What is your hometown?

Lincoln, Nebraska.

Why did you join the Army?

I wanted to do something different after high school and didn't want to go directly to college.

Why did you choose to become an MP?

I did a lot of research prior to signing my name on the dotted line, and I wanted something that would allow me to go out and experience different things.

What is your favorite part about being in the Army ?

That's simple – the people. The people are the ones who drive and operate the

Army – they're the doers and the thinkers – and being from Nebraska, I grew up in a smaller culture. If you drive 30 minutes in any direction in the United States, the culture's going to change, and I enjoy meeting so many different people from so many places. I also enjoy the travelling opportunities the Army provides, especially operating in different countries, where you can meet, talk and learn about the people there.

What does leadership mean to you?

When I think about leadership, I believe the Army got it right with task and purpose. When you're providing information to somebody to get them to do something, you want to let them know why you're doing – the purpose behind it. There's a task and purpose behind everything.

As someone who is nearing retirement, what advice would you give to those who are just now coming into the Army?

I was a platoon sergeant for a little over three years, as well as a detachment sergeant, and I saw a lot of new Soldiers throughout that time frame. Don't picture the Army as that first duty station, because a lot of people get a bad taste in their mouth at their first duty station – it doesn't necessarily mean it's the Army. Branch out and go to different places before you decide to get out. The second duty station could be a whole different, beautiful picture.
