SUBJECT: Suspension and Revocation of Driving Privileges (USAG Alaska, Fort Wainwright Policy #32)

1. References.

- a. Army Regulation (AR) 190-5, Motor Vehicle Traffic Supervision, 22 May 06.
 - b. U.S. Army Garrison Fort Wainwright Regulation 190-5, Motor Vehicle Traffic Supervision Laws and Regulations, 1 December 2023.
- 2. The Garrison Commander has been delegated command authority to suspend and revoke installation driving privileges by the Commander, 11th Airborne Division. This policy applies to all active-duty military personnel, Family members, retirees of military service, DoD civilian personnel, and all others with installation driving privileges. The suspension or revocation of installation driving privileges for lawful reasons unrelated to traffic violations or safe vehicle operation, is not limited or restricted by this policy. As such, the Garrison Commander directs the following:**
- a. The Director of Emergency Services (DES) will initiate all actions to suspend or revoke installation driving privileges on U.S. Army Garrison Alaska (USAG Alaska) installations. Unit commanders may submit requests for suspensions and revocations to DES for initiation.
 - b. The DES may authorize an immediate suspension of driving privileges in cases involving intoxicated driving incidents, including the following:
 - (1) Refusal to take or complete a lawfully requested chemical test to determine contents of blood for alcohol or other drugs.
 - (2) Operating a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol content of 0.08 percent by volume or higher or in violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) or the law of the State of Alaska.
 - (3) Operating a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol content of 0.05 but less than 0.08, in violation of the UCMJ or the State of Alaska.

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(4) On an arrest report or other official documentation of the circumstances of an apprehension for intoxicated driving.

c. The Consolidated Legal Office (CLO) will review all proposed suspensions and revocations. Immediate suspensions issued by DES will be reviewed by the CLO as soon as practicable. The CLO will prepare final written suspensions for approval by the Garrison Commander upon completion of its review.

d. The Provost Marshal's Office (PMO) will provide final written notice of suspensions and revocations to the individual concerned and his or her military or civilian supervisor. Upon receipt of a final written notice of suspension or revocation, the individual concerned will provide a written acknowledgement.

e. Except for cases involving intoxicated driving, suspension or revocation will not take effect until receipt of notification in accordance with paragraph 2.d. of this policy. Individuals who have received a final notice of suspension or revocation may request a hearing within fourteen (14) days of the notice. Requests for hearings will be directed to the CLO at usarmy.wainwright.usarak.list.ft-wainwright-magistrate-court@army.mil or (907) 353-6557.

f. The PMO will record all final suspension and revocation actions as part of the individual's driver record. A copy of all final actions will be provided to the DES Physical Security section for uploading into the appropriate databases. Final actions must be accompanied by three identifiers for the driver.

g. Suspensions are automatically reinstated upon expiration of the term of suspension. Requests to curtail or rescind a suspension prior to its expiration date will be submitted, in writing with appropriate supporting documents to include verification of a valid driver's license and chain of command recommendations through the requestor's Brigade Commander or equivalent, to the CLO at usarmy.wainwright.usarak.list.ft-wainwright-magistrate-court@army.mil or (907) 353-6557.

h. The DES Physical Security Division and Provost Marshal's Office will de-conflict and update their respective databases at least once monthly.

3. Driving privileges will be revoked for a mandatory period of not less than one (1) year for cases in which:

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a. The individual concerned was lawfully apprehended for driving under the influence, refusing to submit to or complete a test to measure the alcohol content in the blood, or detect the presence of any other drug as required by State of Alaska or UCMJ.

b. A conviction, nonjudicial punishment, or a military or civilian administrative action resulted in the suspension or revocation of the driver's license for intoxicated driving.

4. This policy supersedes Fort Wainwright Policy #32, subject: Suspension and Revocation of Driving Privileges, dated 14 Nov 23.
