Some days begin a little differently. For Capt. Mary Bustamante, commander of Company C, 787th Military Police Battalion, the morning of June 30 definitely fit that description.



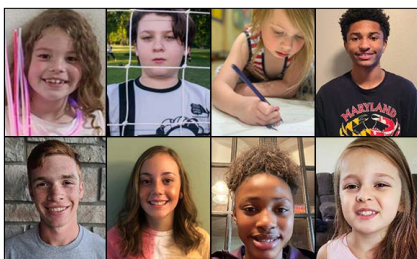
Transportation Corps, 58th Transportation Battalion observe anniversaries one day apart
