (sign is hard to see in early morning darkness – slow down)).

Required for a Service Members or DACs referred by the US Magistrate for ON-POST traffic violations/accidents while operating a government motor vehicle or POV at Fort Cavazos. Soldiers receiving off-post citations cannot take this on-post course due to legal reasons. Course reinforces positive driving behaviors and is required to avoid loss of installation driving privileges. Eight-hour course. Late arrivals are not accepted into class.
