# More time for family: Army updates guidance for expanded parental leave

In an effort to support parents and caregivers, the Army has refined its parental leave guidance to align with the recent Department of Defense expanded Military Parental Leave Program.

# LEONARD WOOD JUSTICE

#### Reprimands

— A captain received a General Officer Memorandum of Reprimand for driving while intoxicated.

— A sergeant first class received a General Officer Memorandum of Reprimand for driving while intoxicated.

— A sergeant received a General Officer Memorandum of Reprimand for driving while intoxicated.

#### **Other Misconduct**

— A private received nonjudicial punishment pursuant to the UCMJ, Article 15 from a field grade officer for sexual harassment. Punishment included forfeiture of \$847 of pay for one month (suspended for 14 days); extra duty for 30 days (suspended for 30 days); and an oral reprimand.

— A private (E-2) received nonjudicial

punishment pursuant to the UCMJ, Article 15 from a company grade officer for violating the Army EO Policy. Punishment included reduction to private (E-1); forfeiture of \$427 of pay for one month; and extra duty for 14 days.

— A private received nonjudicial punishment pursuant to the UCMJ, Article 15 from a company grade officer for assaulting another trainee. Punishment included 14 days restriction; 14 days extra duty; forfeiture of \$491 of pay for one month; and an oral reprimand.

NOTE: Soldiers administratively separated receive one of three characterizations of service: Honorable, General, or Other Than Honorable. Anything less than Honorable may result in the loss of certain benefits and negatively impact employment and education opportunities.

# SOLDIER SPOTLEGNARD WOOD



As the Retention Operations NCO for the Maneuver Support Center of Excellence, Staff Sgt. Steven Henderson is responsible for counseling Soldiers on career options, developing and mentoring other career counselors, leading trainings and much more.

Originally enlisting as an infantryman in 2004, he reclassed to the 79S military occupational specialty to serve as a career counselor in 2018. Throughout his almost 20-year career, he has served at several locations worldwide, including Texas, Germany, Kentucky and Missouri, where he has been for nearly three years.

#### Where are you from originally?

I spent most of my life before I joined the military in northwest Indiana.

#### Why did you join the Army?

For the most part it was family tradition – I said I was going to join the Army starting when I was five years old, and from that point, it was always my goal.

# Where did you attend initial entry training?

I completed one station unit training at Fort Benning, Georgia, to become an infantryman. When I reclassed, I completed advanced individual training at Fort Knox, Kentucky.

# What is the difference between recruiting and retention?

A recruiter's biggest goal is to bring

people into initial service; our responsibility is to maintain them in the service.

# What has been your most memorable experience in the Army?

My most memorable experience was when I was on a personal security detail team while on my first deployment. It was the most enjoyable, as well. That's when I decided I was going to stay in the military. I made a lot of great friends. I was on a team full of different MOSs. We had everything from infantrymen and medics to mechanics, supply specialists and fuelers. My NCO influenced me to continue my service. He taught me what it's like to be a leader, and what would be expected of me when it was my turn, so that's what I strove for.

#### How do you define leadership?

It's about treating them the way you want to be treated. I was educated and given opportunities. I wasn't yelled at or constantly demeaned. I have treated my Soldiers with respect because that's how I was treated by my leaders. I saw their example, and that's how I wanted to do it.

#### What is your favorite part of your job?

My favorite part is being around the Soldiers. We can relate to one another and be comfortable around one another.
