Fort Leonard Wood Army Birthday recap: 245 years of answering the call

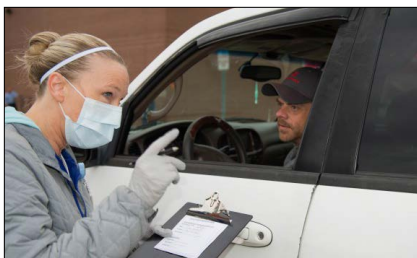

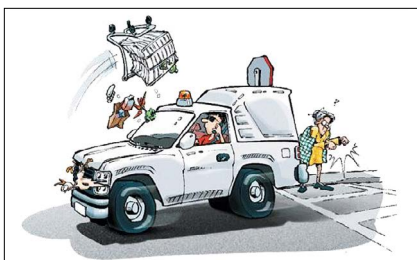
Urban Search and Rescue conducts training course at Fort Leonard Wood under ‘new normal’ conditions
