
Fort Leonard Wood hosts Gateway Battalion ROTC cadets' fall FTX

Daily direct flights to Chicago O'Hare International Airport from the Waynesville-St. Robert Regional Airport at Forney Airfield via SkyWest Airlines begin Oct. 12. The last flight from Fort Leonard Wood to St. Louis is Sept. 30, and there will be no commercial flight service out of Fort Leonard Wood from Oct. 1 to 11. Chicago offers more than 630 non-stop flights to other destinations versus 130 from St. Louis, and SkyWest is partnered with United Airlines, so bags may be checked through to any final destination United serves.
