For beneficiaries between the ages of 6 months and 17 (along with the parents of children being vaccinated) and beneficiaries 65 and older, and beneficiaries with a complex medical history, walk-in hours are 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays at the General Leonard Wood Army Community Hospital Immunizations Clinic. Active-duty service members with a U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command Organic Medical Team should contact their unit operations or TOMS for times and locations. Beginning his Army career at one station unit training here in 2021, Pfc. Dylan Kaskalla is a combat engineer with the 5th Engineer Battalion.

#### What is your hometown?

Zuni, New Mexico. It is near the Arizona broader. I was born and raised on the Zuni Indian Reservation there, and I am 100% Native American.

#### Why did you join the military?

I wasn't happy with the jobs I was doing; I wanted a career. My wife was a 31E Corrections/Detention Specialist, and when she got out of the Army, I asked her if she thought it was right for me – she told me to try it. We have family members in the Army, who helped me find a recruiter in Gallup, New Mexico.

## What do you like most about being a Soldier in the U.S. Army?

The people I have met and the places I have visited. I have gone places and done things I never thought I would, like maintaining military equipment. I always thought a career like this was way out of my league until I got here. All of my instructors and fellow Soldiers have been super helpful when learning about military equipment and how to maintain and use it properly.

#### What are your future Army goals?

I want to be an NCO. I want to
