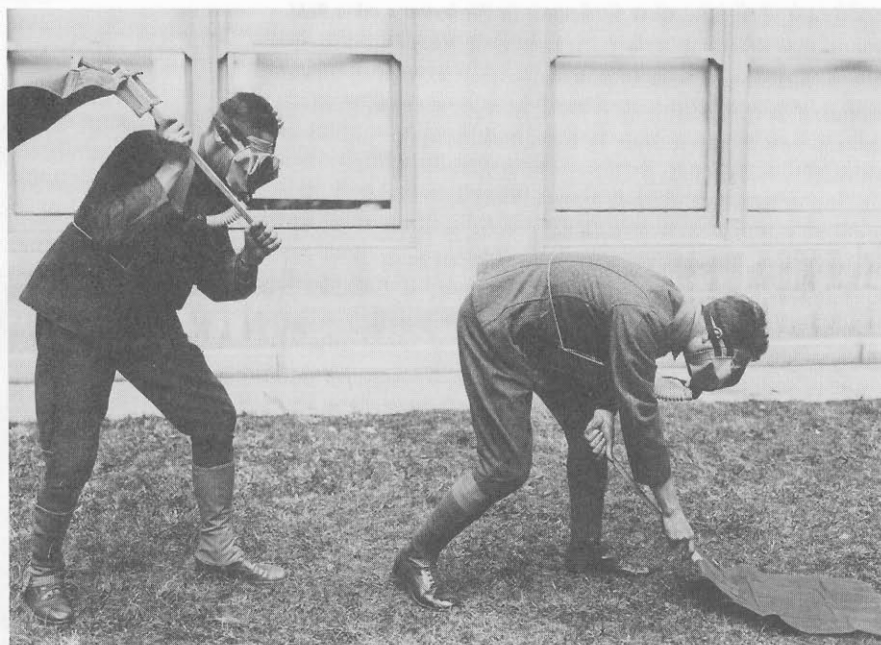

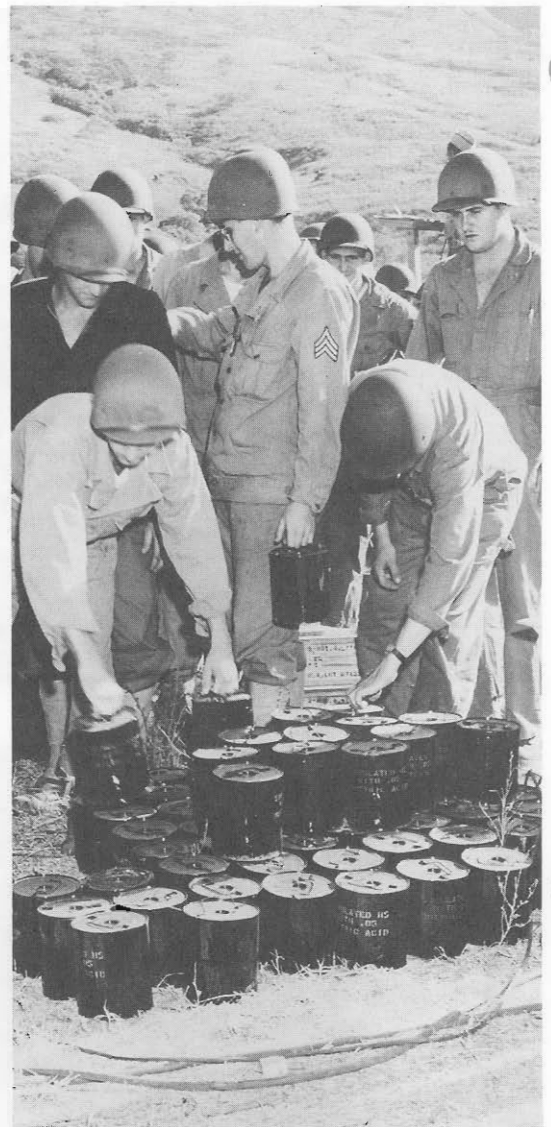
A CWS officer makes sniff sets—bottles containing small amounts of gas, sniffed by students to become familiar with various agent orders.



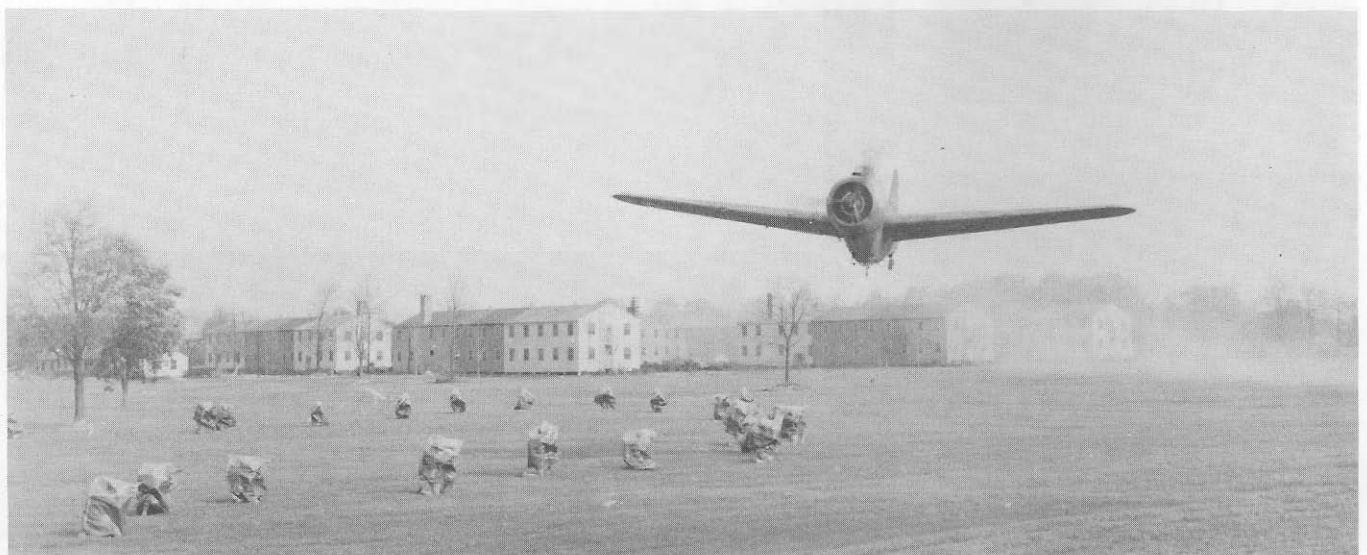
