**THANK YOU** for your continued flexibility and resilience as we continue to navigate the ongoing challenges related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Our 24/7 no-fail mission requires that we continue to take prudent measures to limit the potential spread of the virus.

We are committed to keeping the community safe while providing quality services and convenience that our patrons deserves. Our **NEW NORMAL** plans have relied on the best advice of the nation's top experts.

With a review of public health surveillance data, guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, collaboration with state and local authorities and advice from public health emergency officers and the local military medical clinic, we are excited to announce the limited reopening of the Community Activities Center and the Post Dining Facility.

Beginning June 11, some of the common spaces in the CAC, in particular meeting areas, conference rooms and multipurpose rooms will be opened to facilitate Army Community Service classes for Soldiers and Families. All risk mitigating protocols will be implemented to include face coverings, enhanced cleaning, physical distancing and caps on class sizes will be enforced based on room size. Additionally, we will be reopening the dine-in area of the CAC to 25% dine-in capacity with **ONLY** Families authorized to sit together and dine. Remaining areas of the CAC to include the bowling alley, child play spaces, game rooms and movie room will remain **CLOSED** for now.

Beginning June 15, we will be reopening the DFAC to 25% dine-in capacity. Tables will be sectioned off to ensure one person seating with appropriate social distancing. Families will be authorized to dine together in our VIP room. Protective face coverings will remain required while transiting through the facility. Self-serve options (salad bar, desserts, etc.) will be served by staff. The DFAC will continue to use paper trays and plastic silverware to eliminate common touch items.

As a reminder from the last Workforce Update, even though the State of Alaska returned to pre-pandemic levels May 22 and is now offering COVID-19 testing in place of quarantine after out of state travel, Fort Greely will generally maintain a higher or more restrictive standard to preserve the health and readiness of the force.

At this time and until further notice, **ALL** Soldiers, Dependents, Civilians and Contractors who live or are employed on Fort Greely are still required to contact Army Public Health at 907-361-3057 upon return and prior to entering Fort Greely. At this point in time, you can expect that Public Health instructions will remain to execute the 14-day quarantine period. USAG Fort Greely continues to work closely with MEDDAC-Alaska and other Army installations in Alaska on the prudent measures necessary to keep our personnel safe.

In closing, we are not out of the woods yet – it is **IMPERATIVE** that we continue to remain vigilant. Thank you very much for your continued loyalty and support while we navigate our new normal.
