What is your hometown?

When did you join the Army? Why did you choose to be an MP?

I originally enlisted in the Army Reserve in 2015, as an 88M (motor transport operator) and completed training with the 58th Transportation Battalion here, before commissioning as an active-duty military police officer in 2020, through ROTC at the University of Colorado, Colorado Springs. Law enforcement was something that I was really eager and excited to learn about and be part of and when I commissioned – MP was one of the opportunities offered.

What are your thoughts on Fort Leonard Wood as a duty station?

I love it here. The leadership here is good; they're supportive.

What is your favorite part about your current position?
