HEROES OF THE BATTLEFIELD

Military

Not only has he been a fantastic role model, trainer, coach and standard bearer as a drill sergeant, his performance at the Expert Soldier Badge course earned him a first-time go and the Perfect Edge Award. After only two days off he went on to win in his category of the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence Best Warrior Competition and is now the MSCoE and Fort Leonard Wood Drill Sergeant of the Year. Alexander demonstrates the finest of our nation's fabric and he is worthy of recognition.



Civilian

James (Mike) Yoder, A Basic Combat Training course manager with 3rd Chemical Brigade, has done an excellent job ensuring his brigade and battalions are in compliance with all U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command and Army policies and regulations when it comes to BCT training and data management.

During the Center for Initial Military Training Staff Assistance Visit review of BCT courses, Yoder received high praise for his ability to ensure the Digital Training

Management System was consistently and accurately updated, to include BCT grade books, Army Combat Fitness Test data and individual task assignments.

LEONARD WOOD JUSTICE

Courts-Martial

- United States v. Staff Sergeant Jackson: the accused was found not guilty of violating a lawful order.
- United States v. Guiterrez: The accused was found guilty of one specification of abusive sexual contact and one specification of assault. He was sentenced to 30 days of confinement and forfeiture of two-thirds pay for one month.

Reprimands

- A captain received a General Officer Memorandum of Reprimand for being drunk on duty.
- A first lieutenant received a General Officer Memorandum of Reprimand for driving while under the influence of alcohol.
- A second lieutenant received a permanently filed General Officer Memorandum of Reprimand for driving while under the influence of alcohol. The officer was recommended for separation from the Army.
- A chief warrant officer 3 received a General Officer Memorandum of Reprimand for engaging in extramarital sexual conduct.
- A staff sergeant received a permanently filed General Officer Memorandum of Reprimand for driving while under the influence of alcohol, following a rollover accident.

Other Misconduct

- A staff sergeant received a Field Grade Article 15 for violating TRADOC 350-6 by maintaining a personal relationship with a trainee.
- A specialist received a Field Grade Article 15 for wrongful use of controlled substances. Punishment included reduction to private, forfeiture of half a month's pay for two months, and 45 days of extra duty. The Soldier is pending administrative separation.
- A private was separated, in-lieu of court-martial, with an Other Than Honorable Discharge for being AWOL and wrongful use of cocaine.
- A private was separated with an Other Than Honorable Discharge for an abusive sexual contact, sexual harassment and simple assault.

NOTE: Soldiers administratively separated receive one of three characterizations of service: Honorable, General, or Other Than Honorable. Anything less than Honorable may result in the loss of certain benefits and negatively impact employment and education opportunities.
