LEONARD WOOD JUSTICE

Courts-Martial

- A staff sergeant plead guilty at a General Court Martial to one specification of sexual assault of a child in violation of Article 120 and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b. The Soldier was sentenced to a Dishonorable Discharge and time served.
- A specialist plead guilty at a Special Court Martial to one specification of the theft and sale of military property of value greater than \$2,000 in violation of Article 108. The Soldier was sentenced to reduction to E-1 and sixty days confinement. The Soldier is currently pending administrative separation.

Reprimands

A captain received a permanently filed General Officer Memorandum of Reprimand for driving while intoxicated.
A staff sergeant received a permanently filed General Officer Memorandum of Reprimand for domestic violence against his wife and son.

Other Misconduct

— A staff sergeant received nonjudicial punishment pursuant to UCMJ, Article 15 for engaging in a prohibited relationship with a trainee. The Soldier was reduced

to Sergeant (suspended for six months); forfeiture of pay for two months (suspended for six months); and a written reprimand.

- A private first class received nonjudicial punishment pursuant to UCMJ, Article 15 for four specifications of abusive sexual contact. The Soldier was reduced to private, forfeiture of pay for two months, 45 days of restriction and 14 days of extra duty.
- —A private first class separated from the Army with an Other Than Honorable Discharge for sexually harassing female trainees while in basic training.

NOTE: Soldiers administratively separated receive one of three characterizations of service: Honorable, General, or Other Than Honorable. Anything less than Honorable may result in the loss of certain benefits and negatively impact employment and education opportunities.
