NUTTER FIELD HOUSE



Nutter Field House is named after **2nd Lt. Daniel Nutter**, 25th Armored Engineer Battalion, 6th Armored Division, who posthumously received the Distinguished Service Cross for heroism in **World War II**. The field house is located south of Gammon Field on Iowa Avenue and was built in **1942,** to provide recreational facilities for Soldiers.

The building features a **Lamella roof truss system** that is unusual to these types of facilities. The building has been renovated with audio-visual capabilities to support large functions

and events.
