

# **Temporary Living Allowance**



#### **TLA** May be reimbursable

- SM signs in to post (TLA is not reimbursable for any day prior to signing in with the installation)
- SM gets authorization from housing office
- SM presents (Debit/Credit/GTC) at IHG
- After 10 days in lodging
  - SM pays bill out of pocket (Debit/Credit/GTC)
  - Submits receipt and form to Finance for reimbursement
  - Payment is direct deposited in 7 to 15 days

Debit Card holds/freezes the funds for the entire stay



(approximately 641 miles)



#### What is APACS?

Aircraft and Personnel Automated Clearance System

APACS is a web-based tool to create, submit, coordinate, and approve aircraft and personnel travel clearances for official and personal travel.

#### How can APACS assist me?

Ease your travel through the border by registering your Family **30** days prior to travel

#### Prepare and submit your clearance request for Canada at:

#### **Privacy Act Statement**

Authority: 10 U.S.C. 3013, Secretary of the Army; 10 U.S.C. 5013, Secretary of the Navy; 10 U.S.C. 8013, Secretary of the Air Force; 22 U.S.C. 4801, Findings and purpose; 22 U.S.C. 4802, Responsibility of Secretary of State; and 22 U.S.C. 4805, Copperation of other Federal Agencies; Public Lav 99-399, Omnibus Diplomatic Security and Antiterrorism Act of 1986; Department of Defense Directive 4500.54E, DoD Foreign Clearance Program; DoD Directive 5400.11, Privacy Program; NIST.SP.800-53r4, Security and Privacy Controls for Federal Information Systems and Organizations; Privacy Act of 1974.

Purpose: This system is a web-based application operated by the U.S. Air Force due to the Secretary of the Air Force being designated as the Department of Defense (DoD) Executive Agent for the DoD Foreign Clearance Program. It is designed to aid DoD mission planners, aircraft operators and DoD personnel in meeting host attoin aircraft diplomatic and personnel travel clearance requirements outlined in the DoD Foreign Clearance Guide. APACS provides requesting, approving, and monitoring organizations (i.e., country clearance approvers at U.S. Embassies, Geographical Combatant Commands (GCC) theater clearance approvers, and Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD) special area clearance approvers) access to a common, centralized, and secure database that contains all the information required to process/approve foreign travel clearances.

Routine Use: Congressional Inquiries Disclosure Routine Use: Disclosure from a system of records maintained by a DOD Component may be made to a congressional office from the record of an individual in response to an inquiry from the congressional office made at the request of that individual.

Disclosure of Information to the General Services Administration Routine Use: A record from a system of records maintained by a DoD Component may be disclosed as a routine use to the General Services Administration for the purpose of records management inspections conducted under authority of 44 U.S.C. 2904 and 2906.

Disclosure of Information to the National Archives and Records Administration Routine Use: A record from a system of records maintained by a DoD Component may be disclosed as a routine use to the National Archives and Records Administration for the purpose of records management inspections conducted under authority of 44 U.S.C. 2904 and 2906.

Disclosure: User disclosure of PII is voluntary. However, failure to furnish the requested information may response in denial of aircraft and/or personnel travel clearance requests.

System of Records Notice: F011 AF A3 B DoD - DoD Foreign Clearance Program Records (January 03, 2012, 77 FR 94).

#### User Consent to Collection and Disclosure of Personally Identifiable Information (PII)

APACS collects Personally Identifiable Information (PII). By using this system, the user consents to the collection, use, maintenance, dissemination and retention of PII. All PII collected, used, maintained, dissemination and retained between APACS is used only for the identification of user accounts, for the processing of aircraft and personnel travel requests and for generating reports to approver organizations. PII may be viewed by all roles involved in the stated purposes above, including system administrators and software developers within the capacity of troubleshooting and issue resolution. All PII is safeguarded in a manner consistent with the NIST.SR.800-53r4 and DoD Directive 5400.11, Privacy Program. Public disclosure of PII is in accordance with the Privacy Act of 1974.



