CBRN Basic Officer Leader Course Certificates

Hazardous Materials/WMD

Awareness & Operations

This 40 hour course is for emergency response personnel who may be first on the scene of a hazardous materials emergency at the awareness & operational level, acting in a defensive posture to protect people, the environment, or property from the effects of an unplanned hazardous materials release consistent with the competencies recommended by NFPA 1072 and supplemented by information from government agencies such as the **Occupational Safety and Health** Administration (OSHA), the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and the Department of Transportation (DOT).

**In the civilian sector, this course costs approximately \$550

Hazardous Materials/WMD -

Technician

This 50 hour course is based on NFPA 1072: Standard for Hazardous Materials/Weapons of Mass Destruction **Emergency Response Personnel Professional** Qualifications. Designed for the student already trained at the Hazardous Materials Awareness and Operations level; this course develops the skills already learned and provides in-depth training in the mitigation of hazardous materials incidents. Through both classroom and practical training, the student becomes familiar with health and safety issues, incident management, hazard and risk analysis, personal protective clothing, and decontamination.

**In the civilian sector, this course costs approximately \$650
