this job at DPTMS came open in 2005, I applied for it. I have been here ever since.


What do you enjoy about being an Army civilian?

You retire in June. What are you most looking forward to?


Our girls are in Florida, and that is where we are moving. It is exciting. I am looking forward to sleeping in.