# **Traveling through Canada**



### CITIZENSHIP REQUIREMENTS/IDENTIFICTION

Divorced parents who share custody of their children should carry copies of the <u>legal custody documents</u>. Adults who are not parents or guardians should have <u>written permission</u> from the parents or guardians to supervise the children. When traveling with a group of vehicles, parents or guardians should travel in the same vehicle as the children when arriving at the border. Customs officers are looking for missing children and may ask questions about the children who are traveling with you.



## At the Canadian Border



### What to Expect at the Border



- You will be expected to provide the pertinent identification to enter Canada.
- Your vehicle may be inspected/searched.
- You will be asked to fill out customs documents and a questionnaire.
- You will receive a briefing on Canada's quarantine requirements.
- You will be advised by Canadian Border Services to only stop for gasoline, essentials, and lodging.
- You must have current pet vaccination records and a 30-day health certificate.



# **Traveling through Canada**



#### **Proper Identification:**

- Soldiers Military ID, Orders, proof of US citizenship
  - Birth certificate
  - Passport
- Family members over 15 passports required
- Family members under 15 birth certificates

Anyone with legal issues, misdemeanors, DUIs, step-children, and firearms should contact the Canadian Embassy or nearest Canadian Consulate before travel.

# **Traveling with Firearms**



Canada has three classes of firearms: non-restricted, restricted, and prohibited. Handguns are considered restricted firearms in Canada. A restricted firearm may be brought into Canada, but an Authorization to Transport permit must be obtained in advance. Seized firearms and weapons are never returned. The easiest way to transport firearms is to have them crated and shipped to your destination via a commercial carrier.



# **In Transit Emergencies**



- If you have an emergency while traveling in Canada enroute to Fort
  Wainwright contact the American Red Cross at 1-877-272-7337, which is
  manned 24 hours a day.
- If the emergency occurs between 0730-1630, Monday-Friday, Alaska Time call Army Emergency Relief 907-353-7453.
- If your emergency occurs before 0730 Alaska Time or after 1630 Alaska time Monday-Friday or on federal holidays or on the weekend, please call the Replacement Detachment at 907-353-4311.



# Other things to Consider...



- Be prepared for emergencies
  - Road-Side Emergency Preparation (spare tire, tools, emergency kit, etc.)
  - Red Cross 1-877-272-7337
  - Tricare 1-877-988-9378
- Hand-carry important documents such as:
  - Orders (make copies)
  - Identification for family members
  - Vehicle documentation (make sure insurance and registration are current)
  - Financial information
  - Legal documentation (including legal custody documentation)
  - Medical & physician information, medications, etc.
  - Hard copy maps (you may lose cell service)
- Ask your service provider about cell phone reception along your route

# **Driving in Winter**



During the winter season the Department of Emergency Service recommends:

- Installing studded tires
- Adding windshield fluid rated -30
- Installing an engine block heater
- Ensure engine fluids are rated to -60 degrees
- Carry an emergency winter safety car kit
   You kit should have extra clothing, food, water, blankets
   and/or sleeping bags, propane stove, road flares, jumper
   cables, shovel, hand and foot warmers, etc
- Dress in layers
- Always check the <u>road conditions</u>

## **POV Winterization**



It is recommended if you travel to Alaska between November and April, you have a mechanic install:

- 1. Engine Block Heater
- 2. Oil Pan Heater
- 3. Battery Blanket
- 4. Transmission Heater

- 5. Change engine oil to 5W-30 or a Synthetic
- 6. Antifreeze rated to -60 degrees
- 7. 3-way plug adapter
- 8. Snow/studded tires or optional

## Winter in Interior Alaska



#### **Facts**

- Average temperatures range from about 20 to -20°F
- Temperatures sometimes drop down into the -60s F
- Check the local <u>weather</u> for Fairbanks, AK
- Winter Solstice (Dec 21)
  - 3 hours and 42 minutes of daylight
  - Gain 5-7 minutes of daylight each day











## **Summer in Interior Alaska**



#### **Facts for Interior Alaska**

- Average temperatures range from about 45 to 75°F
- Temperatures sometimes reach into the 90s F in the summer
- Summer Solstice (21 June)
  - 21 hours and 50 minutes of daylight
- Thunderstorms and lightening cause <u>forest fires</u> in the interior
  - You may encounter smoky areas during your travels
- Check the local <u>weather</u> for Fairbanks, AK
