USID online card renewal

Sponsors of individuals holding active Uniformed Services Identification, or USID, cards now have the option to request renewals through ID Card Office Online. More information on this new policy is available here.

REAL ID gate access policy

Beginning June 1, Fort Leonard Wood physical security specialists will no longer

solely accept state-issued identification that does not meet the REAL ID Act of 2005 standards. Anyone with a non-compliant ID will also need to provide a secondary form of identification, such as a U.S. passport or a certified birth certificate. Civilian retiree ID cards

Effective immediately, Department of Defense Civilian Retiree Identification cards will no longer be issued. DOD civilian retirees must present and register an acceptable credential, such as a REAL ID Act-compliant driver's license, and their retirement Standard Form 50 at the Visitor Control Center to facilitate future visits to the installation. Previously issued DOD Civilian Retiree ID Cards will remain valid through Aug. 31, and will not be reissued.

She transitioned to the Army Reserve after that, where she entered the accounting field and served four more years. While serving as a Reserve Soldier, she completed her accounting degree and came to Fort Leonard Wood as part of the Recent Graduates Program in 2018.

What is your favorite thing about being a DA Civilian?

I've experienced so many things I didn't know I would have the opportunity to and encountered many different individuals and learned many different things. I can't imagine having started somewhere else, because I work with such an amazing group of individuals.

What are your future plans?

My end goal is to work in forensic accounting, which would require obtaining my Certified Public Accounting certification and the Certified Fraud Examiner certification.

What advice would you give to transitioning service members who are thinking about becoming a DA Civilian?

If government service and continuing to meet new people is something they want to be a part of, they should really look into becoming a DA Civilian, because it's a great system to be a part of. You can have different experiences in the civilian world, but there's nothing like continuing to work for the government and being a part of the bigger picture.

How do you define leadership?
