## Annual DoD housing survey begins this month

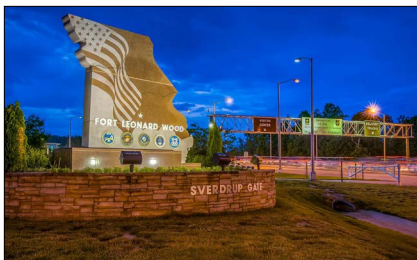

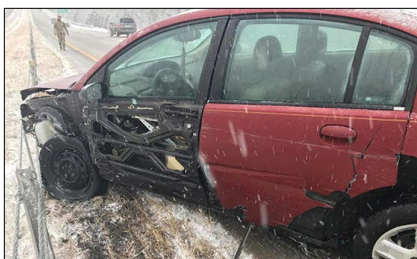
## Words of encouragement
