Fort Leonard Wood hosts CIMT inspection team

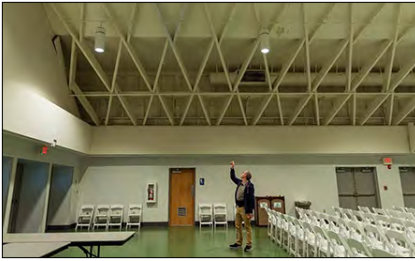

ROTC cadre positions open

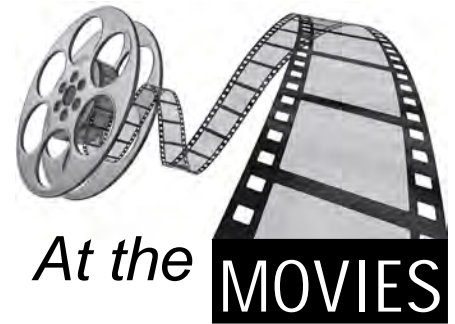


Command Sgt. Maj. Michael Weimer selected as 17th Sergeant Major of the Army
