In 2016, Ms. Bentinck became the Deputy Director, Army Retirement Services which is responsible for all Army retirement services policy and oversight of the program's delivery to Soldiers, Retired Soldiers, and surviving spouses of all three Army Components, as well as strategic level program communications.

Prior to serving in the Missouri Legislature, Representative Hardwick was a supervisory attorney as a Department of the Army civilian, a Special Assistant United States Attorney and served as an Assistant Prosecuting Attorney for Pulaski County, Missouri. He was the City Prosecutor for St. Robert, Missouri and taught courses as an adjunct professor in political science, business, philosophy, and law.

Representative Hardwick practices law as an attorney with Lowe Dreesen Miller law firm. He is the Chairman of the Sustainable Ozark Partnership. Representative Hardwick also serves as a commissioner on the Missouri Military Preparedness and Enhancement Commission.

Representative Hardwick served as an enlisted Soldier and officer in the Missouri National Guard and U.S. Army. He led combat route clearance patrols in Baghdad, Iraq. He has served in leadership positions including platoon leader, company commander and battalion commander. He is a graduate of Officer Candidate School where he was selected for the Leadership Award. Representative Hardwick graduated with honors from the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College located at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas where he earned a skill identifier as a strategist.

Born in Rolla, Missouri, Representative Hardwick is a graduate of Dixon High School. He received his bachelor's degree in Classics from the University of Missouri and Juris Doctor from the University of Missouri School of Law in Columbia, Missouri. IDENTIFICATION (ID) CARD/DEERS SECTION

The ID Card/DEERS section is located in Dillard Hall, Building 470, at 13486 Replacement Avenue, 2nd Floor, Room 2101. Hours of Operation are Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., Thursday hours are 8:00 a.m. - 12: 00 p.m. The section is closed on holidays. Appointments can be made by accessing the RAPIDS Appointment Scheduler at https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco/ Customers without internet access may call the ID Card/DEERS section for an appointment at (573) 596-0744. Services for walk-in customers are limited, but those walk-in customers with emergency needs will be accepted on a case-by-case basis during hours of operation. Customers must have two valid forms of ID, one must be a photo ID and be unexpired. For initial enrollment of dependents, the following documents are needed: original or certified marriage certificate, birth certificate, divorce decree, retirement orders/DD Form 214, and a SSN card for all dependents.

During RAD, Staff from the ID Card/DEERS section will be available to replace the paper (blue) based Uniformed Services Identification (USID) cards with the Next Gen USID card. If you are needing the new Next Gen USID retired ID card, come visit our office during RAD to get one. The hours of operation for this day will be from 7:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. on Saturday, September 14, 2024.

JUDGE ADVOCATE GENERAL

The Fort Leonard Wood Legal Assistance Office is open M, T, W, and F from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., but closed from 11:30 a.m. -1:00 p.m. for lunch and administrative purposes. Consultations and execution of wills, living wills, and powers of attorney (both health care and financial) are done by appointment only. Under certain circumstances consultations and execution of documents may take place on the same day, however, the standard is to conduct the consultation and execution of documents at separate times on separate appointment dates. Items and information necessary to complete such appointments are as follows: 1) military ID card; 2) names, addresses, and phone numbers of individuals you intend to designate as agents, executors, and guardians, if applicable, in your documentation; 3) list of personal property to be distributed; 4) addresses and legal descriptions for all real property; 5) any other specified arrangements. On Retiree Appreciation Day initial Will packets will be available for review, completion, questions, or to take home, however Will preparation for execution will not be available. Attorneys will be present to answer Will-related questions and staff will be available to schedule future appointments. CASUALTY ASSISTANCE CENTER (CAC)


