Dear Retirees and Family Members:

On April 26, 2025, West Point will host its Fifty-First Annual Military Retiree Appreciation Day. This day is set aside to honor Military Retirees and family members for their selfless service and support to our nation. I would be honored for you and your family to spend the day with us. When entering West Point, vehicles are permitted to enter through any gate, as long as all occupants over the age of 17 have a military ID, or a valid state or federal ID. Designated parking is available in the vicinity of Eisenhower Hall, North Dock, and west of Gillis Field House. Limited handicapped parking will be available in the Eisenhower Hall Tunnel Area.

Upon arriving at Eisenhower Hall, please proceed to the Riverside Café (Level 2) to register at the Reception Desks. There will be two separate registration areas, one for those with luncheon reservations, and one for those without. All participants must wear name tags during movement in the Cadet area. Take advantage of the "county fair" in Crest Hall (Level 3) to visit with participating service agencies from 0715-1040. At 0820, welcoming remarks will be followed by Mr. Elijah Asiedu, Military Services Coordinator for the Veterans Affairs New York Regional Office. Following the formal portion of the program, you will have the option to attend the Cadet Review in your honor or stay to spend more time visiting the service agencies. Pickup will be on Thayer Road Extension, directly behind the bleachers. Buses will also be available in the same location to take those unable to make the walk to the USMA Cadet Mess for the luncheon. Immediately following the meal, shuttle buses will again be available from the Mess Hall to the designated parking areas.

The West Point Casualty Operations Office provides Casualty Assistance for survivors of Army retirees who reside in the New York counties of Orange, Rockland, Sullivan, Dutchess, Columbia, Ulster, Greene, Delaware, Putnam and northern Westchester. The phone number is (520)717-9470 The Fort Drum Casualty Assistance Center supports residents of the other northern New York counties and the states of Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Maine, Vermont and New Hampshire. The phone number is (888) 325-1601 or (315) 772-6465. Immediate notification of a retiree death will enable the Casualty Operations Office to notify the Defense Finance and Accounting Service in a timely manner to stop the retired pay. The sooner this is done the sooner benefits can be received by the surviving Spouse and dependents. Be sure your family knows where your DD 214 is located. It is <u>required</u> to receive Military Funeral Honors to include a casket flag.

VETERANS BURIAL BENEFITS

Burial benefits are offered to eligible Veterans, their spouses and dependent children by the Federal Government, through the Department of Veterans Affairs' (VA) National Cemetery Administration (NCA). They are earned by military service to our grateful Nation. These benefits are potentially worth thousands of dollars but are provided at no cost. A national cemetery burial includes: the gravesite, opening and closing of the grave, a headstone or marker, and perpetual care. Funeral home directors usually arrange for the following benefits by request: • A VA-provided headstone or marker for a Veteran buried in a private cemetery anywhere in the world. • A burial flag to drape the Veteran's casket or urn during the funeral. • A Presidential Memorial Certificate (PMC) honoring the Veteran. • Military Funeral Honors for the Veteran (e.g., burial flag folding and presentation, "Taps" played on a bugle or by recording).

PRESIDENTIAL MEMORIAL CERTIFICATES

A Presidential Memorial Certificate (PMC) is an engraved paper certificate that honors the memory of honorably discharged deceased Veterans. Next of kin, other relatives, and friends may request PMCs. There is no time limit for requesting the certificate(s), but requests should include a copy (not the original) of the deceased Veteran's discharge document and death certificate and must clearly indicate to what address the certificate(s) should be sent. KELLER STATUS DURING INCLEMENT WEATHER CONDITIONS

If the Greater West Point area weather forecast calls for freezing rain and/or snow (inclement weather), Keller Army Community Hospital's inclement weather policy is as follows:

If the post designation is "CODE RED," all outpatient appointments – during the CODE RED period – are cancelled and your respective clinic will call you to reschedule. If you have not been contacted within 24 hours of the CODE RED, contact the Appointment Center or the respective clinic.

Elective patient encounters, including surgeries, will be re-scheduled.

The Pharmacy, Radiology, and Laboratory Departments will be closed for outpatient services during a CODE RED weather designation.

The Emergency Room will remain open. If you have an emergency, it is recommended you call 9-1-1.

If the post designation is "CODE WHITE," your appointment is still scheduled, but it is recommended you call the Appointment Center, at (315) 774-8200 for the status of your appointment.

Colorectal Cancer: Colorectal cancer is the third most common cancer in the United States and the second leading cause of death from cancer. There are often no signs or symptoms of colorectal cancer – that's why it's so important to get screened. The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) recommends screening for colorectal cancer beginning at age 45 years and continuing until age 75 years. People over age 50 have the highest risk of colorectal cancer. You may also be at higher risk if you are African American, smoke, or have a family history of colorectal cancer.

Prostate Cancer: Prostate cancer is one of the most common types of cancer in men. Men who are 45 to 69 years old should make individual decisions about being screened for prostate cancer. Those with a family history of prostate cancer should talk to their PCM about frequency of testing. This includes a blood test and examination (while under the same anesthetic).

Breast Cancer: Women in the United States get breast cancer more than any other type of cancer except skin cancer. Breast cancer is second to lung cancer as a cause of cancer death in American women. However, deaths from breast cancer have decreased a little bit every year since 2003. Breast cancer also occurs in men, but the number of new cases is small. Routine mammograms can be scheduled at Keller.

Esophageal/Gastric Cancer: An endoscopic evaluation of the esophagus and stomach is indicated for certain symptoms. This is accomplished by an Esophagogastroduodenoscopy, or EGD. The procedure can be combined with a screening colonoscopy while under the same anesthetic. Esophageal malignancy due to recurring heartburn or reflux is one of the fastest growing cancer diagnoses in the United States, especially among men over age 50. If you experience (men or women) reflux symptoms despite prescribed medications to control heartburn, experience weekly heartburn events for over the past five years, experience recurring difficulty swallowing, or experience recurring mid/upper abdominal pain, then an upper endoscopy may be considered.

Two valid forms of identification are required for issuance of all military ID cards to personnel 18 years of age and older. One must be an unexpired photo ID issued by state or federal government. Other documentation may be necessary if your military ID card has expired i.e., birth certificate and social security card. All lost ID cards must be reported to the nearest local police station or at the West Point Military Police desk. A copy of the report is required to issue a new ID card. There are numerous ID Card Issuing facilities in the New England area.

We service all Military members to include Active and Reserve component, Retired military members, and 100% Disabled Veterans and their dependents/survivors.

Spouses of retired military members can now receive **their indefinite ID Card at age 65** as long as they have completed their MEDICARE A&B process (either purchasing or declining). When coming in for the ID Card appointment please bring your MEDICARE card that shows the status of A&B.

Dependents need to be accompanied by their sponsor or have a Power of Attorney (POA) or a signed (electronically or in front of a notary) DD1172-2 April 2020 version by their sponsor.
