Arrive Strong in-processing program gets community focused upgrades

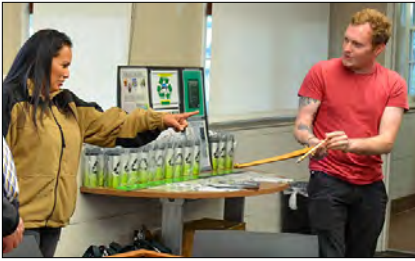

Wood transportation office when orders are received – any delay in contacting the transportation office may result in non-availability of Department of Defense-contracted moving companies. Call 573.596.0077, or visit in person in Bldg. 470, Room 1220. The transportation office is open from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. weekdays. Customers also have the option to start the process on-line through the Defense Personal Property System. To request access to DPS, click [here](#). If it seems too good to be true...

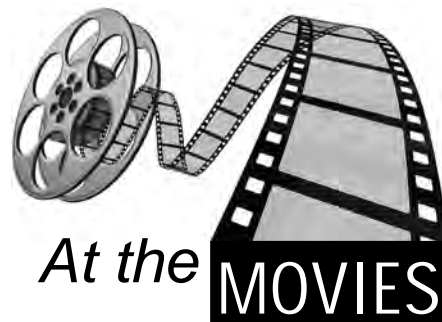
Service members are reporting receiving smartwatches through the mail – the problem is, they never ordered them. When powered on, these devices can connect to Wi-Fi networks or smart phones unprompted, providing the sender access to your data, including banking information, contacts, usernames and passwords. Additionally, malware on these devices can access microphones and cameras on your devices, enabling access to conversations and more. Do not power on any unsolicited device, and report them to your security manager or [Army Counterintelligence](#).

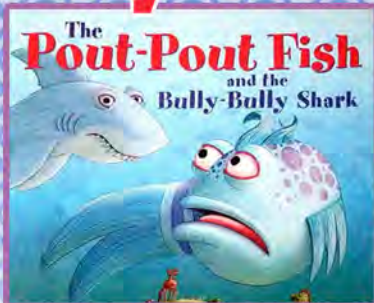
