Sgt. 1st Class Danielle Baker is a Military Police Senior Leader Course instructor with the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence NCO Academy. There, she trains, evaluates and provides feedback to MP NCOs from across the Army. Baker was named the MSCoE NCO of the Quarter for the second quarter of this year and was selected to become a Criminal Investigation Division Special Agent warrant officer she reports for Warrant Officer Candidate School in June.

Where are you from? Opp, Alabama

Why did you decide to enlist in the Army?

My dad was in the Army, and the opportunities for me in Opp were lacking. I knew I didn't want to stay there; I wanted more for myself and my future family. The Army was my calling. It gave me a drive and a sense of purpose I had never had before. As soon as I joined, I felt like I was part of something bigger.

Why do you continue to serve?

I love my job. I couldn't imagine myself any place else. I enjoy meeting new people and traveling, and this job allows me to do that. As a CID agent, I am with victims and subjects on their worst day. I want to help people. I want to help victims find closure. As an instructor, I am giving Soldiers knowledge they will carry with them the rest of their careers.

What is the most fulfilling part of being an instructor?

I am here to teach students, but I also learn from them. My favorite is when former students thank me for what I taught them because they are using it in the field. I really appreciate that.

What do you enjoy about being with CID?

I am passionate about helping victims of sex crimes. It is often life-long trauma. I can't take away the trauma, but I can be there to walk them through the legal process that can often times feel long and painful.

What do you enjoy about Fort Leonard Wood?

There are so many opportunities to serve here. It is the home of our regiment. It is also a good place to raise a family. My husband is an MP as well. We live on post, and my daughter can walk to school. The communities are so small. I know the other parents, and they know me. I feel safe to let my kids play outside.
